DECISION AND ORDER

By this Decision and Order, the commission grants MCB, INC., dba MARTIN LOGISTICS ("Applicant"), a certificate of public convenience and necessity ("Certificate") to operate as a common carrier of property by motor vehicle over irregular routes on the island of Oahu in the general commodities classification.

I.

Application for Common Carrier Authority

On May 9, 2005, Applicant filed an application requesting a Certificate to operate as a common carrier of property by motor vehicle over irregular routes on the island of Oahu in the general commodities classification. The application is made pursuant to Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") § 271-12. By Decision and Order No. 21845, filed on May 26, 2005, in Docket No. 05-0109, Applicant was granted temporary authority to operate as a common carrier in the general commodities classification on the island of Oahu. The temporary authority is

effective for one hundred and twenty (120) days, until September 26, 2005.

Applicant served copies of the application on the Hawaii Transportation Association, which consists of carriers that may be affected by Applicant's proposed service, and on the Division of Consumer Advocacy, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Consumer Advocate"). The Consumer Advocate did not participate in this proceeding, and no persons moved to intervene in this docket.

II.

Findings and Conclusions

Based upon our review of the record, we find that Applicant is fit, willing, and able to properly perform the proposed service, and to conform to HRS chapter 271 and the requirements and rules of the commission. We also find that the proposed service is required by the present and future public convenience and necessity. Accordingly, we conclude that Applicant's request for operating authority, as set forth in the application, should be granted.

Orders


THE COMMISSION ORDERS:


1. Applicant is granted a Certificate to operate as a common carrier of property by motor vehicle over irregular routes on the island of Oahu in the general commodities classification.


2. This docket is closed unless otherwise ordered by the commission.
