WELCOME & INTRODUCTIONS

Justine Nihipali, Program Manager, Coastal Zone Management Program (OPSD-CZM), welcomed participants and introduced two new OPSD employees: Rachel Beasley and Sofia Luczak. Participants introduced themselves and the organizations/agencies they were representing.

Build Out of Cross-Agency Project Map Viewer

- Viewer creation was motivated by the influx of federal funds. Would like to leverage agency topics/projects (active and in planning process) via cross agency collaboration. The viewer is seen as a living document where agencies/organizations can submit federally funded projected and current projects. This viewer will allow project managers to assess overlapping areas of interest and need.
- Presentation of current projects beginning with statewide projects and then county-bycounty. Prompts for projects discussed: Name, Agency, Brief description, phase of implementation, looking for partners?
- Projects, in general (see Map Viewer for full list of projects):
 - i. DAR is conducting many federally funded projects on coral restoration as well as estuary restoration.
 - ii. Hawaii County to address coastal shoreline setbacks and riparian buffers.
 - 1. Kirstin L. T. is interested in connecting on this project.
 - iii. 319 Funding (DOH) is aimed at addressing impaired State waters.
 - 1. Scott M. and Jim B. connected regarding working with Joanne Sito and the environmental science hui.
 - iv. Jim B. stated that there is federal money to strengthen public infrastructure; is a 150 million hazard mitigation grant; does require matching funds; is a Hawaii only grant.
 - 1. Nancy M. is interested in this grant for generators for Molokai.
 - v. Strategic Plan for the DPR, Division of Urban Forestry does not currently look at beach and dune restoration but could in the future.
- Looking to connect:
 - i. Kirstin L. T. requested agency feedback regarding being able to say she is working with other agencies on a project: LOA NOAA workforce development, climate ready project, creating pathways for coastal zone managers.
 - ii. Jim B. is interested in getting resources/connecting for an environmental and coastal resources assessment for Lahaina to conduct an EIS or EA.
 - iii. Kirstin L. T. is interested in connecting with Community Based Organizations (CBO) to develop climate champions (C&C project? Alex).
 - 1. Marie W. stated a project of theirs (re looking for staffing support to help implement climate adaptation plan) sounds relatable to CBOs to

develop climate champions. She is also looking for letters of support for this project.

- iv. Kirstin L. T. interested in connecting with DOT regarding the Kaaawa Elementary School project (revetement and dry stack wall).
- v. Jodi Higuchi is looking for letters of support for their Hanapepe project.
- Questions:
 - i. Will the viewer link to pivot tables and spreadsheets?
 - ii. Can the viewer be linked with DOH's list of projects?
 - iii. HDOA Limu and Wastewater project, a question came up if there is linkage with DOH.
 - What is the next step for the Punaluu project? Amy Wirts stated that the current funded project was for feasibility. The consultant did build into their report the "bones" for an Environmental Assessment. Next step is to obtain funding for planning/design/construction.
 - v. DOT, do they monitor the number of times a road gets over topped with water/ocean? Answer: No, they do not.
 - vi. Is there a way to make the viewer more interactive and collaborative?
