MOTION: Vice-Chariperson Begier moved, and Member Terry seconded that the EAC approve the above minutes. The Council unanimously approved the motion (12-0-0).

Member Kinnaman joined at 1:15 PM. Members Kinnaman and Scruton, Jr. introduced themselves.

### 3. Office of Planning and Sustainable Development (OPSD) Director's Update

Discussion of 2023 legislation being tracked by OPSD

Director Glenn reported that legislative session is winding down. Thursday is the last day and budget was voted out today. Most of OPSD's substantive bills did not make it out of conference committee. He mentioned the following legislative updates:

- o Bill to amend the SMA definition of development was passed,
- EAC's cleanup bill has been signed into law (Act 24),
- OPSD's budgets remains steady with no increase in positions,
- Land Use Commission is getting one position,
- OPSD will continuing doing the \$2 million Transit Oriented Development (TOD) planning grants
- Hawaii Community Development Authority was appropriated about \$86 million in TOD infrastructure projects and will work with HHFDC and OPSD on statewide TOD related projects
- For climate, \$100 million not appropriated as a specific line item on adaptation, but allocated to Hawaii Green Infrastructure Authority for rooftop solar and battery for low-income families

Budget worksheets won't be available for another two weeks.

With the Mr. Segundo's (Environmental Health Specialist (EHS)) retirement, Mr. Tom Eisen, ERP's Planner, is the only person doing The Environmental Notice with no backup. Another staff from Special Plan Branch is willing to cross train. Currently, ERP is recruiting a Planner III to support the Planner V and is looking to reclassify EHS III position to another Planner III to support the Council.

Once interim starts, Governor's Office will probably start looking at Boards and Commissions and to fill board vacant appointments. Director Glenn's last day is Thursday.

Member Kinnaman inquired about HB 365 regarding the exemption of traditional fishponds and traditional agricultural practices. This legislation has been transferred to the Governor.

Chairperson Thoene reported the HCR70 and HR71 did not make it past legislation.

### 7. Annual Report Committee Update

# Continued discussion of content for the 2023 Annual Report and committee recommendation to full EAC

Committee Chair Dunbar-Co reported that the 2023 Annual Report would follow the 2022 Annual Report. Following the recommendation made in the last meeting, the annual report would largely be a summary, detailing what the EAC has accomplished and the future direction of the EAC. It was further recognized that the document is mostly an internal document. A small portion of the committee would convene, following the legislative session, to meet with Representative Lowen and Senator Gabbard to discuss the changing of the statute moving forward, so that the Council does not need to produce an annual report.
