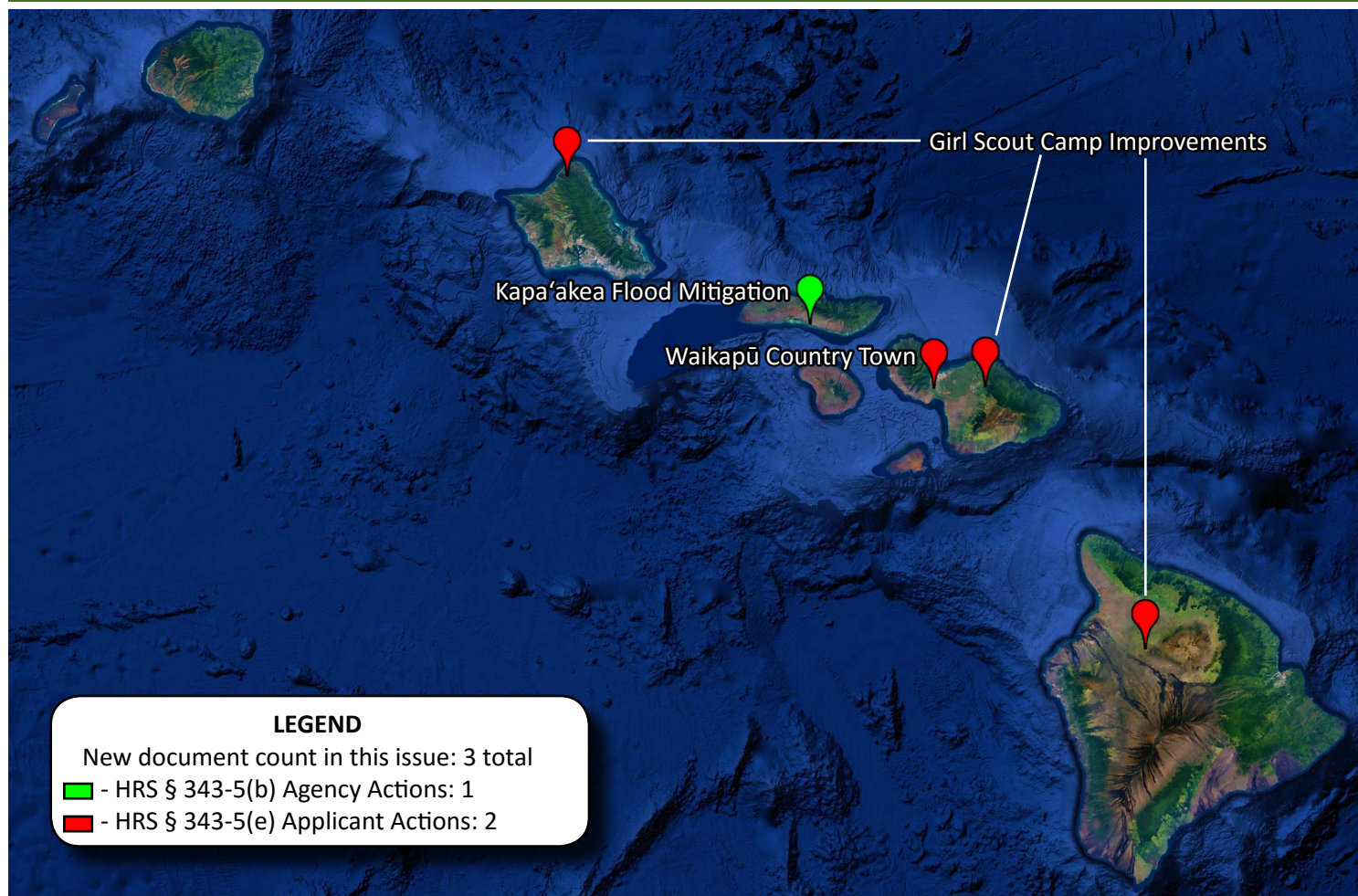

Waikapū Country Town is a mixed-use residential community proposed for development on approximately 499 acres within and around the Maui Tropical Plantation in Wailuku. The project site is about 2 miles south of Wailuku and adjacent to the southern boundary of Waikapū. 485 of the subject acres are in the State Land Use Agricultural District. Entitlement changes will be sought to bring State Land Use and County zoning designations into appropriate State and County urban and rural designations. Waikapū Country Town is designated a “Planned Growth Area” in the Maui Island Plan, December 2012.

