NEGATIVE DECLARATIONS

1. Hawaii State Senior Center, Renovation & Improvements - Dept. of Accounting & General Services (DAGS)
Proposed project consists of enclosing an existing exterior patio/lanai by constructing a roof and installing sliding doors and jalousie windows.

2. Wilcox Elementary School, Library Extension-DAGS
Proposed project involves the construction of a 20' x 50' addition, including a 13' x 13' media viewing room. Furniture, equipment, vinyl abestos flooring, carpets and air conditioning will be provided. Portions of the existing library's roof, walls and covered walkway will be demolished and removed during construction of the library extension.

3. Hanapepe Library Addition-DAGS
A 32' x 52', hollow tile, partially carpeted addition to the Hanapepe Library has been proposed. Site will be treated for

ground terraces and portions of the existing library's roof and walls will be demolished and removed in the course of completing the project.

Proposed 50 unit project consists of a community building and 25 semi-detached buildings approximately 32' x 48'. Project is located on a 5.5 acre parcel in Waiakea, South Hilo, Hawaii, T.M.K.: 2-4-56. Grading of the entire site, installation of utilities and construction of service roads will be required.

5. Kapakahi Stream Protective Fencing, Waialae, Oahu-Dept. of Public Works, City & County of Honolulu

Proposed project consists of installing approximately 5,000 lineal ft. of 4'-0" high chain-link fence along Kapakahi Stream, an improved drainage channel that flows through Aina Koa Sub-division, Waialae, Oahu.

6. Mohouli Park, South Hilo, Hawaii-County of Hawaii

The proposed Mohouli Park is a 4.0 acre neighborhood park fronting on Numukoa Street. It will serve the State sub-division adjacent to the park site, as well as the University, Kukuanu and Lanakila areas. Facilities will include a tot-lot, a picnic area, ball fields and basketball, volleyball and tennis courts.

7. Kona Swimming Pool-County of Hawaii

A joint State and County project proposes the construction of a swimming pool on the Kona Waena School grounds in Kealahakua, South Kona. The pool will be 25 yards long & 8 lanes wide.

8. Lagoon Drive & Air Tour/Taxi Lease Lots, Honolulu International Airport -Dept. of Transportation

Proposed Lagoon Drive Lease Lots project consists of constructing a sub-division for the Ground Transportation Service Base-yards and other airport related facilities. Construction items include roadway, curbs, sidewalks and underground utilities. Proposed Air Tour/Taxi Lease Lots project consists of constructing a sub-division for General Aviation facilities. Construction items include access road, taxiways and underground utilities.

9. Kona Elderly Housing Project-Hawaii Housing Authority

Proposed 32-Unit project involves the construction of a community building and 7 one-story housing buildings at the site of the former Kona Police & Fire Dept. Density of the development is 5.4 units/acre. Some grading will be required; utilities and cesspools will be installed.

10. Kamehameha Highway & Salt Lake Blvd., 36-Inch Water Main, Aiea, Oahu-Board of Water Supply, City & County of Honolulu

The proposed project consists of constructing a 36-inch water main with appurtenances along Honomanu Street, Kamehameha Highway and Saik Lake Blvd.

11. Pupukea Road, Relief Drain, Pupukea, Oahu-Dept. of Public Works, City & County of Honolulu

Proposed project will provide 7 separate drain outfalls from Pupukea Road to the existing gully. The drains which will be located on the northern side of the road, will range in length from 65' - 885'; pipe sizes will vary from 18" - 48".

Proposed project involves the relocation of Kapiolani Community College to Fort Ruger on a 51.628 acre site bounded by Kilauea Ave., Makapuu Ave., 18th Ave., and a parcel of State-owned land adjacent to Diamond Head Road. The school will be designated East Honolulu Community College and will be planned for an enrollment of a full time-student-equivalent of 5,000. 1. Waimaea River Ford Crossing, Waimaea, Kauai, Hawaii--Dept. of Public Works, County of Kauai

Proposed project, located approx. 1.3 miles north of Waimaea Town, involves the construction of a ford crossing approx. 250 ft. in length across the Waimaea River. The crossing will consist of a roadway in embankment with a series of culverts that cross the Waimaea River. The roadway will have an earth core with a combination of concrete and asphalt concrete surfacing and will provide a 12-ft. wide travel lane. The proposed ford crossing will follow the alignment of the existing earth and gravel crossing.
