

Division of Consumer Advocacy, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Consumer Advocate"). The Consumer Advocate did not participate in this proceeding, and no persons moved to intervene in this docket.

II.

Findings and Conclusions

Based upon our review of the record, the commission finds that Applicant is fit, willing, and able to properly perform the proposed service, and to conform to Hawaii Revised Statutes Chapter 271 and the requirements and rules of the commission. The commission also finds that the proposed service is required by the present and future public convenience and necessity. Accordingly, the commission concludes that Applicant's request for an extension of his authority should be granted.

III.

Orders

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

1. Applicant is authorized to operate as a common carrier of passengers by motor vehicle over irregular routes on the islands of Oahu and Maui in the 8-to-25 passenger classification.

2. Within one hundred and twenty (120) days after service of this Decision and Order, Applicant shall:

- a. File a tariff that reflects Applicant's new authority in the 8-to-25 passenger classification on the island of Maui.
- b. Complete and submit the enclosed "Vehicle Inventory List" form. Applicant shall indicate on which island Applicant's motor vehicles will be stationed. Applicant must have at least one motor vehicle permanently stationed on the island of Oahu and at least one motor vehicle permanently stationed on the island of Maui. The vehicles utilized must be registered under the name of the Applicant. If Applicant chooses to lease any vehicle, he is required to complete and submit a "Motor Vehicle Equipment Lease" form. The form is available on the commission's website at www.hawaii.gov/budget/puc.
- c. Submit a copy of the current Certificate of Registration or ownership document for all vehicles listed on the Vehicle Inventory List.
- d. Provide the address of Applicant's physical facilities/base yard for the island of Maui.

3. Applicant shall comply with the foregoing requirements within one hundred and twenty (120) days after service of this Decision and Order. Failure to comply within the time specified may constitute cause for this commission to vacate this Decision and Order.


4. Applicant shall not commence operations on the island of Maui until it has received written confirmation from the commission that all requirements have been met.


