Call to Order: The Chair Pro Tem called the meeting to order at 8:35 a.m. at which time quorum was

established.

The Chair Pro Tem asked the audience to introduce themselves.

The DAG arrived 8:45 a.m.

Executive Officer's Report:

Conferences/Seminars/Meetings

<u>2013 NCSBN Discipline Case Management Conference – Report from Diane Corn, RICO Staff Attorny</u>

Diane Corn reported on her attendance at the 2013 NCSBN Discipline Case Management Conference.

Ms. Corn distributed a copy of her presentation to the Board members for their review.

Ms. Corn thanked the Board and the EO for giving her the opportunity to attend the conference. Ms. Corn stated the conference was invaluable. She has been doing these cases for at least 15 years and stated as the Board knows, there are so many nurses that are traveling so that means dealing with a lot of different jurisdictions. Ms. Corn stated she was able to meet attorneys and executive officers from various boards and contacts and get the feel for what the entire country is dealing with in terms of the issues before the various boards. Ms. Corn stated primarily the conference was regarding discipline, and one the most helpful presentations was by Kathy Gallagher who is the section chief, liaison and policy section of the Office of Diversion Control with the DEA. Ms. Corn stated the theme of the conference was "Anchoring your Case with Strategy". Much of the focus was on collaboration with healthcare facilities regarding the roles of boards of nursing in disciplinary matters, improving consistency in discipline cases, focusing on important regulatory cases relative to administrative law and applying strategies useful in investigating diversion and substance use disorder cases. Ms. Corn stated that Hawaii ranks 50th in the nation in reporting hospital/clinic thefts. That does not mean that Hawaii has less cases, it just means that we are last in reporting. Hospitals and clinics are required to report theft or significant loss to the DEA, but significant loss is not defined. A lot of it has to do with hydrocodone being the number 1 most abused drug in the nation and it's available to staff at hospitals. Some potential signs of diversion are the "bait and switch", which is an employee who specifically asked to be assigned to patients receiving narcotics or offers to switch patients with peers. Additional signs of diversion are shortages on the PYXIS reports and failing to document wastage or waste entire vials of drugs. A lot of discussion was also on prevention of theft. The focus of prevention was on education, to require everyone to be familiar with the laws. Everyone has to work together. The hospitals have to create the right environment, they need to listen when there is a problem and encourage open communication.

Ms. Corn thanked the Board for their time.

<u>2013 NCSBN Annual Meeting – Report from Ms. Stone Murai and Mr. Hoban Mr. Hoban reported on his attendance at the 2013 NCSBN Annual Meeting.</u>

Mr. Hoban stated he was very impressed with the meeting. The meeting was well run, probably the best one he has ever attended. There were no major issues to vote on, only procedural items. Mr. Hoban stated it was good to meet with other members of boards of

nursing and see how different the boards are from state to state. As an example, the state of Georgia meets for 3 days every quarter. The LPN positions are almost impossible to fill across the state boards. A lot of boards are also having a difficult time filling the consumer advocate position so they will have an RN fill the consumer advocate position. In general, the whole thrust of the conference was celebrating the fact that the NCSBN has been around for 35 years now. Mr. Hoban stated NCSBN gave a great historical perspective of how it started, how it built up, how it split out and became what it is today.

The EO stated she received an agreement from Kathy Apple for all state boards to sign, and asked Mr. Hoban if he knew why that was voted on during the conference.

Mr. Hoban stated he is not sure what the EO is referring to.

The EO asked what they voted on at the conference.

Mr. Hoban stated they voted on appointments of positions to the national board.

The EO stated she did not bring a copy, but it's an agreement between the boards and NCSBN promising to do things. The DAG will be reviewing it.

Mr. Hoban stated he does not recall anything that required an agreement; he would need to see the document to respond.

Ms. Elvenia stated it would show on their website what came up for vote at the conference and how it carried out.

The EO stated she will get the information to the Board as soon as possible.

2013 NCLEX Conference, September 9, 2013

Dr. Cohen will be attending.

<u>2013 NCSBN Leadership and Public Policy Conference, September 17-19, 2013</u> Dr. Fleming will be attending.

