

- •2 administrative building locations (Aiea, 44 Merchant Street)





THE BASICS AGE OF BUILDINGS

- **60%** were built before 1970
- First Library: Hawaii State Library (1913)
 - 100,000 sq. ft (after 2 renovations)
 - \$127,000
- First Joint Library: Pahala Public & School Library (1963)
- Newest Library: Nanakuli (2018)
 - 18,000 sq. ft
 - \$15.5 million


