The Executive Secretary reported that there were no subdivision transactions carried over from the previous meeting.

CONDOMINIUMS (Section 170A-1 through 170A-33)

REGISTRATION NO. 5 - 1001 WILDER - The Commission noted the Amendments to the Declaration of Horizontal Property Regime and the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, Restrictions and By-Laws, as transmitted by the Developer's attorney. The Executive Secretary stated that counsel has submitted this material so that the above documents will contain the requirements provided for in the 1963 Amendments to the Condominium Statute.

REGISTRATION NO. 9 - KAUAIAN HYATT HOUSE - The Executive Secretary reported on the Developer's recent request that the Commission issue a Final Amended Supplementary Report on this project. The members noted that revisions to the Contract of Purchase have been submitted and that the architects and engineers have completed all final, detailed building plans and specifications. The Executive Secretary was instructed to proceed with the appropriate and final report on the development which is nearing completion of construction and impending occupancy as a part of the national system, Hyatt House Corporation of America.

In the matter of the Merry Go Round Realty, Ltd., the Executive illustrated two actions where the applicant prematurely held that they were licensed to conduct operations as a real estate broker. In the first case, it was reported to the Commission that James S. Singleton, licensed salesman, sought the loan of a key to a house which was listed with another firm and in doing so, identified himself

as an employee of Merry Go Round Realty, Ltd., which at that time had not submitted the required documents as part of the application process. The second illustration was Mrs. Cay Singleton, displaying on her mobile merry-go-round truck apparatus, the name of the firm which they were making application for. The Commission instructed the Executive Secretary to admonish the principal broker, Mr. Harry K. Lee, in writing to the effect that such demonstrated misconduct will not be tolerated.

#### SUBDIVISIONS

UPON MOTION, the Commission accepted as completed the registration on the following projects:

SIERRA VIEW - Wilhelmina Rise, Kaimuki, City and County of Honolulu, Hawaii; 35 lots; developer--Metropolitan Builders, Inc. (Mark K. Vera Cruz, President); selling broker--Creative Realty (dba Charles A. Gulick, 315 Royal Hawaiian Avenue, Room 202, Honolulu).

Motion carried unanimously.

COLORADO CITY - Colorado City, (nearest municipality: Rye), County of Pueblo, Colorado; 2,067 lots in Units 1, 2 and 3; developer--Colorado City Development Company (Executive Office--6363 Sunset Blvd., Los Angeles, Vice President--Max D. Gould); selling agent--Walter N. Clark.

The members studied the information submitted in the Subdivision Registration Statement noting particularly the Required Document section where the registrant stated that he has received final approval from the county or city and county agency charged with the granting of final approval. The Acting Chairman directed the members' attention to a letter forwarded by Predovich and Ward, Pueblo attorneys for Colorado City Development Company in Which he refers to the requirement of having received final approval from the County of Pueblo. The commissioners discussed counsel's point that the County does not exercise overall authority on improvements nor does it grant final approval. Reference was made to the statement in the attorney's June 20, 1964 letter that roads and streets, water supply and sanitation are under the jurisdiction of appropriate county agencies. The additional statement was made by counsel that a portion of the total network of improved roads has been installed in consultation and with approval of the County Road Commissioner. Further, the road statement points up the condition that upon completion of road and street improvements, they will be submitted for inspection and approval to the County Road Commissioner. The Acting Chairman's position on the registration was that not being able to qualify under the final approval sub-paragraph, the Developer should have considered the alternates of establishment of a neutral escrow depository for purchasers' funds or the completion of all improvements required by the agency giving the final approval. The question of the Developer posting a bond sufficient to cover the cost of putting in all of the improvements as is required by the agency giving final approval was also discussed.

UPON MOTION, it was ruled that the registration of Colorado City Subdivision is to be set aside and the Executive Secretary will seek clarification on the points considered.

Motion carried unanimously.

CHRISTMAS VALLEY SUBDIVISION - Bend County of Lake, Oregon; 2,577 lots; developer--Pean Phillips Lands, Inc. (Carlo P. Giutini, President); selling agent--Pahlas Antoku, (250 Kuupua, Kailua, City and County of Honolulu).

UPON MOTION, the Commission accepted the registration on the above project contingent on the Executive Secretary to make the routine cross-checks and verifications with real estate officials in Oregon and California.

Motion carried unanimously.

#### CONDOMINIUMS

The Executive Secretary reported that Notices of Intention on behalf of the following horizontal property regimes had been received.

# Miscellaneous:

SUBDIVISION REGISTRATION STATEMENT - The Executive Secretary reported that an effort was being made to put advance copies of RECO FORM 27 (Revised May 1964) on the agenda of the meeting, but no report has been received from the firm processing the multilith reproducing plates. He noted that this project should be finalized shortly and the revised document made available to subdividers.

# INCREASE IN FEES - ACT 32 (S.B. 275)

The Commission was informed that the procedures under which the new fee schedule will become operative are presently under study by the Attorney General. At a future date, there should be an announcement setting forth a uniform policy for incorporating the increase in fees into boards and commissions programs.

RELOCATION OF COMMISSION OFFICE - Instructions have been published on the relocation of the Department to 424 South Beretania Street, which is referred to as the former Paradise of the Pacific Building. The Professional and Vocational Licensing Division is prepared to relocate on Wednesday, July 22, 1964.

# Investigations:

RE#118 - BEACHWALK DEVELOPMENT, INC.

The members, having received the Investigation Report of June 25, 1964, discussed the possible action the Commission could take against the respondents Clarence J. Hamaishi and Masaru Kaneshiro. Both are reported to be living out of the state. The Executive Secretary

is to research the problem of proceeding against a licensee "in absentia" and he is to check with Deputy Attorney George Siu for a clarification on whether we can give appropriate notice to a real estate licensee who may be outside this state.

# RE#112 - LINO E. JUAN, BROKER

With the June 18, 1964 Investigation Report in hand, the members reviewed the actions of all parties involved. It was the consensus of opinion that this appeared to be an internal or family controversy and that differences had been resolved.

# RE#115 - WALTER N. CLARK, BROKER

The respondent broker's position in the June 23, 1964 Investigation Report was reviewed. The members were interested in the payment of \$25.00 which is made to persons performing the function of a "finder." The Commission suggested that the Investigator discuss with the respondent, Mr. Clark, how the \$25.00 credit bonus arrangement is worked out. The members believed that a determination should be made as to who originates the bonus and if there is an agreement in writing between the subdivider and the selling agent.

# RE#120 - VIRGINIA S. BROOKS

With the June 30, 1964 Investigation Report having been distributed the Commissioners, conclusion was that on the face of the report, not sufficient facts are shown to warrant action by the Commission. It was suggested that the remedy the complainant should seek is through the courts.
