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DECISION AND ORDER

By this Decision and Order, the commission authorizes KRYSTAL ENTERPRISE LIMOUSINE, INC. ("Applicant") to extend its authority under certificate of public convenience and necessity number 480-C ("Certificate No. 480-C") by removing the "limited to limousines" restriction in the 8-to-25 passenger classification on the island of Oahu.

I.

Application to Extend Common Carrier Authority

Applicant is a common carrier of passengers by motor vehicle over irregular routes on the island of Oahu in the (1) 1-to-7 passenger classification, and (2) 8-to-25 passenger classification, limited to limousines. By application filed on July 17, 2009, and amended on July 20, 2009, Applicant seeks commission approval to extend its authority under Certificate No. 480-C by removing the "limited to limousines" restriction in the 8-to-25 passenger classification.

Applicant served copies of the application on the Hawaii Transportation Association and the Hawaii State Certified Common Carriers Association, Inc., which consist of carriers that may be affected by Applicant's proposed service, and on the Division of Consumer Advocacy, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Consumer Advocate"). The Consumer Advocate did not participate in this proceeding, and no persons moved to intervene in this docket.

## II.

### Findings and Conclusions

Based upon our review of the record, the commission finds that Applicant is fit, willing, and able to properly perform the proposed service, and to conform to Hawaii Revised Statutes Chapter 271 and the requirements and rules of the commission. The commission also finds that the proposed service is required by the present and future public convenience and necessity. Accordingly, the commission concludes that Applicant's request for an extension of its authority should be granted.

## III.

### Orders


THE COMMISSION ORDERS:


Applicant is authorized to operate as a common carrier of passengers by motor vehicle over irregular routes on the

island of Oahu in the 1-to-7 and 8-to-25 passenger classifications.




