#### ORDER

By this Order, the commission approves the voluntary surrender of CNG COMMUNICATIONS, LLC's ("Petitioner") certificate of registration ("COR").

Petitioner holds a COR to operate as a pay telephone service provider within the State of Hawaii ("State").<sup>1</sup> Petitioner requests the commission's approval to voluntarily surrender its COR, by letter dated February 14, 2007, received on February 16, 2007.<sup>2</sup> Petitioner represents that it never commenced its business operations, and it does not have any customers within the State.<sup>3</sup>

Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR") § 6-80-123(c) provides in relevant part that for any telecommunications carrier whose entry into the intrastate telecommunications market is

preempted by federal law,<sup>4</sup> said carrier "shall, not later than thirty days before the proposed effective date of any contemplated abandonment or discontinuance of service, provide a written notice of [its] intent to abandon or discontinue service to the commission, the consumer advocate, and affected customers."

On February 16, 2007, Petitioner provided notice to the commission of its intent to surrender its COR. Thereafter, a copy of Petitioner's notice was transmitted by the commission to the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, Division of Consumer Advocacy. With respect to notifying its affected customers, Petitioner represents that it never commenced its business operations. Moreover, in general, as a pay telephone service provider, Petitioner has no customers per se to notify of its intent to discontinue its provision of pay telephone service.

The commission approves the voluntary surrender of Petitioner's COR, pursuant to HAR § 6-80-123(c).

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

1. Petitioner's request to surrender its COR to operate as a pay telephone service provider in the State is approved, effective from the date of this Order.

2. This docket is closed, unless ordered otherwise by the commission.