The project includes a diversity of housing types, neighborhood commercial, employment uses, an elementary school, private water and wastewater systems, parks and open space. The project will comprise about 1,433 residential units and nearly 200,000 square-feet of commercial. The project includes an approximate 8-mile network of pedestrian and bicycle paths. The project’s agricultural component encompasses about 1,077 acres which will remain in the State Agricultural District. The bulk of the agricultural lands, approximately 800 acres, will be dedicated in perpetuity to agricultural use. The Applicant desires to establish an agricultural park, a limited amount of renewable energy production and other permissible uses on these lands.

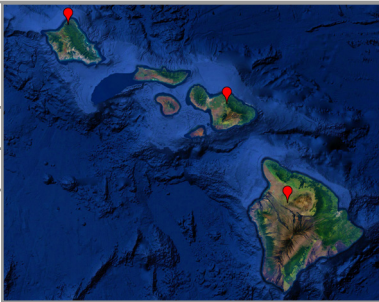

The Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) proposes a flood mitigation project within Kapaʻakea Ahupuaʻa in Kaunakakai, Molokaʻi to protect five DHHL Homestead lots which are subject to flooding during periods of heavy rainfall. The proposed project involves the removal of an existing chain link fence and concrete masonry unit (CMU) wall. A new 4-foot high CMU wall and swale are proposed for installation as a flood barrier along the north- and west-facing boundaries of the five DHHL Homestead lots. The proposed CMU wall is approximately 700 feet in total length, including a roughly north-south portion and roughly east-west portion, and will terminate approximately 60 feet mauka of the shoreline. The project area includes a shoreline-fronting lot, and is located within the County of Maui’s Special Management Area (SMA). However, as the project will be undertaken directly by DHHL on lands owned by DHHL, the Maui Department of Planning agreed that an SMA Permit is not required.

Girl Scouts of Hawai'i is improving their camp facilities statewide. The key elements of the Camp Paumalū Master Plan include constructing a new lodge at the center of Camp Paumalū, new Staff Cabins, replacing the existing swimming pool, and relocating mechanical equipment for the pool and showers to a consolidated structure. The project will add three new campsites with associated new cabins, pavilions, and restroom facilities. Common area facilities will be upgraded to meet minimum building code and permitting requirements. Infrastructure improvements will include roadways, parking, water systems, additional water distribution lines, modified wastewater systems for one-to-one replacement with code compliant systems, and added capacity and service connections for gas/propane and electrical and renewable systems.

The project also proposes to abandon the existing large capacity cesspools at Camp Kilohana and Camp Pi'iholo and construct onsite wastewater treatment systems. The proposed individual wastewater systems will require re-routing the existing building sewer lines to discharge into an onsite septic tank for treatment, and constructing an absorption bed for disposal. The existing cesspool and pit toilets at Camp Kilohana, and the existing cesspools at Camp Pi'iholo, will be abandoned and plugged in compliance with HAR section 11-23-19 following construction of wastewater system upgrades.

Proposed Threatened Listing Determination for the Oceanic Whitetip Shark (published 12/29/2016)

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) has determined that the oceanic whitetip shark (*Carcharhinus longimanus*) warrants listing as a threatened species. The NMFS completed a comprehensive status review under the Endangered Species Act for the oceanic whitetip shark in response to a petition from Defenders of Wildlife to list the species and found that it is likely to become endangered throughout all or a significant portion of its range within the foreseeable future.

Should the proposed listing be finalized, the NMFS would also designate critical habitat for the species. The NMFS solicits information to assist in this listing determination, the development of proposed protective regulations, and the designation of critical habitat. **Comments must be received by March 29, 2017.** Submit comments at www.regulations.gov/#!docketDetail:D=NOAA-NMFS-2015-0152 or to Chelsey Young, NMFS Office of Protected Resources (F/PR3), 1315 East West Highway, Silver Spring, MD 20910, USA. GLOSSARY OF TERMS AND DEFINITIONS

Agency Actions

Any department, office, board, or commission of the state or county government which is part of the executive branch of that government per [HRS 343-2](#).

