REPORT TO THE TWENTY-FIFTH HAWAII STATE LEGISLATURE 2010

IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF ACT 162, PART 7, SECTION 158 SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII (SLH) 2009 AND SECTION 346-51.5 HAWAII REVISED STATUTES

REPORT ON ACT 162, PART 7, SECTION 158, RELATING TO THE STATE BUDGET, SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII 2009 AND SECTION 346-51.5 HAWAII REVISED STATUTES

ACT 162, PART 7, SECTION 158, SLH 2009, requires the Department of Human Services (DHS) to prepare a report on the TANF program that includes: 1) outcomes and measures of effectiveness with regards to the TANF program; 2) work participation rates for two-parent families and all families in the TANF program; and 3) a listing of all contracts funded by the TANF program and how these contracts will help the State's TANF program fulfill Federal requirements.

Section 346-51.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 1) requires the Department of Human Services to submit a plan for expenditure of TANF funds to include: a) details how the funds received under TANF shall be expended; and b) descriptions of the desired outcomes from the expenditure of the funds; and 2) requires reports: a) about the continuing strategic planning process, with the assistance of the FAAC, regarding the future use of TANF funds and setting annual goals and outcomes for existing and new programs receiving TANF; b) on the effectiveness and level of success in reaching the desired outcomes from the previous two fiscal years using TANF funds; and c) on any funds received and expended supplemental to the TANF block grant, the purposes for which the funds were expended; and outcomes achieved.

TANF Outcomes and Measures of Effectiveness

The outcomes for the TANF program, as reflected in the State Budget, are as follows:

Measures of Effectiveness:

- Potentially eligible households receiving TANF assistance: FY 2009 Planned = 47% FY2010 Planned = 47%

Success in Meeting Desired Outcomes and Work Participation Rates

This section calls for a report on the effectiveness and level of success in reaching the desired outcomes under the Strategic Plan over the past two fiscal years.

The mandatory work participation requirement to be met for the subject Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2009 is 50% of all mandatory adults adjusted by the State's earned caseload reduction credit. Hawaii's caseload reduction credit for FFY 2009 is estimated to be 41.6%. The adjusted work participation requirement to be met is 8.4% (50%-41.6% = 8.4%). Hawaii exceeded the required participation, 35.8% compared to 8.4%.

The percentage of TANF recipients in work programs exiting due to employment fell below our planned outcome level. We believe that this outcome is due to the success that we have been having with our new "Up-Front Universal Engagement (UFUE)" program (aka "Grant Diversion" program). UFUE is successfully diverting new applicants to TANF into the job market, instead of welfare, within the first four months of their applications. As a result, those who need more than four months of assistance, job readiness and job placement are transferred to our First-To-Work units, resulting in "harder to serve" clients who require more protracted help from us to exit welfare through employment. However, we will retain our planned ambitious outcome goal in this coming year and are encouraged that our overall federal work participation rate has continued to incrementally improve.

Following the TANF Five-Year Strategic Plan, DHS uses its TANF annual block grant to both provide TANF benefits for needy families and to fund poverty prevention contracts with a wide variety of community-based social service agencies statewide.

To determine the effectiveness of these initiatives, DHS commissioned a study by The Lewin Group, a nationally respected human services consulting firm. These experts determined that our TANF-funded anti-poverty community-based programs use research-based approaches proven to reduce teen pregnancies, improve school performance and completion rates, discourage drug and alcohol abuse, build character, develop life skills and promote work preparedness. The following are some of the welfare-to-work initiatives implemented by the Department:

SEE Hawai`i Work (Supporting Employment Empowerment)

SEE Hawai`i Work (Supporting Employment Empowerment) gives generous wage subsidies to a wide variety of companies to hire welfare clients and train them on the job, where they learn valuable work skills. Most of the SEE clients are eventually hired by the companies that trained them or obtain employment with other businesses. Prior to SEE, most of these companies had not hired from the welfare rolls.

This business-friendly program is a win-win-win for welfare clients, employers and State taxpayers because SEE:

- Transforms lives by helping welfare moms and dads break multigenerational cycles of poverty, find rewarding jobs in the private sector and stay engaged in gainful employment;
- Stimulates the economy by helping companies meet their labor demands with minimal cost and effort; and
- Saves taxpayer dollars by reducing our welfare rolls.

As of December 31, 2009, 1,983 welfare recipients have participated in SEE, of which 363 are in active SEE placements. Of the 921 SEE participants who have successfully completed their SEE assignments, 783 (85%) have already transitioned into unsubsidized employment – many of them for the first time in their life – and have exited TANF.

