- 2. Installation of culverts under an existing County road. The culvert is designed to eliminate flooding of roadway which would generally occur at a low point in the road profile, such as at a river ford.
- 3. The installation of one or two (one on each side of the road) drywell sumps within the County right-of-way to eliminate or reduce localized flooding, ponding or puddling.

4. Modernization of an existing highway by resurfacing, widening less than a single lane width, adding shoulders, adding auxiliary lanes for localized purposes (veaving, climbing, speed changes, etc.) and correcting substandard curves and intersections.
5. Replacement or reconstruction of an existing gravel road by resurfacing it with asphalt concrete pavement. The completed road will be located generally on the same site and will have substantially the same purpose, capacity and dimensions as the road prior to construction.

5. Kukui Highway Realignment, Island of Hawaii

Proposed action would provide an improved highway of 3.1 miles in the North Kona District, parallel to the coastline and approx. 1½ miles inland. Three alternate corridors are being considered.

6. Linde Airport Master Plan Study--

Proposed action consists of developing a master plan for Nov. 24 Lihue Airport to provide for its orderly expansion. Emphasis would be placed on the need for a new runway alignment, an instrument approach capability, and expanded terminal facilities.

III. NEGATIVE DECLARATIONS, AGREEING
proposed action—*Proposing agency*

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Proposed action involves herbicide treatment of 500 acres of noxious shrub infested rangeland in Kekeha Game Management Area, Kauai, and selective thinning of 200 acres of scrub forest by felling trees and treating stumps with herbicides. Target species include: *Kanahā*, *palii*,

and silk oak. Herbicides to be used include: 2,4-D (dichlorophenoxyacetic acid) and Lordon 22-K (4 amino 3,4,6 trichloropicolinic acid). Purpose of this project is to improve game bird habitat and hunter access by opening up dense stands of noxious shrub.

2. 30-Inch Main and 16-Inch Main
Along Fort Weaver Road, Kinoapeleokane
Road, Makule Road and Polakupuna Road.
Board of Water Supply, City & County

Subject action is proposed to upgrade water service and fire flows to the Ewa Beach area.

3. Improvements to Unpaved Area at Berth
51-B, Sand Island, Honolulu Harbor, Oahu--
Dept. of Transportation
Makule Road and Polakupuna Road.
Board of Water Supply, City & County
- This action is proposed to provide a new container yard at Sand Island to alleviate congestion at the Fort Armstrong container yard. Improvements to the Berth area would include paving 12.8 acres of fast land and installing culverts, catch basins, lights, reefers, receptacles, and power for container operations.
4. Administration/Industrial Building,
Marine Expeditionary Center ^{Oahu}
Dept. of Accounting & Gen. Services
- Proposed building is a 160' x 200', 1- and 2-story structure. Space allocations would be for material assembly, electronic shop, shipping and receiving, machine shops, and administrative offices.
5. Transportation Services Facilities,
University of Hawaii at Manoa--
Dept. of Accounting & Gen. Services
- Proposed action includes: demolition of 2 garages, a green house, quonset hut, and a dilapidated wooden building; renovation of the existing shop; addition of a 1,650 sq. ft. metal frame annex to the existing shop; provision of a paved parking area for 130 vehicles and an underground drainage system.
6. Palolo Valley Homes HA 1-8, Palolo
Homes I and Palolo Homes II, Honolulu,
Oahu--
Hawaiian Housing Authority
- Proposed action consists of renovating the existing Administration and Community Building, expanding the Maintenance Yard and facilities, and construction of a new comprehensive Community Center with independent foundations and structure straddling the existing structure.
7. Kailua High School 2nd Entrance
Roadway--
Dept. of Accounting & Gen. Services
- Proposed action involves the construction of a roadway extension of Akiohala St. in Enchanted Lake Subdivision, Oahu to the eastend of Kailua High School. The roadway would serve school traffic only, including buses, and would be closed during off-school hours. The roadway would intersect State-owned, urban zoned land as well as privately owned, conservation land.
- (NOTE: An EIS preparation notice was previously submitted for this action and reported in EOC Bulletin I-5. Upon further assessment of the action, however, DAGS has determined that significant effects are not likely to result. The preparation notice has therefore been withdrawn and superceded by a negative declaration.)

3. Golf Cart Bridge, Kapalua Golf Course
Maui--
Dept. of Transportation

Proposed action involves the construction of a golf cart bridge over the State's Honoapilani Hwy. in the vicinity of Oneola Bay and Nakaluaapuna Pt., West Maui. The bridge would connect 2 holes of the Kapalua Golf Course that are makai of the highway with the rest of the course on the mauka side. Total length of the structure would be 140 ft., total width, including sidewalls, would be 15 ft. Minimum clearance above the highway would be 15' 6".

4. Mountain View Elementary & Intermediate School Community School Library--
Dept. of Accounting & Gen. Services

Proposed library would replace the existing school library. It would be a 1-story building with a gross floor area of 3,000 sq. ft., and it also would be on the school grounds.

5. Molokai Recreational Community Center/Office Complex, Moolehu, Molokai--
Dept. of Hawaiian Home Lands

Proposed complex would provide a place where Molokai Homesteaders may congregate, hold meetings, social events, and programs of interest to the entire community. The structure would also house the Molokai Project Office of the DHHL.

6. Polahau Homestead Road Improvement
DO, 3rd
Dept. of Public Works, Hawaii County

Under this project, road alignment would be straightened to eliminate 2 sharp curves in the existing road. Also, 2 culverts would be provided to convey storm water runoff.

7. Piilona Road and Bridge Improvement, Southilio, Hawaii--
Dept. of Public Works, Hawaii County

Proposed action involves the improvement of 300 lin. ft. of substandard road north of Piiloku River to provide 20-ft. A.C. pavement with 6-ft. shoulders and 9-ft. swale section for drainage. Proposed action also involves the reconstruction of an existing 3-span wooden bridge into a 1 span concrete bridge.

8. Waiakea Stream Improvement at Kupulau Road--
DO, 3rd
Dept. of Public Works, Hawaii County

To alleviate flooding to residents along Waiakea Stream, the Channel would be widened to convey a design flow of 6,400 cfs. A CRM wall would be built below Kupulau Road where the channel would infringe upon the existing residences. Project would start at the diversion from Ainaola Drive and end after the residential area is passed.
