Section 7 Recreation and Tourism

This section presents data on parks, hunting and fishing, boating, travel, tourism, and other recreational facilities and activities. It is based on information supplied by the U. S. National Park Service, the Fish and Game Division and State Parks Division of the Hawaii Department of Land and Natural Resources, county departments of parks and recreation, the Hawaii Visitors Bureau's Research Committee, and other agencies, most of which issue annual or monthly statistical reports. National statistics on parks, recreation and travel appear in the Statistical Abstract of the United States: 1961, Section 7.