As of December 31, 2009, 912 employers have submitted at least one job order and 520 of those employers hiring a SEE participant to fill a position listed on the job order. Currently, 141 employers have job openings for welfare recipients to fill over 335 available positions at their companies.

<u>Up-Front Universal Engagement (UFUE)</u>

To divert clients away from welfare and into the workforce, DHS in 2005 launched Up- Front Universal Engagement (UFUE). This program connects people with the job market at the time they apply for government assistance. From July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009, about 8,941 households applied for government assistance and were referred to the UFUE program.

Of these 8,941 households, 5,468 (61.2%) were diverted away from the TANF program and into the job market.

Reward Work

In 2006 DHS began offering new financial incentives that encourage clients to seek and maintain employment. This "Reward Work" initiative allows welfare recipients who are participating in employment activities to keep 100% of their monthly cash assistance while they work during the first two years on welfare. Previously, welfare checks were reduced when clients began working, which was a disincentive to employment. In addition, Reward Work provides two months of rent payments to help clients stabilize their housing.

Since its inception, 22,426 employed welfare, and former welfare, recipients have received work incentive subsidies and/or these Reward Work payments along with their employment wages.

Development of Strategic Plan

Beginning in January 2006, the Department of Human Services (DHS), in partnership with Blueprint for Change, embarked on a statewide community-based process to develop a Five-Year TANF Strategic Plan to ensure that Hawaii makes the most effective use of TANF resources in meeting the four purposes of TANF and, thereby, contributing to the reduction of poverty in Hawaii. From January to August 2006, seven community-based workshops were held to assist in the development of the Plan. Specifically, workshops were held on Oahu, Maui, Kauai, and in Kona and Hilo. The objectives and activities necessary to address the commonly expressed needs from these workshops were delineated in the Plan. The draft Five-Year TANF Strategic Plan was circulated to workshop participants statewide for their review and comment.

On July 10, 2007, the Department of Human Services completed the Five-Year TANF Strategic Plan to ensure that Hawaii makes the most effective use of TANF resources in meeting the four purposes of TANF and, thereby, contributing to the reduction of family poverty in Hawaii.

On September 6, 2007, the DHS sponsored a presentation luncheon at the Honolulu Country Club to present the Five-Year TANF Strategic Plan to community organizations, which included non-profit and for-profit organizations and State and County agencies statewide, who are current partners with the Department, as well as all other organizations who have indicated interest in partnering with the Department.

Supplemental Funding Received

On June 1, 2009, Hawaii received additional TANF funding through applying, and subsequently receiving approval for, the DRA TANF Contingency Funds under the federal 2005 Deficit Reduction Act (DRA). These funds are separate from the TANF Emergency Contingency Funds that were made available through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2008.

The DRA TANF Contingency Funds is a set-aside fund to States that encounter unexpected economic downturn. A State must meet the definition of a "needy State" to apply for and receive Contingency Funds. There are two ways for a State to qualify as a needy State, one based on its unemployment rate and the other based on increases in its Food Stamp caseload. A State may receive Contingency Funds if it meets either trigger. Hawaii qualified under the Unemployment trigger. Under this trigger, the State's unemployment rate (seasonally adjusted) for the most recent 3-month period for which data for all States are published is at least 6.5 percent and at least 110 percent of the average rate (seasonally adjusted) for the corresponding 3-month period in either of the two preceding calendar years.

Once a State becomes a needy State for a month during a federal fiscal year, and requests to receive Contingency Funds, the State is eligible to receive a provisional payment of Contingency Funds for two consecutive months. For each month of the fiscal year that a State is eligible for Contingency Funds, the State may receive up to 1/12th of 20 percent of its annual State Family Assistance Grant (SFAG) applicable for that fiscal year. The total amount payable to all qualifying States during a federal fiscal year will not exceed the amount appropriated by the federal government for this purpose. Contingency Funds to each eligible State that requests them will be provided for, in the order in which States request the funding, until the available appropriated funds are exhausted.

Hawaii received a total of 11,538,892.00 for the period 6/1/09 - 9/30/09. A condition of this funding is that it must be expended by the end of the federal fiscal year in which it is received, so as this funding was received in federal fiscal year 2009, it needed to be expended by the end of the fiscal year, or 9/30/09. Expenditures with this funding were used to cover overages in pre-existing planned program areas, which included client benefits. The following are the detailed expenditure items:
