\* STATEWIDE HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION \*

Proposing agency: Department of Health

Agencies consulted  
State: Department of Education  
Department of Transportation

County: Department of Public Works

**Project Characteristics**

**General:** The State of Hawaii Department of Health is proposing to collect household hazardous waste (HHW) on the islands of Oahu, Kauai, Maui, Hawaii and Molokai. HHW collected at each site will be disposed of properly in accordance with the applicable regulations promulgated in 40 CFR 260-270. Collection at each site will last one day and then the HHW will be packaged and transported to an appropriate facility. Collection sites will be established at Department of Transportation (DOT) and Department of Health baseyards, and school parking lots. The collections at the public school sites will occur on weekends. All sites have characteristic necessary for proper collection which include adequate paved surface, ingress and egress automobile access, adequate running water, and cover. The collection sites are:

Castle High School parking lot	October 26, 1991
Pearl City High School parking lot	October 27, 1991
Kapaa DOT Baseyard	November 2, 1991
Kahului DOH Vector Control Baseyard	November 9, 1991
Hoolehua DOH building parking lot (Molokai)	November 16, 1991
Hilo DOT Baseyard	November 22, 1991
Kahakai Elementary School parking lot	November 23, 1991
Kapiolani Community College parking lot	November 30, 1991

**Technical:** The proposed project does not include the construction of any structures.

**Economic:** None

**Social:** The project should not have any significant social impact.

**Environmental:** The collection project will benefit Hawaii's environment. Wastes which would normally be disposed of in Hawaii's municipal landfills or incinerators will be collected and disposed of at facilities designed to accommodate such wastes. The proposed collection sites are located in urban areas where the environment has been altered for either industrial or automobile use.

**Summary of the affected environment**

The proposed collections will occur on paved parking lots or industrial baseyards. The collection activity will not have any affect on the natural environment.

#### **Summary of major impacts**

##### **Short-term**

During the collection the following minor impact is anticipated:

1. Heavier than normal traffic in the area of the collection.

##### **Long-term**

No adverse long term impacts are anticipated.

##### **Proposed mitigation measures**

1. Traffic police will be hired to manage traffic at congested areas.

##### **Determination**

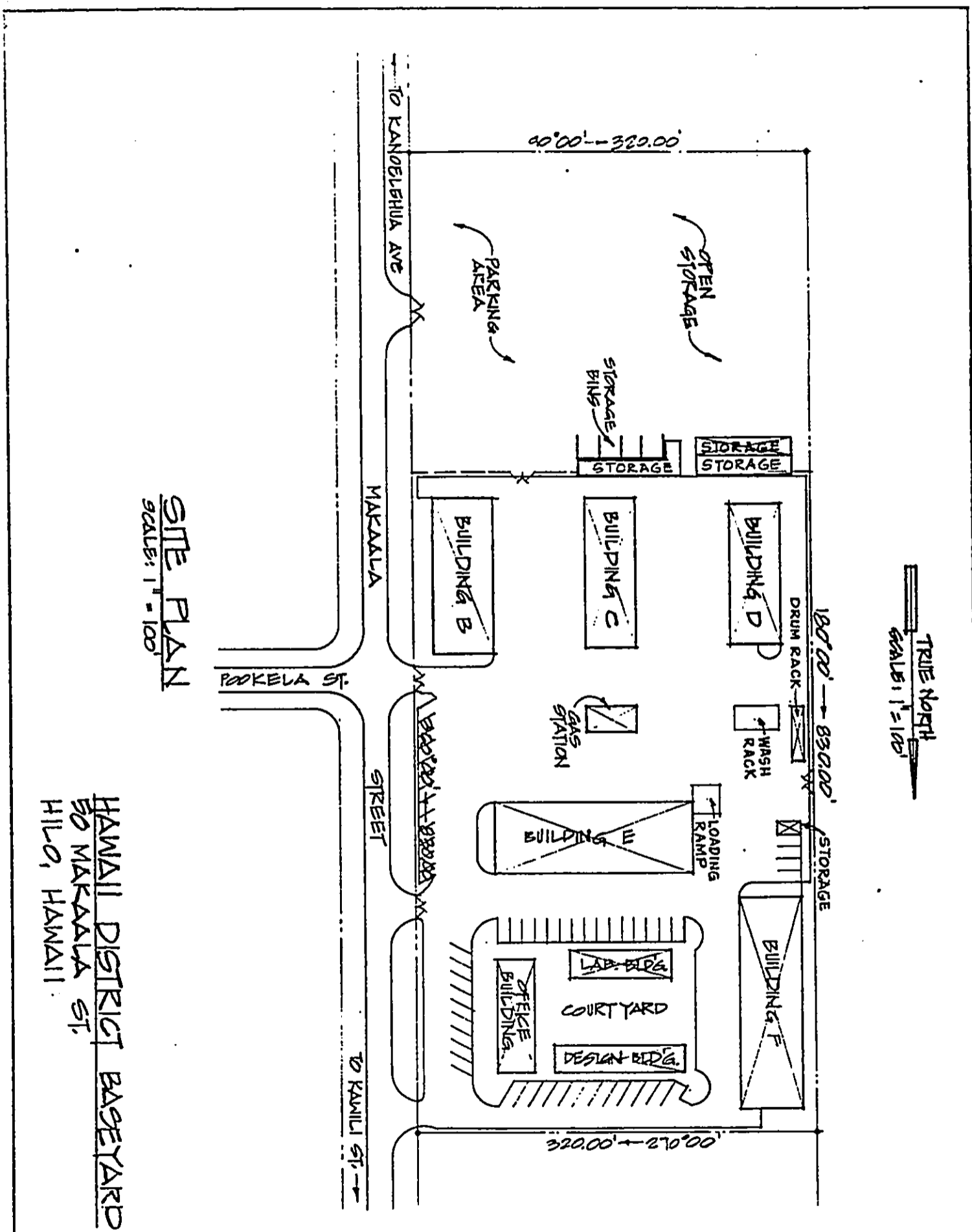
The HHW collection program is not expected to cause significant impacts to the environment. Therefore, it has been determined that a negative declaration will be filled.

