<u>ORDER</u>

By this Order, the commission suspends certificate of public convenience and necessity number 1818-C ("Certificate No. 1818-C"), held by STEPHEN CONNOLLY, dba PARADISE TOURS ("Respondent"), for a period of three (3) months.

I.

Procedural History

By Order No. 23762, filed on October 24, 2007, the commission ordered Respondent to appear at 465 South King Street, вЗ, Honolulu, Hawaii 96813, at 9:00 Room a.m., on November 20, 2007, to show cause why Respondent's Certificate No. 1818-C should not be suspended or revoked for failure to file annual financial report ("AFR") an and pay an annual motor carrier gross revenue fee ("Fee") for the year 2006,

pursuant to Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") §§ 271-25, 271-36, and Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR") §§ 6-62-42(a), 6-62-24(a).¹ In its order, the commission notified Respondent that Certificate No. 1818-C would be suspended or revoked if it failed to appear at the scheduled hearing.

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On November 20, 2007, Respondent failed to appear before the commission's hearing officer. As a result, the hearings officer recommended that: (1) Respondent be found in default for failure to appear at the hearing, and (2) Respondent's Certificate No. 1818-C be suspended for a period of three (3) months and thereafter be revoked if Respondent fails to file an AFR and pay the Fee for the year 2006.

II.

Findings and Conclusions

Based on the entire record, the commission finds that Respondent's failure to appear at the November 20, 2007 hearing constitutes a default in accordance with HAR § 6-68-23. Accordingly, because the commission can assume the facts alleged in Order No. 23762 are true in the event of a default, and such

facts are in violation of the applicable laws, rules, and regulations noted above, the commission concludes that Respondent's Certificate No. 1818-C should be suspended for a period of three (3) months and thereafter be revoked if Respondent fails to file an AFR and pay the Fee for the year 2006.

III.

<u>Orders</u>

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

 Certificate No. 1818-C is suspended for a period of three (3) months, effective from the date of this Order.

2. If Respondent fails to file an AFR and pay the Fee for the year 2006 by the time the suspension period has expired, i.e., three (3) months from the date of this Order, Certificate No. 1818-C shall be revoked. DONE at Honolulu, Hawaii _____ DEC 2 7 2007
