I. NEGATIVE DECLARATIONS, APPLICANT ACTIONS

proposed action--applicant/approving agency

project description

1. Stairway--Herbert Chock/Dept. of Land Utilization, City & County

Applicant proposed to construct a low profile stairway on his residential shoreline property, located at 46-047 Liliupuna Rd., Kaneohe. The structure will be approx. 110 ft. in length with a 2 1/2-ft. walkway area and will extend into the 40-ft. shoreline setback area.

2. Marine Dealer Facility, Honokahau Boat Harbor, Kailua-Kona, Hawaii--Standard Oil Company of California/Dept. of Transportation

Proposed facility consists of two 12,000 gallon gasoline storage tanks, fueling equipment, and an office building. The facility will occupy an approx. 4,200 sq. ft. parcel adjacent to the launching ramp.

II. NEGATIVE DECLARATIONS, AGENCY ACTIONS

project description

1. Water and Related Land Resources Planning, State of Hawaii--Dept. of Land & Natural Resources

DLNR proposes to apply, under Title III of the Water Resources Planning Act, for \$150,000 in federal assistance toward the development and administration of comprehensive water and related land resources plans for the State. Federal assistance will be on a 50% matching basis.

2. Kilauea to Kalihiwai Transmission Main--Dept. of Water, Kauai County
3. Pump, Electrical Controls, and Piping for Existing Well at Old Lihue Grammar School--Dept. of Water, Kauai County
4. 20-Inch Main Along Fort Weaver Road From Farrington Highway to Renton Road, Ewa, Oahu--Board of Water Supply, City & County
5. Maunawili District Trunk Sewer, Section 1--Dept. of Public Works, City & County
6. Improvement of the Makai-Ewa Corner of Ala Wai Boulevard and Malina Street--Dept. of Public Works, City & County

Approx. 5,720 ft. of transmission main are proposed for installation along Kuhio Hwy. to link the Kalihiwai Water System, which has yielded reduced amounts of water in recent years, to the proposed Kilauea Water System.

A pump is proposed for installation at the exploratory well to supply an additional 200,000 gal./day to the Lihue Water System. The well will be connected to the pipeline running along Haleko Rd.

The subject main and its future extension to the Ewa Beach area will parallel an existing 16" main and connect to other existing mains to provide adequate transmission capacity (4-16 million gal./day) for Honolulu and Ewa Beach areas, including the proposed Ewa Village and Grant Co. developments.

Proposed project will eliminate the need for 2 temporary sewage treatment plants--the Maunawili Park STP and the Maunawili Lstate STP--that discharge into Maunawili Stream. Upon completion of this project, sewage from the Maunawili area will be conveyed to the regional Kailua STP for treatment and disposal through the Kikapu Ocean Outfall. The trunk sewer for this system will start in the vicinity of the Kukanono STP, run southeast along the south edge of Kawaiui Swamp, cross under Maunawili Stream and Kalani-Anaole Hwy., and branch into the Maunawili Park STP.

Approx. 270 linear ft. of street improvements are proposed for the subject corner, including construction of curbs, gutter, sidewalks, driveway aprons, asphaltic concrete pavement, tree wells, and adjustments to the drainage and water systems.

7. Papaikou, Honomu, and Pepekeo Solid Waste Transfer Stations--Dept. of Public Works, Hawaii County

The subject transfer stations are proposed for construction on lands that are being acquired from Maunakea Sugar Co. These stations are planned primarily for use by the general public to dispose of household wastes. Each station will occupy approx. 1 acre and will consist of an enclosed metal chute through which refuse will be dumped into a 70-75 cubic yard self-sealing compactor. Compacted refuse will be disposed of at the Hilo landfill.

8. North Kona Water Project (Kualalalai Pipeline)--Dept. of Water Supply, Hawaii County

Proposed project will draw on water from Mahaluu Wells to improve service to the Hualalalai Rd. and Hillcrest Subdivision areas. Project will involve installation of approx. 18,200 ft. of 8" pipeline along Hualalalai Rd., which will tie in to the existing 8" line along Hamalahoa Hwy. near the Kaumalumalu pump station. Two concrete reservoirs and two pressure reducing stations will be installed along this line.

9. Kahei Far Lot Subdivision, (Kohala Agricultural Park), North Kohala, Hawaii--Dept. of Land & Natural Resources

In partial fulfillment of a need recognized by the Kohala Task Force to set aside lands for farming by interested individuals, a 9-lot farm subdivision of approx. 20 acres each is planned on former cane land that is bounded on the east and south by Kahei Homesteads Rd. and Kohala Ditch. A paved access road, irrigation water lines, utilities, and drainage ditches will be provided.

10. Konawaena Educational Cluster Land Acquisition--Dept. of Accounting & General Services

Proposed project involves the acquisition of 3 separate parcels of private land totaling approx. 6 acres for addition to the Konawaena Educational Cluster, as follows: 3.5 acres to provide a playfield for the elementary school; 1.5 acres to expand the high school athletic field; and 1 acre to construct a by-pass roadway that will eliminate a hazardous traffic condition through the school.

4. Kulainano Sewage Disposal System--Dept. of Public Works, Hawaii County

Proposed project involves the development of a sewage collection, treatment, and disposal system to serve C. Brewer & Co.'s proposed Kulainano Ets. development and portions of the adjoining Kulainano Homestead. The sewage treatment plant is sized for 0.5 mgd, expandable to 0.8 mgd if necessary. Present method of sewage disposal is by discharge of untreated wastewater into streams under proposed system, chlorinated effluent will be discharged into the surf zone north of Waimaauou Stream, and dewatered, aerobically digested solids will be hauled to a sanitary landfill. (Also available at the Laupahoehoe and Pahoa Branch Libraries.)

5. Special Education Center of Oahu, New School--Dept. of Land & Natural Resources

DLNR proposes to lease a 4.3 acre parcel in the Ft. Rucker area jointly to the Special Education center of Oahu and the Variety Club School for development of 2 schools for handicapped children. The site is identified as TRK 3-1-42-18 and is designated urban on the Land Use District Boundary Map and zoned R-6. The site is adjacent to the Hawaii Association for Retarded Children School, and the 3 schools together will constitute an educational complex for handicapped children. The SECO school will include 3 1-story classroom buildings and will serve 120 students. The VCS will include 6 classrooms and an administrative center. (Also available at the McCully-Moiliili and Waikiki-Kapahulu Branch Libraries.)

6. Variety Club School, Honolulu, Hawaii--Dept. of Accounting & General Services

Proposed project involves the construction of new facilities for the Variety Club School to serve 70 children with learning disabilities. The VCS will occupy 1.7 acres of the above-mentioned 4.29-acre parcel that is being leased jointly with the Special Education Center of Oahu. Allowance has been made for the United

Cerebral Palsy Association to also use the parcel.

7. Haleakala Highway, Pukalani Section--U.S. and State of Hawaii Departments of Transportation

Proposed project consists of improv- June 26

ing a 3-mile section of Haleakala Hwy. between Haliimaile Rd. and EAB 377, extending recent improvements to the highway that were constructed between Kana Hwy. and Haliimaile Rd. It is likely that improvements will eventually extend to Kihei-Uluvaleke. Subject project will improve road design and increase capacity by providing a truck lane, 12-ft. lane widths, 10-ft. shoulders, drainage, reflectorized markers, guidelanes, guardrails, access controls, and greater sight distances. Other design features and the highway alignment will be selected following public hearings, to be held on June 12, 7:30 p.m., Makawao School Cafetorium.
