ORDER

I.

By letter filed on April 30, 2003, AICHAN FOODS HAWAII, INC., dba DRIVERS UNLIMITED (Petitioner), requests that certificate of public convenience and necessity no. 5714-C (Certificate No. 5714-C) be placed on inactive status. Certificate No. 5714-C authorizes Petitioner to transport passengers by motor vehicle over irregular routes on the island of Hawaii in the 1-to-7 passenger classification, limited to serving the area between the Kona-Kohala coast resorts and the secluded beaches in West and South Hawaii, excluding Waipio Valley.

Pursuant to Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) § 271-19, the commission may place a certificate on inactive status upon written request by a motor carrier, and for good cause shown. The inactive period, however, may not exceed 12 months. In addition, HRS § 271-19 provides that inactive status may only be granted for a cumulative period not to exceed two years over the life of the certificate.

The commission finds that there is good cause to grant Petitioner's request. If Petitioner so desires it may file, prior to the expiration of the inactive period granted by this order, a request to extend its inactive status for up to one additional year.

II.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

1. Petitioner's Certificate No. 5714-C is placed on inactive status for one year, effective from the date of this order.

2. If Certificate No. 5714-C is not reactivated prior to the expiration of the period of inactivity, i.e., within one year from the date of this order, it shall be declared abandoned and revoked. Petitioner may reactivate the certificate at any time prior to the expiration of the inactive period by filing a request to reactivate with the commission, and fulfilling the requirements for motor carriers including, but not limited to, filing of appropriate insurance documents and publication of a lawful tariff.


3. Petitioner shall not transfer its inactive certificate unless Petitioner can first establish good cause to the commission for the transfer, and the commission has approved the request to transfer.
