

Ocean Recreation Management Plan 2020 FOUR GUIDING PERSPECTIVES

1. CONNECT LAND AND SEA

- Incorporate the interconnectedness of island ecosystems into decision-making.
- DLNR is a 'Mauka-Makai' State agency

2. PRESERVE OUR OCEAN HERITAGE

- Promote respect towards native Hawaiian traditional ecological knowledge.
- Fishing is a customary right, consult native fishing practitioners

3. PROMOTE COLLABORATION AND STEWARDSHIP

Create and sustain a diverse network of stakeholders

4. ADAPT TO CHANGING CONDITIONS

- Mitigate the projected impacts of global climate change to rising sea levels
- Loko ia'as surrogate coastal nursery habitat, consult with Loko ia' practitioners

Scope of Muliwai P.I.G

Identify key points and information to include in an outreach resource to be developed with CZM staff with a focus on;

- 1. the *mauka-muliwai-makai* connection and the importance of caring for all three of the fish habitat zones, especially *muliwai* (estuaries).
- 2. In addition, develop recommendations to CZM on how to complement the *Holomua* outreach and engagement process.

Purpose

Develop outreach materials to;

- 1. Bring awareness to and elevate the importance of estuaries as critical habitat,
- 2. Cradle (nursery) of many coastal marine fish species,
- 3. Emphasize the mauka-muliwai-makai connectivity,
- 4. Introduce 'Muliwai' into the lexicon.
