SUMMARY/PURPOSE/NEED: The Department of Public Safety proposes to modify the existing heating and ventilation system within the isolation unit holding area to meet health and safety requirements.

The existing heating and ventilation system is not able to provide a uniform temperature throughout the existing building. Because of this limitation, inmates confined to the isolation area are subjected to extreme hot and cold temperatures which prompted court suits by the American Civil Liberties Union.

To correct this deficiency the Department of Public Safety is proposing to install a new, separate HVAC system for the isolation unit area. In addition, other associated work relating to Building Code, Fire Code, and other applicable requirements will be included.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED ACTION:

The work will generally involve providing a new HVAC system; installing a two-hour fire separation wall between the isolation unit area and the administrative offices; provide operable windows within the isolation unit area, a new key system, a local five alarm system, and emergency lighting; and installing smoke detectors.

ENVIRONMENTAL SETTING

The existing facility is situated on the slope of MaunaKea at the 5190-ft. elevation within the Upper Waiakea Forest Reserve. It occupies an area of approximately 7,244 acres. Access to the site is by a narrow, asphaltic paved roadway approximately 19 miles long. The present site has been in existence since 1942 when the first building was erected at the site. The portion of the administration building affected by the project was built in 1984. Grounds at the facility are partially barren with a crushed cinder overlay. Other areas are covered with exotic vegetation such as Kikuya grass.

Vegetation along the access road include ohia, hapuu fern, and other indigenous plants which are typical for the entire area. Some of the typical vegetation seen in the area include ohia, tree fern, amaumau fern, uluhe fern and puakeawe.

No animals or birds were seen during the site visit. But doves, mynah, sparrow and other common species of birds may fly through the area. There is also the potential for game birds such as the Francolin, pheasant, quail and partridge to be found in the designated hunting areas. As the facility is deep within the forest reserve, it is possible that endangered bird species may also be present.

Feral pigs and goats may be present since the lower portion of the reserve is open to hunting throughout the year.

According to information from the Department of Land and Natural Resources, approximately 48 species of native plants, 9 species of native birds and various native insect species "are found" in the Upper Waiakea Forest Reserve.

Soils in the area are identified as r11D on the Soil Survey of Island of Hawaii, State of Hawaii. Soil type r11D is described as lalau extremely stony muck with 6% to 20% slopes. This well drained soil overlays Aa lava and are found at elevations ranging from 3500 to 7000 feet above sea level and receive from 90 inches to more than 150 inches of annual rainfall. The soil has dark brown color and a thin profile usually only 3 inches thick. Its permeability is considered rapid, runoff is slow and erosion hazard is slight.

Uses of this soil type include woodland, wildlife habitat and watershed.

There are no known archaeological or historical sites within or near the facility.

No significant impact to water quality is expected as there will be no anticipated increase in the facilities population or changes to the existing wastewater disposal system.

There are no anticipated significant impacts due to vehicular traffic to or from the facility.

Pollutional impacts attributable to emissions from vehicular exhaust and from the fuel oil heating system will be insignificant as the anticipated increases will be very minimal.

#### ALTERNATIVES AND ITS IMPACTS:

1. No action. This will not mitigate the pressing need to provide a more humane environment for inmates confined to the isolation unit area or satisfy the civil suit by the American Civil Liberties Union.

2. Provide a new, separate facility. This alternative is feasible and will be considered by the Department of Public Safety when a site development plan is prepared in the future. However, due to

lack of funding and the time it would take to determine a site as well as design the building precludes considering this alternative at this time.

3. Upgrade Existing Facility. This alternative is the direction the Department of Public Safety is pursuing. It will be able to meet the health and life safety requirements of inmates within the budget limitations available.

#### RELATIONSHIP OF PROPOSED ACTION TO LAND USE PLANS, POLICIES AND CONTROLS.

The proposed project site is within the Conservation District which is controlled by the Department of Land and Natural Resources, State of Hawaii, under Title 13, Chapter 2, Conservation Districts.

Kulani Correctional Facility is in the "General Subzone" of the Conservation District. The objective of this subzone is "to designate open space where specific conservation uses may not be defined, but where urban use would be premature."

The facility is permitted use in the area under the criteria that it is a governmental use where the public benefit outweighs any impact on the environment.

Approvals required before the project can be implemented include a Building Permit and Conservation District Use Permit.

