1. Maintenance Dredging Along Hydrofoil Mooring Facility at Maalaea Harbor--

Pacific Sea Transportation, Ltd./

Proposed project involves dredging to a depth of

-11 ft. within Maalaea Harbor, which has a Mean Lower

Low Water Depth of -8 ft. in the project area. Volume

of dredged material will be 400 cubic yards.

2. Additional Fendering Surface Along Hydrofoil

Mooring Facility at Maalaea Harbor--

Pacific Sea Transportation, Ltd./

Additional fendering surface is proposed for construction between the 3 existing piers at the hydrofoil mooring facility to protect hydrofoils when docking. Present

fendering surface is 31 ft.; new surface, to be provided

by tying the 3 piers in to a common face, will be 45.5 ft.

III. NEGATIVE DECLARATIONS, AGENCY ACTIONS

- Project description
 1. Project description
 A fire station is proposed for construction on a 56,590 sq. ft. (one-acre) parcel that lies adjacent to 81st (Highway 192) and is adjacent to the Hawaiian Fire Station, Kalaheo, Kauai County. The station will consist of 2 buildings: a main building housing the engine company and including a roof top helipad, and an ambulance facility.
2. Agency actions
 A 1-story, 700 sq. ft. control building will be constructed on the parcel. 1,000 gpm pumps will be installed at Punalua (CRK: 1000-1000) and zoned agriculture and planted in sugar cane. The main building will be connected by 16" main to an existing 30" main on Kalaheo.

II. ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENTS, AGENCY ACTIONS

- Project description
 1. Project description
 Federal Japan's Intermune dredging is part of a continuous program by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for maintaining channel and basin navigability, flood protection and safety of at ocean dump sites located 3-5 miles offshore of the main Hawaiian Islands. These dump sites will also be used for other operations performing maintenance dredging work as part of the Corps.

Final EIS's

1. Hanapepe Refuse Transfer Station at Hanapepe, Kauai-- Dept. of Public Works, Kauai County

Proposed project will provide a station where county pickup units and the public may dispose of refuse, which will then be compacted and disposed of at the Kekaha Sanitary Landfill. Project site is a 1.2 acre parcel bounded by Lele Rd., Hanapepe Drain Ditch, and the future county roadway. This site is within the open zone area of the Kauai General Plan, but a Special Use Permit has been granted. Completion of the project will enable the county to eliminate open dumping at Poré Allen. (Also available at the Hanapepe and Waimea Branch Libraries.)

2. Hanalei Elementary School Relocation-- Dept. of Accounting & General Services

The Dept. of Education plans to relocate Hanalei E.C. (which is within the rural zone and in need of major repair) and to consolidate at the new campus the Hanalei, Hanalei Elementary Schools (which currently share administrative and educational services). Recommended site is a vacant 10 acre parcel that has been designated agricultural by the Land Use Commission and zoned open by the county. Identified as TMR: S-3-06:14, the parcel is owned by Princeville Corp. but will be dedicated to the State for school purposes.

3. Agricultural Park on Oahu at Fohakea in Kunia-- Dept. of Agriculture

Subject park is proposed for development on 2,000 acres of land owned by the Campbell Estate. Project site is bounded by Schofield Barracks and Oahu Sugar Co. cane lands. Project objective is to strengthen diversified agriculture by combining relatively small, independent operations in 1 area so as to minimize pressures for urbanizing agricultural land and to provide for production and distribution economies. Roads, drainage control, utilities, and waste management facilities will be provided by the State, along with park management at the outset. Eventually, however, it is anticipated that farm lessees will be granted management responsibilities. Projected ventures in the 1st phase include dairies, swine, poultry, feedlots, meat packing, vegetable farms, and nursery gardens.
