Aloha e Chair Chang, Deputy Director Manuel and Board Members,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony in support for the Approval of State of Hawai'i, Department of Land and Natural Resources, Division of Aquatic Resources Application for a Well Construction Permit for Kalauha'iha'i Restoration Well (Well No. 3-1643-002), TMK (1) 3-7-011:003.

Maunalua Fishpond Heritage Center (MFHC) is in strong support of this State and community collaborative effort to restore water flow to Kalauha'iha'i Fishpond. The traditional flow was cut off during the 1990's widening of Kalanianaole Highway. This project offers an innovative model for repairing our water systems. It has the potential to offer a long-awaited path forward for communities that find their water systems in disrepair across Hawai'i.

The lifeline of our 'aina depends on how well we protect the flow of wai, fresh water. The catastrophic loss of fresh water here from the 1990's State widening project has had a lasting detrimental impact on the health of our natural and cultural resources. Our community has been working for many decades to return the wai to Kalauha'iha'i. This is vital to a healthy ecosystem and thriving Hawaiian culture. We fully support the necessary project authorizations to restore the wai.
