Legislation: a. Act 208 (S.B. No. 2165)

i. <u>Subcommittee Report</u>

Chair Mack informed members that the Subcommittee members met on Wednesday, November 16, 2011 with Ms. Preshess Willets-Vaquilar from Honolulu Community College ("HCC") to discuss the development of the educational component in Act 208. HCC is willing to take on the responsibility of development of the curriculum, training the trainer, and allowing the purchase of the curriculum to enable employers to do in-house training.

The Board was adamant that the initial eight hours and subsequent continuing education training be from the "same manual" to insure standardized training. Because the industry is comprised of different areas (retail, private, banking, government, etc.) the training will differ, thus the Board felt it prudent that the initial training be applicable to all areas.

Ms. Willets-Vaquilar stated that she will inform her superiors of the following suggestions from the subcommittee:

- HCC will develop the curriculum using Professional Security Training Network ("PSTN") modules to sell to the industry or interested employers. Ms.
   Willets-Vaquilar will check with PSTN if they are willing to sell HCC their modules for training as one option; or
- 2. HCC will work with Hawaii and Windward
  Community Colleges and develop its own
  curriculum to sell to the industry to train their
  employees. To keep the cost down and to offer
  other options of delivery, HCC is considering online
  training as a means to address cost, availability,
  and lack of adequate facility space.

The Executive Officer will keep the Board apprised of HCC's progress. This issue was deferred until the next meeting.
