

Reservoirs and their millions of gallons capacity for the island of Oahu.

Storage facilities on Oahu are divided into three categories: closed potable

Water reservoirs, closed nonpotable water reservoirs, and open reservoirs (nonpotable).

Our reservoirs are as follows (mg=million gallons):

•Honolulu District - 66 reservoirs 52.07 mg capacity

•Windward District - 20 reservoirs 26.30 mg capacity

•Waialua-Kahuku - 8 reservoirs 6.80 mg capacity

•Wahiawa District - 7 reservoirs 8.00 mg capacity

•Waianae District - 11 reservoirs 8.06 mg capacity

•Ewa District - 11 reservoirs 27.50 mg capacity


•Pearl Harbor District - 40 reservoirs 40.80 mg capacity

Total Storage Capacity: 163 reservoirs 169.63 mg capacity

Nonpotable Reservoirs: 2 reservoirs 2.50 mg capacity







The graphic below depicts the multiple recycling center on Oahu and the materials recycled at each.

















CORAL REEF MONITORING SITES ON OAHU


