Section 17 Transportation

This section presents statistics relating to public roads, motor vehicles, local public transit, railroads, civil aviation, and water traffic. A major source for these series is the Hawaii Department of Transportation and its Airports, Harbors, and Airports Divisions (formerly separate entities). Other sources include the U. S. Bureau of Public Roads, Civil Aeronautics Board, Federal Aviation Agency, Interstate Commerce Commission, Hawaii Public Utilities Commission, and individual transportation companies. Research personnel of the State Department of Transportation may be able to provide more detailed statistics than appear in this section. Similar statistics for other areas are reported in Sections 20, 21 and 22 of the Statistical Abstract of the United States: 1961.
