# ORDER INSTRUCTING HAWAII ELECTRIC LIGHT COMPANY, INC. TO FILE QUARTERLY STATUS REPORTS

By this Order, the commission instructs HAWAII ELECTRIC LIGHT COMPANY, INC. ("HELCO") to file quarterly status reports with the commission on the subject project, with the first report due by March 2, 2009, until its discussions with the United States Army ("Army") are concluded.

I.

#### Quarterly Status Reports

By Order No. 23372, filed on April 19, 2007, the commission approved HELCO's request to suspend this proceeding.

By letter dated November 12, 2008, HELCO informs the commission that the Army "has indicated that it is still interested in pursuing privatization of the Pohakuloa Training Area . . . but has not yet responded to HELCO's proposal for the Army to make contributions for the meter ready work and system upgrade costs. Therefore, HELCO respectfully requests continuance of the suspension of this proceeding until discussions with the Army can resume and be concluded."2 Moreover, "[i]f desired by the Commission, HELCO is willing to provide quarterly status reports, starting on March 2, 2009, regarding the status of the subject application."

The commission hereby instructs HELCO to file quarterly status reports on the subject project, with the first report due on March 2, 2009, with subsequent status reports due "on the first business day in June, September and December, until [HELCO's] discussions with the Army are concluded."

II.

#### <u>Orders</u>

#### THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

1. HELCO shall: (A) file quarterly status reports on the subject project, with the first report due on March 2, 2009,

with subsequent status reports due on the first business day in June, September, and December, until HELCO's discussions with the Army are concluded; and (B) serve copies of its quarterly status reports upon the Consumer Advocate.

2. HELCO shall promptly notify the commission of the resolution of the unresolved matters, and HELCO and the Consumer Advocate shall submit their revised procedural schedule to the commission within twenty days thereafter.
