2011 Legislation

The EO reported on the following measures:

Act 110, SLH 2011 (HB 484, SD2, CD1) – Relating to Advanced Practice Registered Nurses

The Governor signed the bill into law on June 14, 2011. The practice committee is working on amendments to HAR Chapter 89 to align the rules with the amendments made to the statutes.

HR 48/HCR 55 – Requesting the Development and Implementation (By the Board of Nursing) of a Pain and Palliative Care Policy

The EO is still working on the report to the Legislature.

APRN Task Force – June 8, 2011 Meeting

Ms. Tiwanak from the Hawaii Center for Nursing ("Center") reported that the Center is working with a representative group of APRN's in the community to collectively identify barriers to nursing practice and develop strategies to eliminate them. They also agreed to develop a one page document to be delivered to Hawaii's Congressional delegation by Dale Alison, Center's Chair, and Mark Foreman, Administrator for HMSA Foundation during their trip to Washington D.C. funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation ("RWJF"). RWJF in partnership with AARP hosted a media/communication training workshop for states with action coalitions and those in development. Visits with the Congressional delegation was part of the three day agenda.

2011 NCSBN Annual Meeting

Practice Committee Report:

Ms. Stone Murai reported on the following:

APRN-Rxs Prescribing Controlled Substances

Act 110, SLH 2011

The committee discussed the amendments to HRS 457 as a result of Act 110, SLH 2011.

<u>Joint Formulary Advisory Committee ("JFAC") – Exclusionary Formulary for APRN-Rxs for</u> Controlled Substances

The Committee has advised the EO to convene the JFAC to review the revised exclusionary formulary, which the Board will be reviewing at their August meeting.

Requirements

The Committee discussed the requirements for APRN-Rx to prescribe controlled substances and it is the committee's recommendation to delete the following requirements currently specified in section 16-89-119: a Hawaii Oral Code and registration issued by the Department of Public Safety, Narcotics Enforcement Division and U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency ("DEA") registration. The Committee determined that these items should not be considered "license requirements" by the Board.

Amendments to HAR Chapter 89

The EO will be working on a draft of amendments to HAR Chapter 89 to align the administrative rules with the current statutes.

Next Meeting

The Practice Committee will meet before the Board meeting on August 11, 2011 at 8:30 a.m.

Ms. Cohen moved to accept the Practice Committee's report, it was seconded by the Vice Chair, it was voted on and unanimously carried.

Old Business: Proposed Amendments to HAR Chapter 89

As previously reported, the EO will be working on a draft to align the administrative rules with the recent changes to the statutes.

Center for Nursing, Continuing Education Joint Advisory Committee – Continuing Competency

Public Health Nurses

The Board discussed and reviewed an email inquiry from Evelyn Boiser regarding concerns by Kauai Public Health Nurses ("PHN") over school health aids. The practice concerns the administration of medication by unlicensed assistive personnel in the school after the PHN provides his/her recommendation after performing a consultation/assessment. Ms. Boiser's concern is that "According to the nurse practice act only a licensed professional nurse can delegate the nursing task and all the components of delegating must be in place including training and evaluating the person performing the task. Principals can assign a task but not delegate a nursing task. Since we are no longer the supervisors for the school health aids and our MOU has expired we can no longer delegate this task." Ms. Boiser stated that they are concerned "about their liability by agreeing to do the procedure as it is currently being outlined."

After some discussion, the Board determined that based on the email, it did not appear that a "nurse" was involved in the delegation of certain nursing task to a school health aide, therefore, the nursing laws and rules may not apply. Furthermore, HRS §321-242 (School Health Services Program) was repealed.

Also, it was not clear what kind of "consultation" public health nurses provide so the Board could not further address this issue.

RN's Initiating, Rebolus and Maintain the PCA Pump Following Epidural Placement

The Board discussed and reviewed an email from Rachel Boyette regarding changing the epidurals to PCA pumps and expecting the role of an RN to initiate, rebolus, and maintain the PCA pumps following epidural placement by the anesthesiologist. Ms. Boyette stated that she researched at AWHONN's website for these procedures, which it states that it is outside the scope of practice for RN's.

After some discussion, the Board determined that although the scope of practice of an RN does not specify whether or not the tasks described in the email falls within the scope of practice of an RN, practice as an RN means the full scope of nursing, that incorporates all settings and is guided by the scope of practice authorized by the Board and the National Council of State Board's of Nursing ("NCSBN") Model Nursing Practice Act and Model Nursing Administrative Rules and that the performance of such acts should commensurate with the required education and demonstrated competency of the individual.

In addition, scope of practice established by the Board and the NCSBN shall serve as general guidelines and are not intended to address the appropriateness of the use of specific procedures in any particular work setting or to grant permission to implement specific procedures in any particular work setting.

Midwife Licensing

The Board discussed and reviewed an email inquiry from Mary Ann Edsall regarding midwife licensing.

The Board determined that a nurse-midwife falls under an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse and that "midwives" that are not nurses do not fall under the Board's authority.

The EO stated that she also checked with the State Department of Health and was informed that they no longer register midwives.

Can an LPN Practice IV Therapy, Dialysis or Venipunture?

The Board discussed and reviewed an email inquiry from Misty Cain asking if an LPN's scope of practice includes IV therapy, dialysis, or venipunture and what specific medications can or cannot be administered by an LPN or dialysis procedures.

After some discussion, the Board determined that although the scope of practice of an LPN does not specify whether or not the tasks described in Ms. Cain's email falls within the scope of practice of an LPN, practice as an LPN takes place under the direction of a registered nurse, advanced practice registered nurse, licensed physician or other health care provider authorized by the State and is guided by the scope of practice authorized by the Board and the NCSBN Model Nursing Practice Act and Model Nursing Administrative Rules and that the performance of such acts should commensurate with the required education and demonstrated competency of the individual.

In addition, scope of practice established by the Board and the NCSBN shall serve as general guidelines and are not intended to address the appropriateness of the use of specific procedures in any particular work setting or to grant permission to implement specific procedures in any particular work setting.