Report on APRN Prescriptive Authority for Controlled Substances

The EO reported at the Board's last meeting she reported there were some problems with the Narcotics Enforcement Division and DEA not recognizing our APRN's with prescriptive authority. The APRN's were not able to get their NED and DEA registrations to prescribe controlled substances. Because the rules were amended, it is no longer required that the licensees submit a copy of their NED, DEA or oral code to us in order to approve them to prescribe controlled substances. Now when an APRN has prescriptive authority, it is prescriptive authority across the board period. It is up to the APRN as an individual practitioner to comply with other state or federal regulations just like a physician would. The EO stated the NED and DEA are saying they need Board approval to prescribe controlled substances before they will register them. The EO wrote a letter to the NED and DEA so they can continue processing all the applications they were holding up. So now both the NED and DEA started processing the applications. Administratively there are two kinds of special privileges under an APRN. One is an APRN with prescriptive

authority; the other special privilege is an APRN with prescriptive authority for controlled substances and non-controlled substances, which means these individuals provided a copy of their NED and DEA registration, which is no longer required, so that we can update their record, so that a pharmacist or anyone else wanting to see their prescriptive authority they can do so. The EO stated a letter will be going out to all those who have prescriptive authority saying if they are prescribing controlled substances and they want to submit their DEA and NED registration, they can and we will show that on their special privilege. Also, the EO reported those APRN's with prescriptive authority who did not submit their CEU's will be sent a letter stating effective October 16, 2013 there will be no indication of them having prescriptive authority. The EO stated there will probably be some confusion for the pharmacist, so a letter will be sent to the pharmacies as well.

Office of Information Practices

Who Board Members Can Talk to and When (Part 1)

The EO reported that OIP is often asked whether board members can talk to the board's staff, members of the public, or one another in various situations when not in a meeting. To help board members understand what they can talk about outside a meeting, and with whom, OIP has put together a three-part quick review. Part 1 was provided to the Board members for their information.

Who Board Members Can Talk to and When (Part 2)

The EO reported, what constitutes board business was discussed in Part 1. There are, however, a number of exceptions and "permitted interactions" that allow board members to have discussions outside of a meeting, even on matters that constitute board business. A few of these exceptions and permitted interactions are described in Part 2. Part 2 was provided to the Board members for their information.

Who Board Members Can Talk to and When (Part 3)

The EO reported Boards subject to the Sunshine Law, Part 1 of Chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), are generally required to conduct all business in open meetings that have been properly noticed to allow for public participation. This quick review discusses an exception to the open meeting requirement for "permitted interaction groups" or "PIGs", as set forth in section 92-2.5, HRS. While other types of permitted interactions were previously discussed in Part 2 of this quick review series, this article explains how members of a board may form a PIG to investigate or to negotiate a matter. Part 3 was provided to the Board members for their information.

Hawaii State Center for Nursing

Adoption of the NCSBN Model and Act

The EO reported this discussion was deferred from the last Board meeting, asking if the Board would consider adopting the NCSBN Model and Act. This would allow the Board to participate in all kinds of programs under the NCSBN Model and Act, including criminal background checks and NURSYS.

The Chair Pro Tem asked, what the advantage is in having the APRN recognition become an APRN license.

The EO stated they wanted the Board to adopt the APRN consensus model and change APRN recognition to APRN license.

Dr. Cohen stated it was just for consistency.

The Chair Pro Tem stated part of this is just standardized so that when people throughout the country see a nurse they have a sense, but until we standardize our education and requirements, this is not going to do anything.

The EO stated if her understanding of NURSYS is correct, they do background checks with all the national databases. The EO stated when they first came to the Board a few years ago, they were saying that Hawaii should participate in NURSYS that it would make it easier, all the states would benefit, etc. Hawaii had a difficult time sharing information with NURSYS so that we could participate.

After further discussion, upon a motion by the Chair Pro Tem, seconded by Dr. Cohen, it was voted on and unanimously carried to inform the HSCFN that the Board will look at individual sections and adopt them as long as they are in the best interest of the nurses of the state of Hawaii.

Criminal Background Checks

The EO asked the Board how they felt about doing criminal background checks.

The Chair Pro Tem stated we should wait and see what NCLEX's decision is, because that's going to cost money.

Mr. Hoban stated in the past the Board has said that criminal background checks are the responsibility of the employer. If they require it, they can do it or have the potential employee pay for it.

Dr. Cohen stated currently at state hospitals they are all requiring criminal background checks and the students have to pay for their own.

The Chair Pro Tem stated that private hospitals do their own as well and unfortunately what may happen is they would not necessarily accept this one.

The EO stated it would only be for licensure.

The Chair Pro Tem stated the reality is if you are an APRN practicing without malpractice insurance you are a fool, and if you are practicing with malpractice insurance they are going to evaluate your criminal background.

The EO stated right now there is no evidence that this is necessary for licensure because employees and individual APRN's would be required to get a criminal background check from their employer or from their malpractice insurance.

