Matters:**

Chairperson Lau called for a recess from the Board's meeting at 8:39 a.m. to discuss and deliberate on the following adjudicatory matters pursuant to HRS chapter 91.

1. Settlement Agreements

- a. In the Matter of the Contractors Licenses of City Life Builders Inc. and IT Construction LLC; and Intae Kim; CLB 2011-264-L

RICO received information that Intae Kim and City Life Builders, Inc. ("Respondents") did not disclose civil judgments against them on their licensing applications, and to date, the judgments have not been satisfied. RICO alleges, therefore, that Respondents failed to maintain a history of trustworthiness or financial integrity, did not notify the Board of the judgments, and answered questions on the license applications incorrectly by not disclosing the pending lawsuits or outstanding judgments.

The Board discussed the settlement agreement in which Respondents, who do not admit to violating any law or rule, agree to the revocation of their licenses.

6. Scope of Activity Committee:

SunEdison

SunEdison requests determination on the license required to perform the operation and maintenance of solar photovoltaic installations on rooftops, carports, and ground mounts.

Recommendation: The C-60 Solar power systems license is required to perform the work described above. However, any non-low voltage electrical work, including grounding and bonding, must be subcontracted to a C-13 Electrical contractor.

Artelisy, LLP

Artelisy, LLP requests determination on the license required to provide maintenance services to customers with existing alarm systems, including service and repair of malfunctioning systems. System components typically involve the keypad and control panel mounted to the structure, cables running to and from endpoint devices such as door contacts, smoke detectors, motion detectors, sirens, and camera systems. Other components include computer systems that consist of workstations, Cat5 cables, network devices, and antenna and coax systems.

Recommendation: The C-15 Electronic systems or C-15a Fire and burglar alarm contractor license is required to perform the work described above.

The agenda continued with the rest of the Committee Reports.

1. Examination Committee:
Guy Akasaki, Chairperson

The Examination Summary report for February 2013 was distributed in the Board's packet.

3. Legislation Committee:
Peter Lee, Chairperson

Mr. Lee summarized the bills affecting the Board's Chapter 444 and the Board's recommendations as follows:

H.B. No. 846, H.D. 2/S.B. No. 1077, S.D. 2, H.D. 1 – This bill restricts owner-builders to residential and farm structures and clarifies the owner-builder responsibilities. The Board supported the intent of this bill.

S.B. No. 512, S.D. 1 – This bill exempts qualified out-of-state persons retained by a public utility from the electrician licensing requirements. The Board opposed this bill as the intent is not clear. HECO, the Board, and the Board of Electricians and Plumbers are working on the language for clarification that the contractor has to be licensed and the employees performing the electrical work are qualified by the public utility to perform high voltage electrical work.

S.B. No. 1293, S.D. 1 – This bill requires applicants for the C-13 Electrical, C-15 Electronic systems, C-62 Pole and line, and C-63 High voltage electrical classifications to have an electrician's license. The Board opposed this bill, as it will close the door for otherwise qualified individuals to be licensed.

Peter Akamu of IBEW Local 1260 testified that based on Ryan Takahashi's testimony at the last meeting, it was fair to say that there are flaws in the current situation because there is a lot of unlicensed activity going on. Because of this unlicensed activity, he felt the Board should come up with some language to make this bill acceptable to all concerned. He stated that Mr. Takahashi had said that 12% of electrical contractor sole proprietor licensees did not carry workers' compensation insurance, and that the Board should address this. His personal opinion and suggestion is that the Board could issue a conditional license where the electrical contractor's licensee should show within three months of issuance of the license that they have hired someone with a trade license.

The Board discussed the fact that unlicensed activity should be reported to RICO and electrical work performed by trades people is covered under the Board of Electricians and Plumbers' law and rules. Deputy Attorney General Tam stated that the only issue with the bill is if the electrical contractor will be required to have a journey worker electrician's license first.

S.B. No. 1301, S.D. 1 – This bill requires the licensure of journey worker air conditioning and refrigeration plumbers and journey worker fire sprinkler plumbers. This bill was deferred by the House.

Senate Resolution No. 50 was distributed to the Board which requests the Board to prepare a report evaluating each automatic specialty classification issued to “A” General Engineering and “B” General Building contractors. The original bill (S.B. No. 347) stated that the “A” and “B” contractor applicants would need to take separate exams and pay separate fees for each specialty classification that automatically came with the “A” and “B”. It was pointed out that the “C” specialty licensees felt that the “A” or “B” contractors do not have the proper knowledge or skill to perform some of the automatic specialties.

The Board felt they would not take a position on this Resolution and questioned its purpose. It was noted that applicants for these licenses must verify four years of supervisory experience and are tested in these areas.

4. Rules Committee:

Mervyn Lee, attorney, on behalf of his client, requested the Board’s opinion on whether the RME and “employees” of a contracting entity may have their wages paid by another (non-contracting) company owned by the RME. Would this be considered unlicensed activity?

After discussion, the Board felt they needed more information in order to make a determination, such as clarification on whether the distribution company is holding itself out as an air conditioning company, confirmation on whether the distribution company issues the W-2 forms to the workers, and whether the distribution company directs and supervises the workers or solely acts as a payroll administrator.

Executive Officer Oda also distributed the Board’s scope guidelines before the Okada Trucking case, and the minutes outlining the Board’s scope interpretation after the Okada Trucking case, which the Board discussed at the January meeting.