##### **Findings and reasons supporting determination**

1. The proposed project will not involve an irrevocable commitment to loss or destruction to any natural or cultural resources.
2. The proposed project will not curtail the range of beneficial uses of the environment.
3. The proposed project will not conflict with the State's long-term environmental policies.
4. The proposed project will not substantially affect the economic or social welfare of the community or State.
5. The proposed project will not involve substantial secondary impacts, such as population changes or effects on public facilities.
6. The proposed project will not involve a substantial degradation of environmental quality.
7. The proposed project will not substantially affect any rare, threatened or endangered species of flora or fauna or habitat. No endangered species of flora or fauna are known to exist in the project sites.
8. The proposed project will not detrimentally affect air or water quality or ambient noise levels.

9. The proposed project will not be located in any environmentally sensitive area, such as flood plain, tsunami zone, erosion-prone area, geologically hazardous land, estuary, fresh water, or coastal waters.

For the reasons above, the proposed project will not have any significant effect in the context of HRS chapter 343, and section 11-200-12 of the State Administrative Rules.

SCALE: 1" = 100'

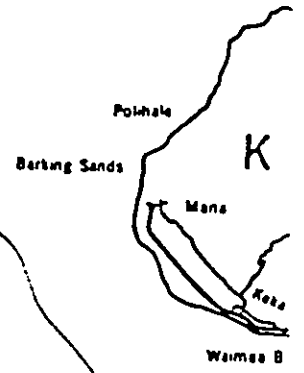
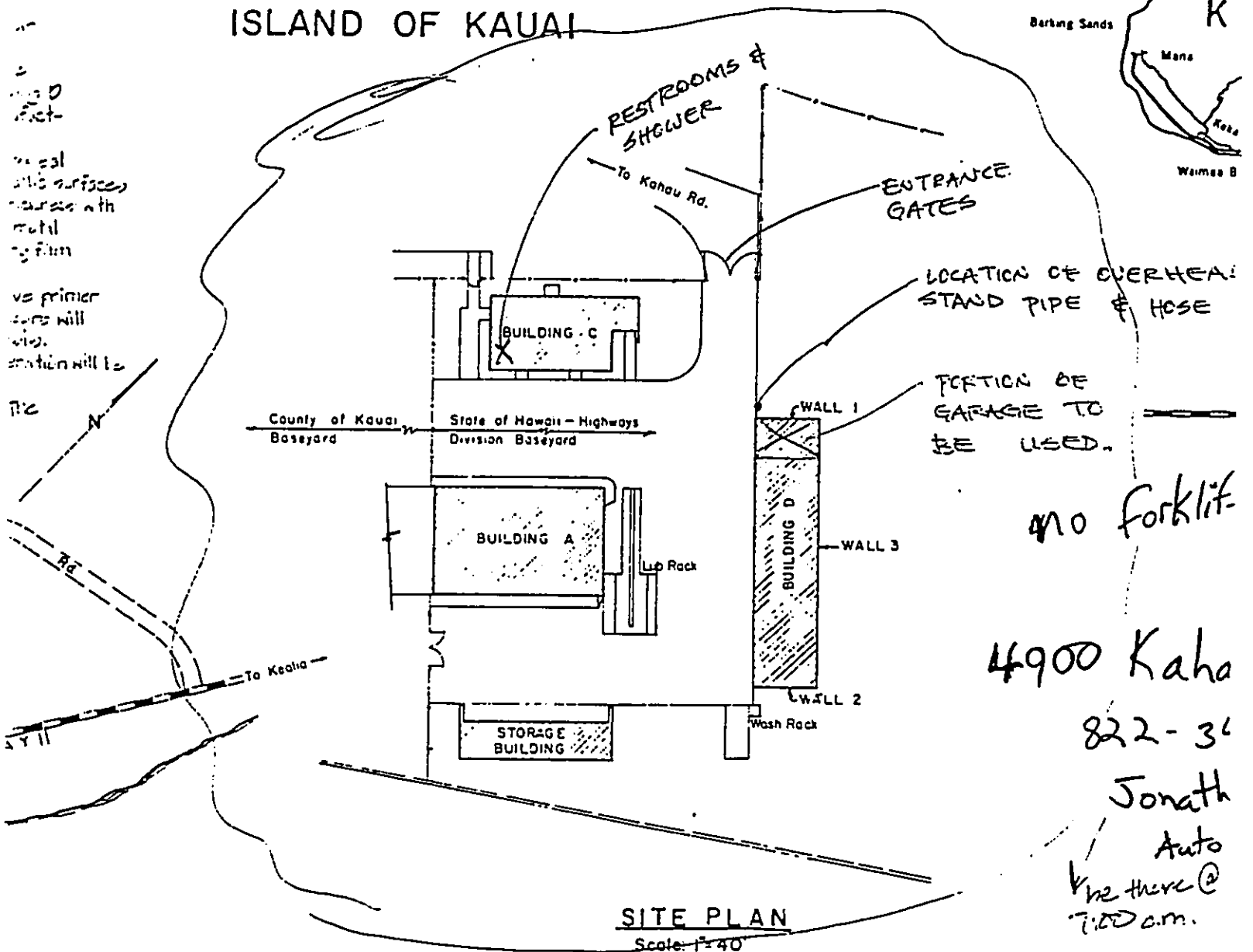

