Arthur and Larry,

I believe that it would be most efficient if the Board would fill out a "Hawaii Geographic Name Application" form designating "Kūkahau'ula" as the name for the summit precinct of Maunakea as delineated below.

Also, it should be noted that the 10 names assigned to pu'u in the summit region of Maunakea via the attached Memo dated March 13, 1974 are "new" names, rather than traditional ones. Those new names include "Hau'oki", "Kea", and "Wēkiu" as depicted within the summit precinct of Kūkahau'ula shown below.

I believe that it has been demonstrated via maps and documents included in HBGN Binder 20220504 that Kūkahau'ula is the name of the summit precinct. As a private citizen interested in geographies of Hawai'i and associated place names I urge the Hawai'i Board on Geographic Names designate Kūkahau'ula as such.
