### ANTICIPATED EIS'S

(Proposed actions for which EIS Preparation Notices have been received and for which the deadline for request to be consulted parties has passed.)

Kuhio Ave. Widening (DPW, City/County); Kalanianaole Hwy. Transportation Corridor (DOT); Zone Change, Halawa (Queen's Medical Center, et. al.); Planned Development-Housing, Kahaluu (Ahuiimanu Investment Co. & Valley of the Temples Corp.); Tourist Recreational & Food Service Facility at Iao Valley, Wailuku, Maui (Nordic Maui, Inc.); Honolulu Rapid Transit System (DTS, City/County); 2nd Entrance Road to Wahiawa (DOT); Kailua High School, 2nd Entrance (DAGS).

### COMMUNITY PLANNING PETITION FOR DECLARATORY RULING

On September 15, Amfac, Inc. joined in the Community Planning, Inc. petition for a declaratory ruling on whether an EIS may be required by the City and County Department of Land Utilization in connection with a subdivision application for extending Bougainville Drive to Salt Lake Boulevard in Halawa, Oahu.

After considering arguments presented by both the petitioners and the DLU, the Environmental Quality Commission ruled at its September 15 meeting that no EIS shall be required of the applicant for the Bougainville Drive Extension subdivision application.

### PROPOSED EXEMPTION LIST

As provided under Section 1-33d of the EIS Regulations, the Department of Land and Natural Resources has submitted the following list of proposed exemptions. Review of the list will be an agenda item for the next EQC meeting, which is scheduled for Monday, October 6. Comments from the public are welcome.

- iv. Revegetation of burned or eroded areas.
- v. Control of diseases, rodent and insect pests, or infestation by exotic plants.

- f. Commercial and recreation fisheries research.
- g. Environmental impact investigations.
- h. Fish-kill investigations.
- i. Releases and recoveries.
- j. Starfish control.
- k. Building and monitoring streamflow gauging stations.
- l. Installing and monitoring climatology stations.
- m. Gated access roads and trails to data collection stations and field research stations.

Class 6. Administrative Activities

- a. Management of aquatic, forestry, land, historic, recreation and water resources.
- b. Recordation of titles.
- c. Land acquisition.
- d. Vehicle and equipment maintenance.
- e. Cruising and planning for sale of forest products.

Class 7. Minor Accessory Structures

- a. Fencing.

Proposed project involves the construction of a 3-story classroom building and a 13,500 sq. ft. cafeteria. Relocation of 2 classroom portables and demolition of the existing cafeteria and portions of buildings would be required.

2. Wheeler Intermediate School

Proposed project involves the construction of a 6,000 sq. ft. classroom building at the Oahu school.

3. Mililani High School Athletic Field--

Proposed project involves the construction of a track-football field with lights, bleachers for 5,000 spectators, and other related items at the Oahu school.

4. Moanalua High School Baseball Field--

Proposed project involves the construction of a baseball field with bleachers and other related items at the Oahu School.

5. Kuhale Venture--

Proposed project involves the construction of 29 moderate income units in a 2-story clustered arrangement. Project site is bounded by Kapahulu, Lincoln, and Second Avenues in Kapahulu, Oahu.

6. Diamond Head Health Center--

A 4-story building with 64,358 sq. ft. of floor space, 16,727 sq. ft. of lanai area, and 77,032 sq. ft. of parking is proposed for construction on an 80,000 sq. ft., R-6 zoned lot located at the Kilauea Ave.-Polole St. intersection, adjacent to Leahi Hospital. The building would house various health agencies presently scattered throughout the Diamond Head, Koko Head, and downtown areas. The 20 persons presently residing on the project site would be relocated by Leahi Hospital.

6. Māhiawa Transfer Station and Landfill--

A transfer station is proposed for construction on a 2.19 acre parcel situated on pineapple fields along Wilikina Drive. The station would be used to compact solid waste collected from Wahiawa, Whitmore Village, and Mililani Town by City and County refuse crews and local residents. Compacted refuse would be transported to the Waipahu incinerator or Kawaiola landfill, except for demolition and noncombustible material and tree trimmings, which would be disposed of in a 15 acre gully adjacent to the proposed transfer station site.

These 2 proposed projects involve the installation of 8" and 12" water mains and appurtenances along the subject roadways to upgrade water and fire protection service to lots fronting the roadways.

Aprox. 2.7 acres of the school property are proposed for development into a playground with ball fields and paved courts.

Proposed project consists of replacing the Kapoho open rubbish dump with a transfer station on Pahoa By-pass Rd., 3/4 mile from Keonepoko Homesteads Lot. Project site is a 1.7 acre parcel of State-owned land. The station, which would be primarily for use by individuals hauling household waste, would consist of an enclosed chute emptying into a 75-75 cubic yard compactor. Compacted refuse would be disposed of at the Hilo disposal site until Puna's sanitary landfill is established.

Proposed project involves the construction of 34 middle income, single-family dwelling units on State land located at the intersection of Puainako and Komohana Sts. The subject property is vacant and represents the undeveloped portion of the housing project, which was initiated in 1964 by the State.

Brewer Support Housing, Inc. is seeking low cost interim financing monies for the construction of single-family dwellings on HHA's 50-lot Kulaimano Unit V subdivision, an 18 acre parcel of fee simple land contiguous with the completed Kulaimano I-IV housing area. The dwellings would be made available to plantation employees and pensioners.

A safe stopping area for viewing Laupahoehoe Pt. and the surrounding coastline would be provided under this project. Project site is between Kilau and Manawaiopae Gulches.

Subject facility is proposed to accommodate UH research programs for the development of an integrated crop-livestock production system for application to areas in the State where sugar and pineapple operations are phased out. Project site is a 3.7 acre parcel of Pratt & Smith and Kite Drive