Applicant Actions

Any person who, pursuant to statute, ordinance, or rule, requests approval for a proposed action per [HRS 343-2](#).

Draft Environmental Assessment

When an Agency or Applicant proposes an action that [triggers](#) HRS 343, an Environmental Assessment shall be prepared at the earliest practicable time to determine whether the actions' environmental impact will be significant, and thus whether an environmental impact statement shall be required per [HRS 343-5\(b\)](#), for Agency actions and [HRS 343-5\(e\)](#), for Applicant actions. For actions for which the proposing or approving agency anticipates a Finding of No Significant Impact (AFNSI), a Draft EA (DEA) shall be made available for public review and comment for 30 days and public notice is published in this periodic bulletin.

Final Environmental Assessment and Finding of No Significant Impact

The Agency shall respond in writing to comments on a DEA received during the 30-day review period and prepare a Final EA (FEA) that includes those responses to determine whether an environmental impact statement shall be required. If there are no significant impacts, then the Agency will issue a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI). An Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) will not be required and the project has cleared HRS 343 requirements. The public has 30 days from the notice of a FONSI in this bulletin to ask a court to require the preparation of an EIS.

Final Environmental Assessment and Environmental Impact Statement Preparation Notice

An EIS shall be required if the Agency finds that the proposed action may have a significant effect on the environment. The Agency shall file notice of such determination with OEQC, called an EIS Preparation Notice (EISPEN) along with the supporting Final EA. After the notice of the FEA-EISPEN is published in this bulletin, the public has 30 days to request to become a consulted party and make written comments. The public (including the Applicant) has 60 days from the notice of the EISPEN in this bulletin to ask a court to not require the preparation of an EIS.

Act 172-2012, Direct-to-EIS, Environmental Impact Statement Preparation Notice (with no EA)

Act 172 in 2012 amended HRS 343 by providing for an agency to bypass the preparation of an environmental assessment for various actions that in the experience of the agency would clearly require the preparation of an EIS. Until administrative rules have been drafted, the agency must submit its determination that an EIS is required for an action (Act 172-2012, EISPEN) with a completed OEQC publication form detailing the specifics of the action to enable the public a 30-day period to request to be consulted parties in the preparation of the Draft EIS. Comments and responses on the EISPEN must be incorporated into the subsequent Draft EIS.

Act 312-2012, Secondary Actions in the Highway or Public Right Of Way

Act 312-2012, amended HRS 343, by adding a new section (HRS 343-5.5., entitled "Exception to applicability of chapter:") HEPA now allows for a statutory exception for "secondary actions" (those that involve infrastructure in the highway or public right-of-way) provided that the permit or approval of the related "primary action" (those outside of the highway or public-right-of-way and on private property) is not subject to discretionary consent and further provided that the applicant for the primary action submits documentation from the appropriate agency confirming that no further discretionary approvals are required. An aid to understanding this is to visualize residential driveway improvements in the public right-of-way, versus, retail outlet driveway improvements in the public right-of-way.

Draft Environmental Impact Statement

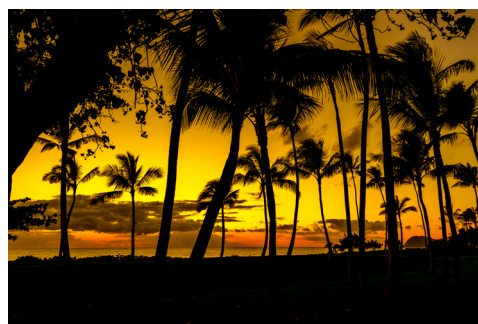
After receiving the comments on the EISPEN, the Agency or Applicant must prepare a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS). The [content requirements](#) of the DEIS shall contain an explanation of the environmental consequences of the proposed action including the direct, indirect and cumulative impacts and their mitigative measures. The public has 45 days from the first publication date in this bulletin to comment on a DEIS. The DEIS must respond to comments received during the EISPEN comment period in a point-by-point manner.

Final Environmental Impact Statement

After considering all public comments filed during the DEIS stage, the Agency or Applicant must prepare a [Final EIS](#) (FEIS). The FEIS must respond in a point-by-point manner to all comments from the draft and must be included in the FEIS. See here for [style](#) concerns. For Applicant projects, the Approving Agency is authorized to accept the FEIS and must do so within 30-days or the FEIS is accepted as a matter of law. For an Agency project, the Governor or the Mayor (or their designated representative) is the Accepting Authority, and unlike applicant actions, there is no time limit on the accepting authority reviewing the FEIS. Only after the FEIS is accepted may the project be implemented.

Acceptability

If the FEIS is [accepted](#), notice of this action is published in this bulletin. The public has 60 days from the date of notice of acceptance to ask a court to vacate the acceptance of a FEIS. For Applicant actions, non-acceptance by the Approving Agency is cause for the Applicant to administratively appeal to the Environmental Council. For Agency actions, there is no such administrative appeal. In both instances, the Applicant or the proposing Agency can prepare a revised DEIS after a non-acceptance determination.

National Environmental Policy Act

The National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) requires federal projects to prepare an EA or EIS. In many ways it is similar to Hawai'i's law. Some projects require both a State and Federal EIS and the public comment procedure should be [coordinated](#). OEQC publishes NEPA notices in this bulletin to help keep the public informed of important federal actions.

Conservation District

Any use of land in the State Conservation District requires a Conservation District Use Application (CDUA). These applications are reviewed and approved by the Board of Land and Natural Resources. Members of the public may intervene in the permit process. Notices of permit applications are published in this bulletin.

Special Management Area and Shoreline Setback Area

The Special Management Area (SMA) is along the coastline of all islands and development in this area is generally regulated by [HRS 205A](#), and county ordinance. A special subset of the SMA that is regulated by HRS 343, is the [Shoreline Setback Area](#). Most development in this area requires a Special Management Permit. This bulletin posts notice of these SMA applications to encourage public input.

Shoreline Certifications

State law requires that Hawai'i shorelines be surveyed and certified when necessary to clearly establish the shoreline setback from the certified shoreline. The public may participate in the process to help assure accurate regulatory boundaries. Private land owners often petition to have their shoreline certified by the State surveyor prior to construction. This bulletin publishes notice from the Department of Land and Natural Resources of shoreline certification applicants and final certifications or rejections.

Environmental Council

The [Environmental Council](#) is a 15-member citizen board appointed by the Governor. They serve as a liaison between the Director of OEQC and the general public concerning ecology and environmental quality. The Council makes the rules that govern the Environmental Impact Statement process (HRS 343). [Agendas](#) of their regular meetings are posted on the Internet and the public is invited to attend.

Administrative Exemption Lists

Government agencies must keep a list describing the minor activities they regularly perform that are [exempt](#) from the environmental review process. These lists and any amendments shall be submitted to the Council for review and concurrence ([HAR 11-200-8\(d\)](#)). This bulletin will publish an agency's draft exemption list for public comment prior to Council decision making, as well as notice of the Council's decision on the list.

Endangered Species

This bulletin is required by [HRS 343-3\(c\)](#), to publish notice of public comment periods or public hearings for Habitat Conservation Plans (HCP), Safe Harbor Agreements (SHA), or Incidental Take Licenses (ITL) under the federal Endangered Species Act, as well as availability for public inspection of a proposed HCP or SHA, or a proposed ITL (as a part of an HCP or SHA).

Notes

- Section 11-200-3(c), Hawai'i Administrative Rules (HAR), establishes the publication schedule of the periodic bulletin to be on the eighth and twenty-third of each month. Publication may occur on weekends and holidays.
- Section 11-200-3(c), HAR, establishes the submittal deadline to be eight working days before the publication date. The schedule does not count holidays and non-working days. Items must be submitted before the close of business (4:30 PM) on the submittal deadline.
- Hawai'i Revised Statutes (HRS) Section 343-5 sets the comment periods for EAs as 30 days and for EISs as 45 days from the publication date. For counting purposes, the publication date is day zero. Holidays and weekends (see HRS § 1-29 and HRS § 8-1) are counted. When the deadline falls on a state holiday or non-working day, the deadline is the next working day.
