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Section 23

DOMESTIC TRADE AND SERVICES

This section presents statistics relating to retail and wholesale trade; hotels; and selected personal, business, automotive, repair, and amusement services, including the motion picture industry. Related data are included in Sections 7, 12, 14 and 15.

The major source of these data is the U.S. Census Bureau's 2017 Economic Census for Retail Trade, Wholesale Trade, and all other industries relating to the services industry. Statistics on the retailing, wholesaling, and services tax bases are available from the Hawaii State Department of Taxation. Many tables are based on data published by the Research and Economic Analysis Division of the Hawaii State Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (DBEDT). This includes data on hotel room counts, occupancy and other characteristics and the economic impact of the film industry. Film industry data are created with assistance from DBEDT's Hawaii Film Office. A summary of figures on trade and services in earlier years appears in *Historical Statistics of Hawaii*, Section 20.
