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ORDER

I.

By Decision and Order No. 18163, filed on October 27, 2000, as amended by Order No. 18176, filed on November 3, 2000, the commission granted VERIZON ADVANCED DATA INC. (Petitioner) a certificate of authority (COA) to operate as a facilities-based carrier and reseller of intrastate telecommunications services. Petitioner was issued COA-0205 by the commission.

By letter dated December 16, 2002, filed on December 23, 2002, Petitioner seeks to voluntarily surrender its COA. Petitioner explains as follows:

1. By Decision and Order No. 19136, filed on January 4, 2002, in Docket No. 01-0427, the commission approved Petitioner's reintegration plan with Verizon Hawaii Inc.
2. Under the reintegration plan, Petitioner transferred its assets used to provide intrastate advanced data services, to Verizon Hawaii Inc.

In December 2001, Petitioner notified its former customers of the transfer in operations to Verizon Hawaii Inc. Thereafter, on February 1, 2002, Petitioner's operations became fully reintegrated with Verizon Hawaii Inc.'s operations.

3. Verizon Hawaii Inc. is providing advanced data services to Petitioner's former customers under the same rates, terms, and conditions.
4. Since February 2002, Petitioner "no longer provides any telecommunications services nor has any customers in Hawaii."

In response to the commission's directive, Petitioner recently submitted its annual financial report and public utility fees.

Upon review, the commission: (1) finds that Petitioner has complied with the customer notification requirement set forth in Hawaii Administrative Rules § 6-80-123; and (2) will approve the voluntary surrender of Petitioner's COA.


## II.


### THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

1. Petitioner's request to surrender its COA to operate as a facilities-based carrier and reseller of intrastate telecommunications services is approved, effective from the date of this order. Petitioner shall promptly return COA-0205 to the commission.
