FINAL ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT WAIANAE HIGH SCHOOL TEN-CLASSROOM BUILDING CC NOVEMBER 23, 1992

- A. <u>PROPOSING AGENCY</u>: Department of Accounting and General Services for the Department of Education.
- B. <u>APPROVING AGENCY</u>: Not applicable.
- C. AGENCY CONSULTED: Department of Education.
- D. <u>GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE TECHNICAL</u>, <u>SOCIO-ECONOMIC AND</u> <u>ENVIRONMENTAL CHARACTERISTICS</u>:
  - <u>Technical</u>: This project proposes to construct a twostory reinforced concrete and masonry building of approximately 20,600 square feet which will consist of ten classrooms (six regular classrooms, two chemistry classrooms, one special education classroom, one computer classroom), toilets, custodial rooms and a faculty center with connecting ramps to an adjacent school building. Existing parking stalls and fence will be relocated. The facility will provide classrooms needed to implement educational programs at the high school. Construction of the building will be completed in a single phase.

## 2. <u>Socio-Economic</u>:

- a. The proposed project will not create sufficient work to substantially impact the economy and welfare of the community and State.
- b. The estimated cost of the project is \$3,900,000.
- c. Since the project will be constructed within the existing school campus, no land will be removed from the tax base.
- d. The project will provide the school with a muchneeded facility to implement its program in accordance with the Educational Specifications.
- 3. <u>Environmental</u>:
  - a. The project will not create any major long-term environmental impacts.
  - b. However, during construction, the air quality may be affected by dust and exhaust emissions and it

is anticipated there will be a temporary increase in noise levels.

- c. These impacts are expected to be minimal since State and Federal regulations need to be met.
- E. <u>SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF THE AFFECTED ENVIRONMENT, INCLUDING</u> <u>SITE MAPS</u>:
  - 1. The site of the proposed project is located on the school campus (TMK 8-3-02:18/8-3-15:01). It is on level ground covered with grass and weeds. A portion of the site is paved for open parking.
  - 2. No habitat of endangered species, flora or fauna are known to exist at the site.
  - 3. No historical, archaeological or cultural sites are known to exist at the site.
  - 4. The site is in a Special Management Area which will require a shoreline survey and a SMA permit.
  - 5. The location of the proposed project is shown in Figures 1 and 2.


## F. <u>IDENTIFICATION AND SUMMARY OF MAJOR IMPACTS AND</u> <u>ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED</u>:

- 1. <u>Major Impacts</u>: The proposed project will not:
  - a. Involve an irrevocable commitment to loss or destruction of any natural or cultural resources.
  - b. Curtail the range of beneficial uses of the environment.
  - c. Conflict with the State's long term environmental policies.
  - d. Substantially affect the economic or social welfare of the community or State.
  - e. Involve substantial secondary impacts, such as population changes or effects on public facilities.

- f. Involve a substantial degradation of environmental quality.
- g. Detrimentally affect air or water quality or ambient noise levels.
- h. Be located in any environmentally sensitive area, such as a flood plain, tsunami zone, erosionprone area, geologically hazardous land, estuary, fresh water, or coastal waters.
- 2. <u>Alternatives to the Proposed Project</u>: "No action" is not considered to be a viable or desirable alternative.
- G. <u>PROPOSED MITIGATION MEASURES</u>: Short term impacts on air and noise quality during construction will be controlled by application or appropriate pollution and noise control measures.
- H. <u>DETERMINATION</u>: On the basis of the above assessment, it is concluded that the proposed project will not have a significant adverse impact on the environment.

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