#### PROBABLE IMPACT ON THE ENVIRONMENT

As the intent of project is to upgrade only a portion of an existing building, only minor alterations to the building exterior is proposed. The exterior alteration is needed to accommodate a new turnace and a new flammable storage room. Since these exterior alterations would be relatively minor and its construction would be similar to the existing building, the visual changes would hardly be noticed.

There will be some noise impact during the construction. However, since the construction will be confined between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., no adverse impacts are anticipated.

#### RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN LOCAL SHORT TERM USES OF ENVIRONMENT AND THE MAINTENANCE AND ENHANCEMENT OF LONG TERM PRODUCTIVITY

The proposed action does not foreclose future uses for the area. should the State ever abandon the site, the area would be able to revert to its original condition.

#### IRREVERSIBLE AND IRRETRIEVABLE COMMITMENTS OF RESOURCES

Other than the commitment of labor and materials, no cultural resources or natural resources surrounding the site will be affected by the proposed action.

PROBABLE ADVERSE ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS WHICH CANNOT BE AVOIDED

The Project will be using herbicides to control vegetative growth where the new flammable storage room and fuel oil tank pad will be built. The area is considered insignificant (approx. 64 s.f.) Only a minute amount of herbicide will be needed and any excess would be neutralized when it contacts the ground or diluted to such a degree where it would become undetectable.

Other than the normal noise, dust, commitment of labor and building materials, no adverse environmental impacts are anticipated when the proposed project is built.

MITIGATION MEASURES

As the proposed project is not anticipated to have any adverse environmental impacts, no mitigative measures are needed. However, to maintain security, work within the facility is restricted to the time between 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

The project is not anticipated to affect any scenic, cultural, historical, or endangered plant or animal specie.

UNRESOLVED ISSUES.

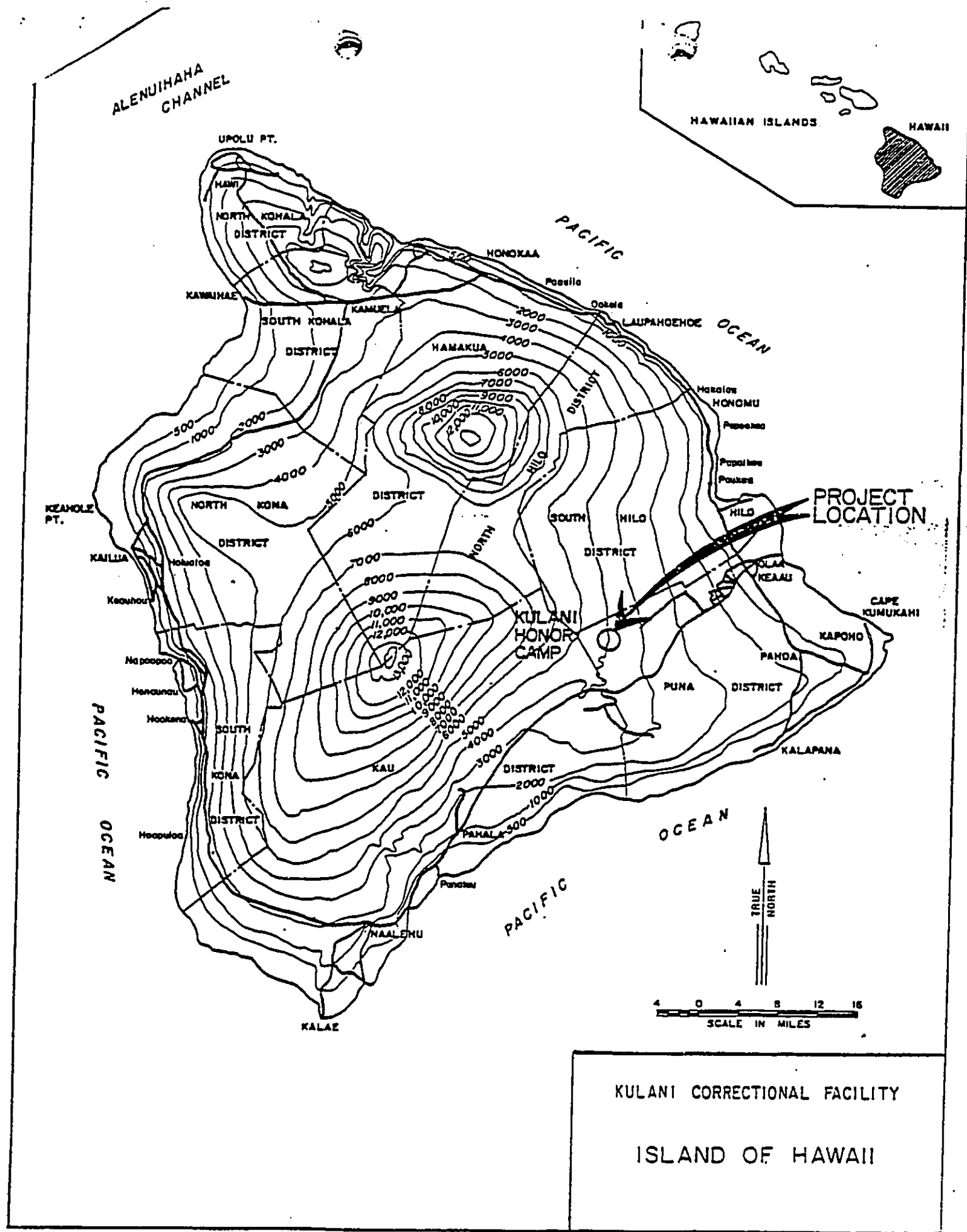
The only unresolved issue associated with the project involves the option to build a new isolation unit somewhere else within the facility. But the immediate need to provide a more humane environment to those inmates confined to the isolation unit overrides consideration of resolving this issue at this time.

