Section 9 Military Services

This section presents statistics relating to military personnel and their dependents, military lands, military expenditures, Selective Service operations, and veterans affairs. The principal sources for these data are reports of the armed forces, Bureau of the Census, Selective Service System, and Veterans Administration. Additional information can sometimes be obtained from the Hawaii Department of Planning and Research, which has published a comprehensive review of such data, <u>Military Statistics for Hawaii, 1961-1962</u>. Section 9 of the <u>Statistics for Hawaii</u> presents comparable information for the mainland.