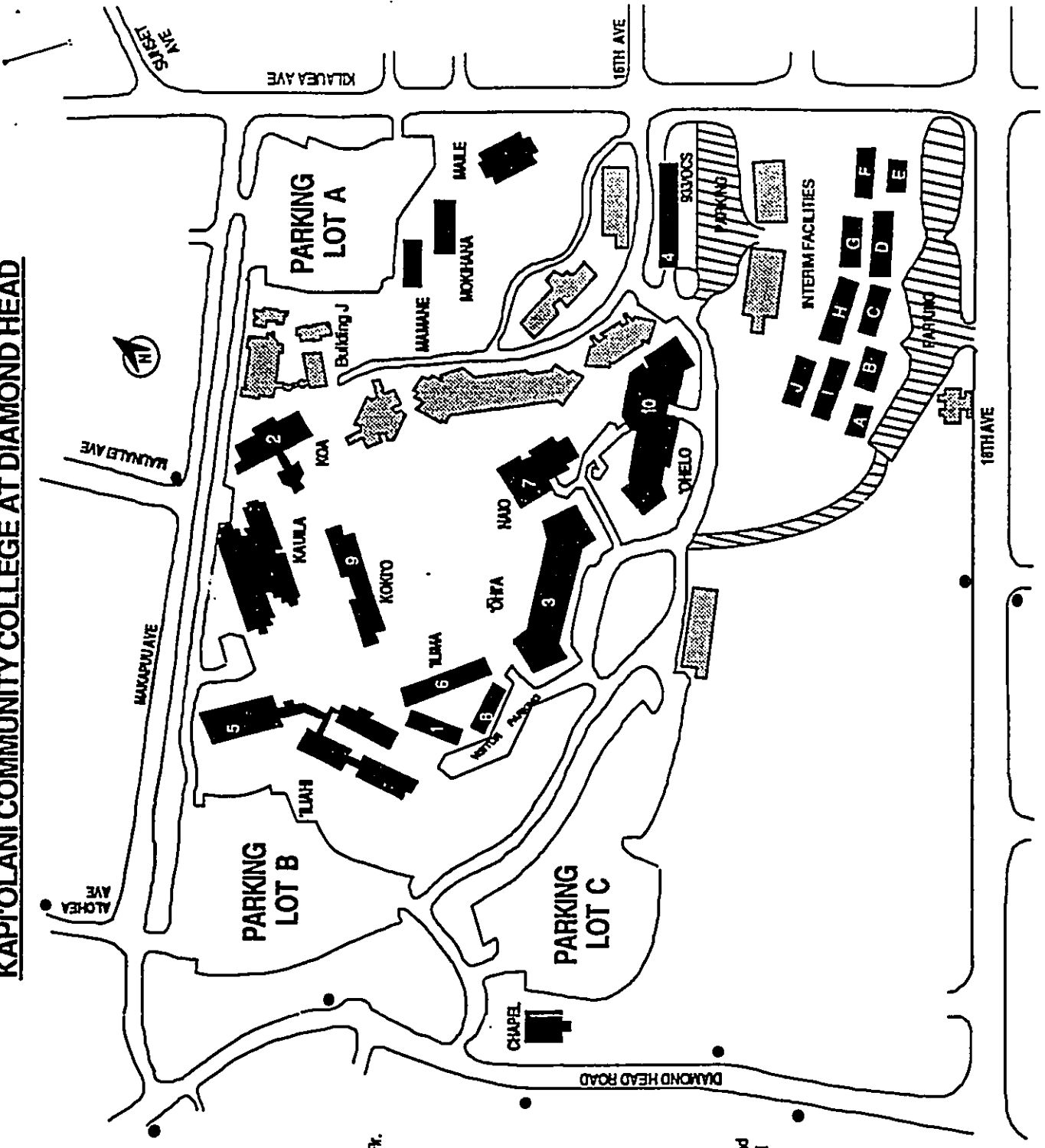