The Chair Pro Tem stated it would incur added expense to the license without additional value and unless you're going to do it every renewal it's meaningless.

NURSYS

The EO asked the Board if the HSCFN submits legislation to amend your law to allow you to participate in NURSYS, how would you feel about that.

Mr. Hoban stated it would not change anything. It would allow us to, but not require us to.

The EO asked if the Board would support it or not.

Mr. Hoban stated we participate now in NURSYS.

Ms. Elvenia stated not fully.

The EO stated we only input disciplinary action in case that nurse is disciplined in Hawaii and licensed anywhere else they would get alerted. They want all of our information on all of our nurses so that they have one big database.

The Chair Pro Tem stated if we're going to do that we should ask the nurses if they have an issue with our doing that.

The EO stated the Board has been an advocate of the position that we don't want to provide confidential information to NURSYS.

Dr. Cohen stated if it comes up before the legislative session then we should discuss it.

The EO stated right now she is hearing that the Board has concerns with protecting the privacy of the nurses.

The Chair Pro Tem stated that we are clearly protecting the public by reporting infractions to NURSYS so it's not as if we are not cooperating with the process.

Executive Session:

At 9:15 a.m. upon a motion by Ms. Elvenia, seconded by Dr. Cohen it was voted on and unanimously carried to move into Executive Session in accordance with HRS, 92-5(a) (1) and (4), "To consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or vocational licenses cited in section 26-9 or both;" and "To consult with the board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities".

At 9:45 a.m. upon a motion by Dr. Cohen, seconded by Mr. Joslyn, it was voted on and unanimously carried to move out of executive session.

The Chair Pro Tem called for a recess from the meeting at 9:45 a.m. to discuss and deliberate on the following adjudicatory matter(s) pursuant to Chapter 91, HRS

In the Matter of the License to Practice Nursing of Gail D. Benjamin, aka Gail B. Kagawa; RNS 2009-25-L, Compliance with Board's Final Order

Upon a motion by Dr. Cohen, seconded by Mr. Hoban it was voted on and unanimously carried to send a letter to respondent reminding her of the September 6, 2013 deadline.

Following the Board's review, deliberation, and decisions in these matters, pursuant to Chapter 92, HRS, the Chair announced that the Board would reconvene to its scheduled open meeting at 10:02 a.m.

The following agenda item was moved as the next order of business:

Executive Officer's Report:

Board Recognition of Code of Ethics

The Board discussed adopting the American Nurses Association Code of Ethics for Nurses.

The EO stated this is based on a testimony at a contested case hearing. One of the citations for denial of the license was "Standards Contrary to Ethics". The EO asked the Board if there is any other code of ethics because the NCSBN Model Act does not have one.

Dr. Cohen stated every school she has ever taught at or taken a course at, this is the code of ethics.

The Chair Pro Tem stated rather then adopting it as the Boards code, we acknowledge it as the standard for the code of ethics.

The DAG stated you would be recognizing these ANA standards of ethics for the license profession of nursing for the purposes of 436B(19)(9).

Upon a motion by Mr. Joslyn, seconded by the Dr. Cohen, it was voted on and unanimously carried to recognize the ANA Code of Ethics for Nurses.

Correspondence:

Facility reporting of diversion or other violations by a nurse

The Board discussed an email inquiry asking, what is the facility's responsibility in reporting to the state any issues on drug diversion.

Dr. Cohen stated she does not think there is anything in the nursing rules and regulations that address this.

The Chair Pro Tem stated this would not be a Board of Nursing issue.

The EO stated if a facility contacts the Board's office and asks if they have to report to the Board a nurse diverting, etc., there is nothing in the laws and rules that state the facility has to report it to the Board. If there is a violation and the facility has enough information and they want to report, it can be referred to RICO they can do an investigation, but there is no requirement. The Board does not have jurisdiction over the facility. The EO asked the Board if there is anything in the laws and rules that require a nurse to self report.

Dr. Cohen stated she believes requiring a nurse to self report would fall under the code of ethics point 3, point 4 and point 5, because diverting drugs affects the health and safety of the patient. However she does not see anything in the laws and rules that say a nurse has to self report.

The EO stated she will encourage them to file a complaint in the interest of consumer protection, but the Board does not require it.

The Chair Pro Tem stated §16-89-59 says nursing behavior which fails to conform to legal standards and accepted standards of the nursing profession and which reflect adversely on the health and welfare of the public shall constitute unprofessional conduct.

After further discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to refer inquiry to §16-89-59.
