AGENDA ITEM 2: Review of Meeting Minutes for September 23, 2019

AGENDA ITEM 5: Selected place names on the island of Hawai‘i

At 3:22pm Mr. Bobby Camara joined the meeting by phone.

[360015] Kalaieha. Mr. Camara emailed Dr. Larry Kimura. He said that the spelling should be “Kalei‘eha” but it’s sometimes pronounced “Kalai‘eha.” Mr. Camara will forward the email.

[362746] Ohia Mill. Mr. Camara is not familiar with the area but thinks that the spelling of ‘ohia should be corrected, “‘Ohia Mill.”

[363703] Puu Hilea. Mr. Camara said that this was a town in Ka‘u. PNH: village, gulch, and land division; it doesn’t look like a pu‘u on the topo maps; more research needed.

[361306] Kipuka Mamani. HBGN: Mr. Camara suggested the name be changed to “Kīpuka Māmane” to be consistent with current spelling; mamani is an obsolete spelling. Ms. McEldowney noted that this is a common misspelling of the name of the tree. Mr. Cummins noted that there’s a comment in Ulukau that mentions that this is a māmane tree oasis. Mr. Camara confirmed that there are māmane trees there. Hawaiian Dictionary (Pukui and Elbert) lists māmane, but doesn’t have a listing for mamani. Board members present support correcting the spelling to “Kīpukamāmane.”

Summary of decisions:

Four feature names were reviewed: one spelling was corrected, and three require more research and discussion.

Status Key: 1 = Not Hawaiian; 2 = Not Reviewed; 3 = More Research Needed; 4 = HBGN Corrected 5 = Already Correct in GNIS; 6 = Name Change
