**Testimony of Michael Bailie**

1. This testimony is provided in support of Surface Water Use Permit Application ("SWUPA") No 2348, filed with the Commission on Water Resource Management on April 28, 2009, for Tax Map Key ("TMK") 3-2-16-004 consisting of 5.2 acres situated in Wailuku, Maui, Hawaii. I have owned the Wailuku parcel since 2000 which I purchased from Wailuku Agribusiness Co. My existing water use is irrigates landscape, bamboo and macadamia nuts.
2. **Amount Requested Under Permit**
3. I seek a permit to use water from the Wailuku Water Company system Spreckles Ditch and Reservoir 25 thru a closed pipe system.
4. The Applicant has SWUPA 2348 on file with the Commission, application, the primary usage of the surface water is for household landscape irrigation. For the period of May 2007 to April 2008 (mandated 1 year reporting period under the designation) the sum average metered daily use for the month was 1840 gallons per day. I am asking for 1840 gallons per day (gpd) average (based on 365 days a year) for my existing use application, the primary usage of the surface water is for irrigation of landscape, bamboo and macadamia nuts.

**Reasonable-Beneficial Analysis**

5. My existing use is "reasonable-beneficial," defined as: "the use of water in such a quantity as is necessary for economic and efficient utilization, for a purpose, and in a manner which is both reasonable and consistent with the state and county land use plans and public interest." HRS 174C-3

Summary

In summary my water use is an existing use and I request a permit for my reasonable-beneficial use on the property of 1840 gpd for SWUPA 2348