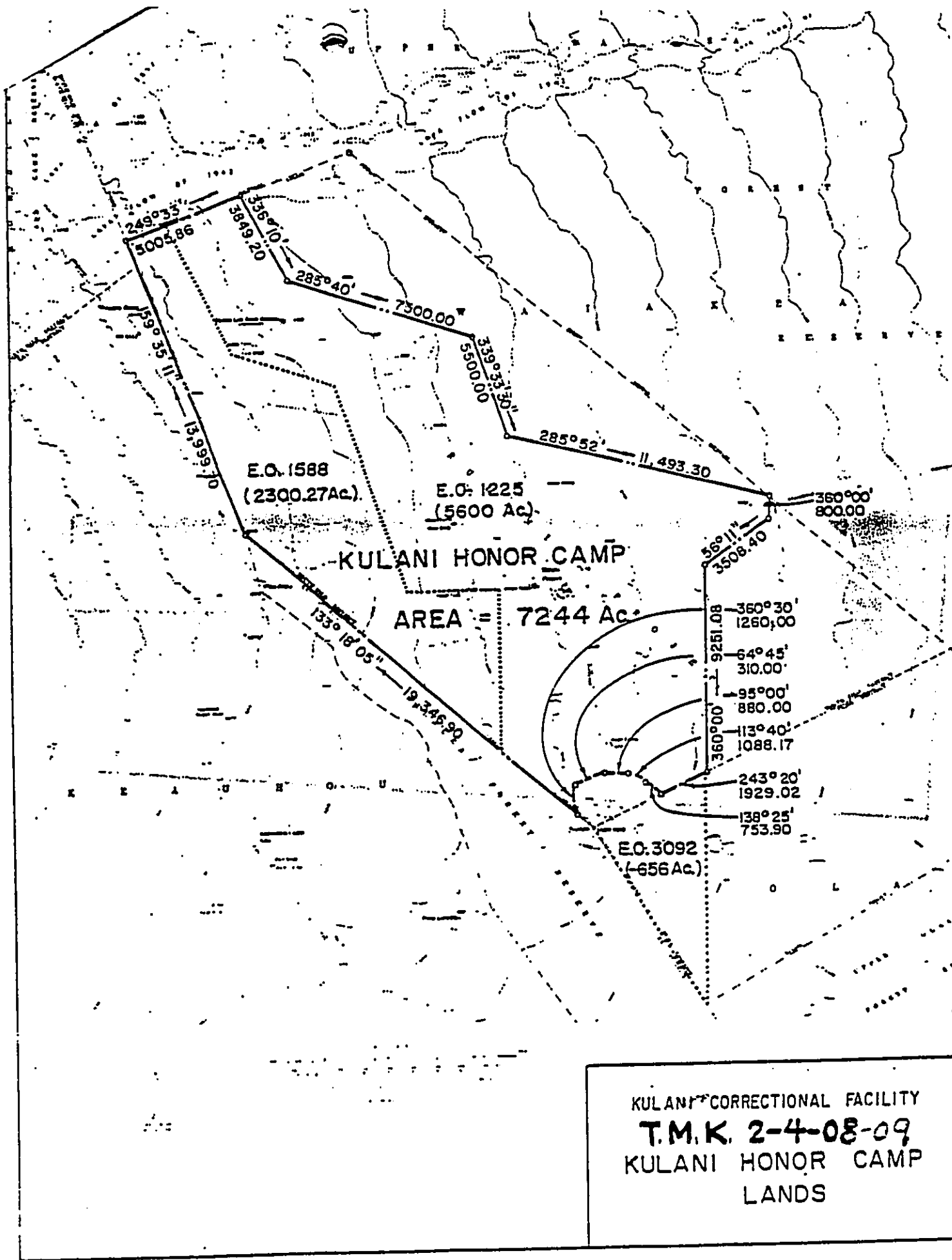

ISLAND OF HAWAII







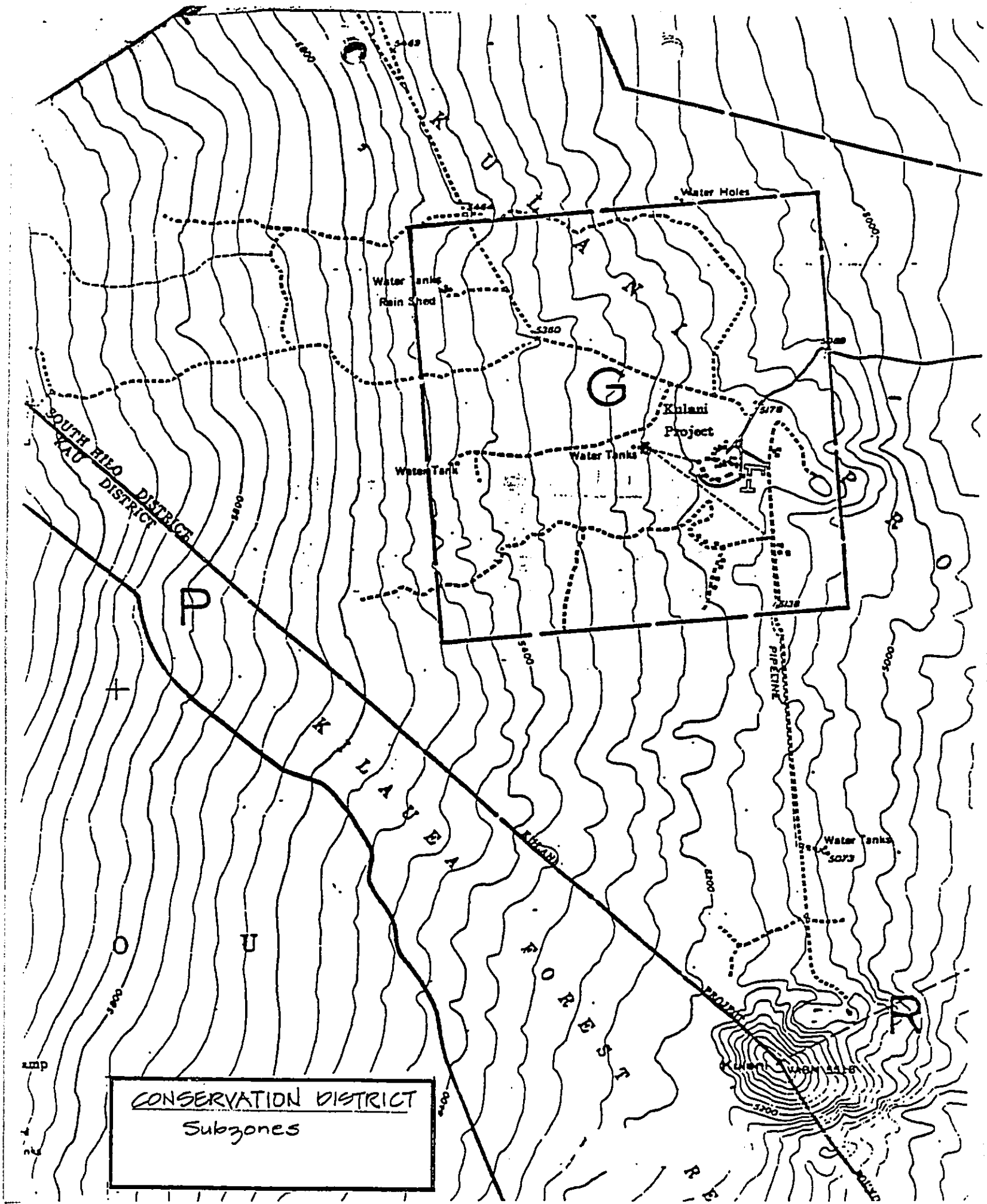

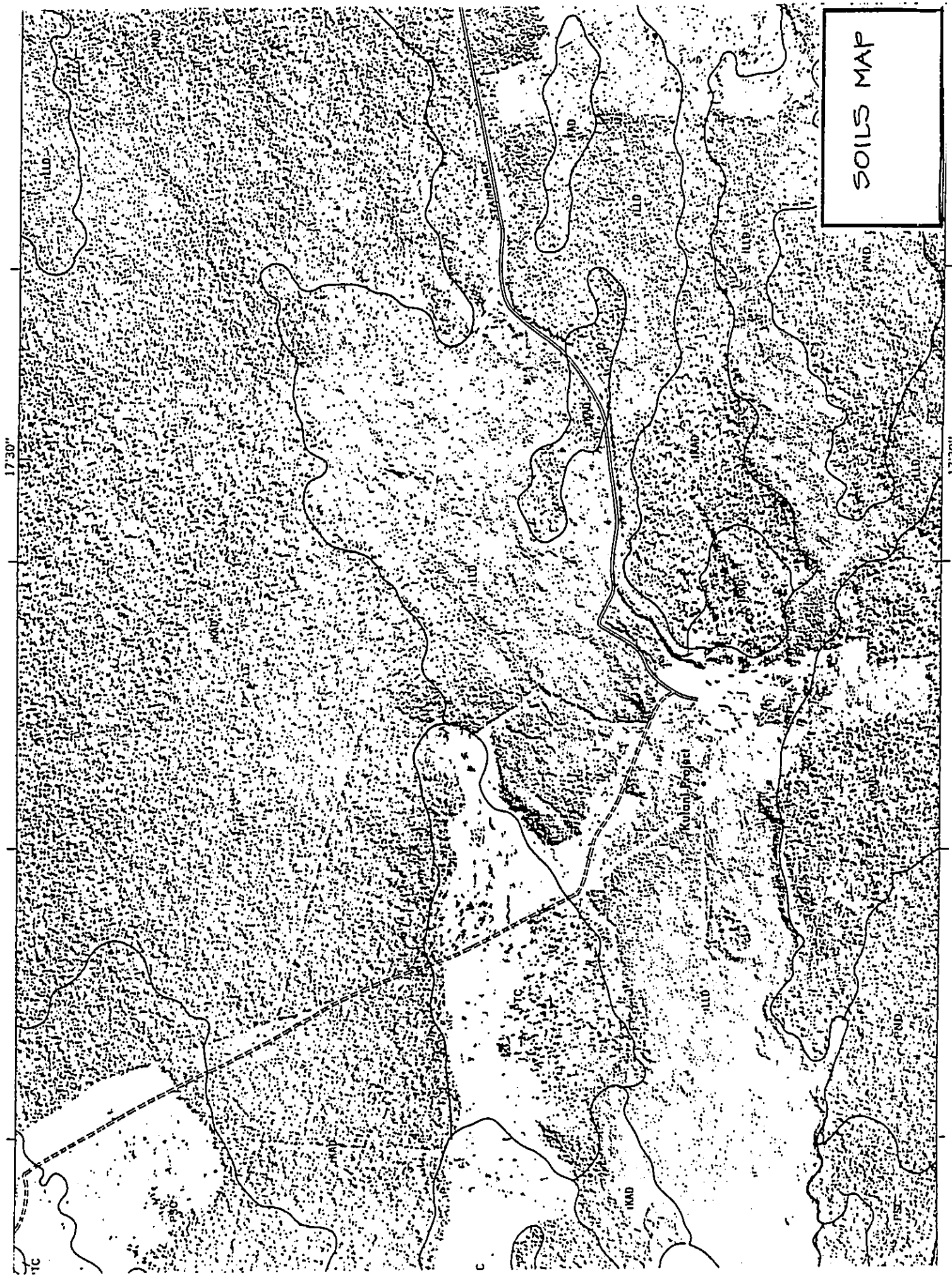

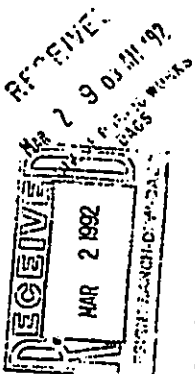

Executive Order No. 1225

**Setting Aside Land for Public Purposes**

By this Executive Order, I, the undersigned, Governor of the Territory of Hawaii, by virtue of the authority in me vested by paragraph 9 of Section 71 of the Hawaiian Organic Act, and every other authority me hereunto enabling, do hereby order that the public land hereinafter described be, and the same be, hereby set aside for the following public purposes:

FOR **DALMEI PRISON FIRM** to be under the control and management of the **Department of Institutions** which shall be conducted by the Director of Institutions upon the **Farm Outlay Plan** as provided for under Section 3609, Revised Laws of Hawaii 1944.

**Dalmei Prison Firm**

Being portions of the Government (Green) Lands of Waialua and Oahu

South Side and Town District of Hawaii.

Beginning at the Government Triangulation Station "DUMAIKI" and on the corner boundary of the lands of Enehaue, Waialua and Oahu as shown on Government Survey Registered Map 8745, and running by azimuth measured clockwise from true North:

2. 130° 00' 7000.00 feet along portion of the Upper Waialua Forest Reserve

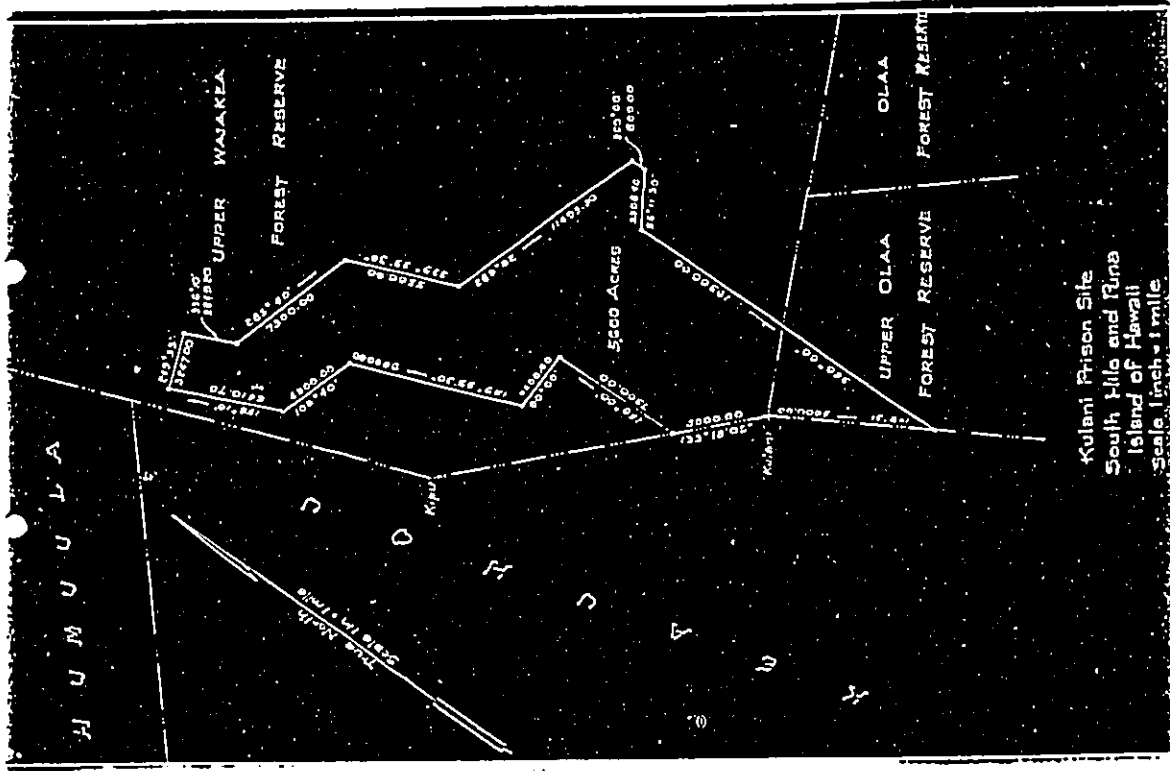

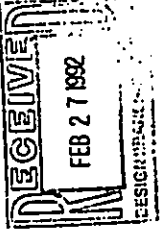
