<u>ORDER</u>

I.

By letter filed on June 2, 2003, BREWER ENVIRONMENTAL INDUSTRIES, INC. ("Petitioner") requests commission approval to voluntarily surrender its authority under Permit No. 623-P. Under Permit No. 623-P, Petitioner is authorized to transport property by motor vehicle in the specific commodities classification over irregular routes (1) on the island of Oahu, to transport 50 per cent liquid caustic soda under contract with Occidental Chemical Company, and (2) on the island of Kauai, to transport (a) guava puree, empty jars, caps, cartons, labels and finished goods, jams, preserves in glass jars, and mineral water, under contracts with Kilauea Agronomics, Inc. and Hawaiian Fruit Specialties, Ltd., and (b) pelleted feed and/or other products of Production Improved Genetics, Inc. ("PIG, Inc."), and operational equipment, supplies, and commodities normally associated with PIG, Inc. requirements, under contract with PIG, Inc.

In accordance with Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") § 271-19, operating authority under a permit may be terminated upon application of the holder. The commission finds good cause to grant Petitioner's request to terminate its authority.

II.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 1. Petitioner's authority to transport property under Permit No. 623-P is terminated, effective from the date of this order.
- 2. Petitioner shall remove any markings from the vehicles used in its operations. Petitioner shall comply with the foregoing requirement within 10 days from the date of this order.
- 3. If Petitioner fails to comply with the foregoing requirement within the time period specified, it may be subject to penalties pursuant to HRS § 271-27.
 - 4. This docket is closed.
