Re: Agenda Item C.3. – Update Regarding the Development of a First-Generation Keauhou Aquifer System Area Groundwater Adaptive Management Plan, Keauhou Aquifer System Area, Island of Hawai'i

Aloha Chairperson Chang and Members of the Commission,

On behalf of the Department of Water Supply, County of Hawai'i (HDWS), we support the efforts of Deputy Director, Ms. Ciara Kahahane and Commission on Water Resource Management (CWRM) staff to develop an adaptive management plan for the Keauhou aquifer system area. This approach appears to be a pragmatic effort to seek and utilize input and information to establish monitoring procedures to allow for fact-based decision making. As a key stakeholder in this aquifer, HDWS has been, and will continue to, participate and provide input where appropriate. We have attended some of the expert group meetings as observers and found the discussions to be robust and productive.

During the last two meetings of this Commission, mention has been made to consider the designation of the Keauhou Aquifer as a Ground Water Management Area ("GWMA"). As you may recall this Commission took up the designation of the Keauhou Aquifer as a GWMA as recently as 2017. The Commission ultimately did not find sufficient basis to warrant the designation of the Keauhou Aquifer. At that time the highest 12 month moving average (MAV) pumpage was approximately 15.3 million gallons per day (MGD) as of January 2013, which is below 40% of the sustainable yield of 38 MGD. Since then, the highest 12 MAV was approximately 15.0 MGD in November 2016. Most recent 12 MAV, as of July 2025, is approximately 14.1 MG. This shows that pumping has remained flat or slightly declined over the past 12 years. HDWS has concerns that a topic as significant as designation of the Keauhou aquifer as a GWMA, has been discussed without being on the agenda to allow for public input. The nature of this discussion is premature and without basis. We respectfully request that if this matter is considered by the Commission that it be open to further discussion and public input.

HDWS is working to develop two new wells, Wai'aha Well B, and a North Kona Mid-Elevation well, in the Keauhou aquifer. The intent of these two wells is to recover lost capacity when well capacity was reduced during recent repairs, as well as to reduce pumping from HDWS's basal sources. This is aligned with our ongoing strategy to reduce our dependence on basal sources, and move to high-level sources,

as well as explore the viability of the deep confined freshwater source. We are confident that this approach will be beneficial to near shore groundwater dependent ecosystems. We are currently working on Ka Pa'akai efforts for both wells. We are concerned that designation will potentially delay these projects and their associated benefits for many years due to the requirement to process water use permit applications for all existing sources before new source permits are processed.

We know that HDWS has been criticized for not completing the process to finalize the 2017 Keauhou Water Use and Development Plan (WUDP) update. HDWS is currently in the process of commencing a new WUDP for the Keauhou aquifer which will integrate updated hydrological data, demand projections, land use and traditional and customary considerations, which is expected to be aligned with CWRM's anticipated updates to the Hawai'i Water Plan framework.

DWS reaffirms its commitment to responsible, science-based, and culturally respectful water management and hopes this Commission will do the same.

Aloha Chair Chang and Commissioners,

This testimony is submitted on behalf of the Hawai`i Island Economic Development Board (HIEDB), a private member-based 501(c)3 incorporated in 1984, whose members are committed to providing and promoting private sector support and expertise for balanced growth in Hawai`i County in partnership with Federal, State, County, and private resources.

HIEDB supports the efforts of Deputy Director Ciara Kahahane and Commission on Water Resource Management (CWRM) staff to develop an adaptive management plan for the Keauhou Aquifer System area.

HIEDB also supports the efforts of the County of Hawaii Department of Water Supply (HDWS) to develop two new wells, Wai `aha Well B, and a North Kona Mid-Elevation Well, located in the Keauhou Aquifer, in alignment with HDWS's strategy to move to high-level sources, thereby reducing dependence on basal sources.

HIEDB <u>does not</u> support the designation of the Keauhou Aquifer as a Groundwater Management Area (GWMA), which HIEDB has opposed as recently as 2017, when an insufficient basis for such designation was determined, including through independent studies commissioned by HIEDB. Discussions at recent CWRM meetings suggesting designation are disconcerting, and HIEDB strongly requests that any future discussions regarding designation be transparent and agendized with opportunity for public input.

Aloha Chair Chang and Commissioners,

This testimony is submitted on behalf of the Hawaii Leeward Planning Conference (HLPC), a private member-based 501(c)3 incorporated in 1974, hen forward-looking business and community leaders saw the need for an organization that would work with government to promote sound planning decisions for West Hawai'i. In the intervening years, in recognition of changes to socioeconomics, communities, communications, technology, and policy making, HLPC has maintained its original name while broadening its scope to all of Hawai'i Island. HLPC is dedicated to working with government agencies and private sector entities to assist in making decisions and to alert and inform its members and the public on issues relating to Hawai'i Island and their interests. HLPC initiatives include and are not limited to agriculture, land use and planning, infrastructure, and housing.

HIEDB supports the efforts of Deputy Director Ciara Kahahane and Commission on Water Resource Management (CWRM) staff to develop an adaptive management plan for the Keauhou Aquifer System area.

HLPC is the founder and convenor of the Hawaii Water Roundtable (including Waimea and Kona Water Roundtables), which convenes to consider water resources, including management and development. At the Hawaii Water Roundtable convened in June 2023 with information from multiple water resource consultants and hydrologists, it was reiterated that there is no basis for the Keauhou Aquifer as a Groundwater Management Area (GWMA). This is consistent with HLPC's prior opposition to such designation, absent scientifically based data supporting the need for a GWMA. Recent mention of such a designation is not founded in science, and HLPC opposes any further mention of designation of the Keauhou Aquifer unless such discussion is placed on the agenda and open to the public for discussion.
