#### ORDER

By this Order, the commission orders that certificate of public convenience and necessity no. 1479-C ("Certificate No. 1479-C"), held by QUI VINH LE ("Petitioner"), is terminated, effective from the date of this Order.

## Request to Surrender Common Carrier Authority

By Order No. 22431, filed on April 28, 2006, in this docket, Certificate No. 1479-C, held by Petitioner, was placed on inactive status until April 27, 2007. On March 27, 2007, Petitioner filed a letter requesting commission approval to voluntarily surrender his authority under Certificate No. 1479-C. Under Certificate No. 1479-C, Petitioner is authorized to transport passengers by motor vehicle over irregular routes on the island of Oahu in the 1-to-7 passenger classification.

# Findings and Conclusions

In accordance with Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") § 271-19, operating authority under a certificate of public convenience and necessity may be terminated upon application of the holder. The commission finds good cause to grant Petitioner's request to terminate his authority.

#### III.

#### <u>Orders</u>

### THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 1. Petitioner's authority to transport passengers under Certificate No. 1479-C is terminated, effective from the date of this Order.
- 2. Petitioner shall remove any markings from the vehicles used in his operations. Petitioner shall comply with the foregoing requirement within fifteen (15) days from the date of this Order.
- 3. If Petitioner fails to comply with the foregoing requirement within the time period specified, he may be subject to penalties pursuant to HRS § 271-27.
- 4. This docket is closed unless otherwise ordered by the commission.
