Section 7

RECREATION AND TRAVEL

Statistics on tourism, recreation, sports, museums, parks, pets, and the performing arts appear in this section. Additional information on recreational and resort land use is given in Section 6; on transportation, in Section 18; and on hotels and hotel workers, in Sections 12, 13, 15 and 23.

Information on recreation and tourism was formerly provided periodically by the Hawaii Tourism Authority's Tourism Research (particularly in its annual research reports), which as of July 1, 2021, moved to the Hawaii State Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (DBEDT). Consequently, the primary sources for information are now the Hawaii Tourism Authority, DBEDT's Research & Economic Analysis Division, the State Parks Division of the Hawaii State Department of Land and Natural Resources, the U.S. National Park Service, the County Park and recreation departments, and other organizations. Long-term trends are summarized in Historical Statistics of Hawaii, Section 11.
