# DEFENDANTS ALEXANDER & BALDWIN, INC. AND EAST MAUI IRRIGATION COMPANY, LLC'S FIRST AMENDED RESPONSE TO PLAINTIFF'S SECOND REQUEST FOR ANSWERS TO INTERROGATORIES

Defendants Alexander & Baldwin, Inc. ("A&B") and East Maui Irrigation Company, LLC ("EMP") (collectively "Defendants"), by and through their counsel, Cades Schutte LLP, pursuant to Rule 33 of the Hawai'i Rules of Civil Procedure ("HRCP") respond to Plaintiff

Sierra Club's ("Plaintiff") Second Request for Answers to Interrogatories to Defendants Alexander & Baldwin, Inc. and East Maui Irrigation Company, LLC (the "Request"), dated April 26, 2019, as follows:

#### **GENERAL OBJECTIONS**

Defendants' specific objections and responses below to the individual requests below are in addition to the general objections and responses set forth in this section. These limitations and objections form a part of the response to each and every request and are set forth herein to avoid the duplication and repetition of restating them for every response. The absence of a reference to a general objection should not be construed as a waiver of the general objection as to a specific request.

- 1. Defendants' responses to the requests, notwithstanding the objectionable nature of any of the definitions, instructions, or requests, do not constitute (a) a stipulation that the information sought is relevant or admissible, (b) a waiver of the attorney-client privilege, the attorney work-product doctrine or any other privilege or doctrine, (c) a waiver of Defendants' general objections or the objections asserted in response to the specific requests, or (d) an agreement that requests for similar information will be treated in a similar manner
  - 2. Defendants object to the Request as being improperly directed at multiple parties.
- 3. Defendants object to the Request to the extent that it seeks to impose burdens or obligations greater than imposed by the HRCP and the Rules of the Circuit Courts of the State of Hawai'i ("RCCH"). Defendants will follow the HRCP and the RCCH.

- 4. Defendants object to the Request generally as overly broad and unduly burdensome.

  Defendants have attempted to reasonably construe and respond in good faith to the Request in a timely fashion.
- 5. Defendants object to the Request to the extent that the interrogatories purport to require information not within Defendants' custody, possession, or control, or seek information that is not within Defendants' knowledge.
- 6. Defendants note that discovery and investigation are ongoing. Accordingly, the responses to the Request are given without prejudice to Defendants' right to amend and/or supplement its responses or to produce evidence of any subsequently discovered facts or if Defendants find inadvertent omissions or errors have been made.
- 7. Defendants reserve the right to supplement, withdraw, amend, correct, or revise these responses before the completion of discovery, as additional analyses are made, research is completed, and contentions are asserted or if Defendants find that errors or omissions have inadvertently been made or if additional or more accurate information becomes available and is required to be provided under Rules 26 and 33 of the HRCP. The responses and objections set forth herein are made without waiver of this right
- 8. The responses attached hereto are each specifically subject to the foregoing objections. All objections made in this response to the Request have been made by Defendants' counsel and the signature below shall take the place of a signature after each and every objection made.

#### **INTERROGATORIES**

1. How was the water that was taken out of the area encompassed by revocable permits S-7263, S-7264, S-7265, and S-7266 used for each month in 2017, 2018 and 2019 (including for each month: how much water was delivered to whom; for what purpose was the water used that was delivered; and how much water is estimated to have been lost to seepage).

#### Answer:

OBJECTION: Defendants object to Interrogatory No. 1 as overly broad, unduly burdensome and neither relevant nor reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence. To the extent that the interrogatory seeks information related to water taken by person(s) other than Defendants, such information is outside the scope of Defendants' knowledge and is not related to the claims and defenses asserted in this litigation. Defendants further object to the interrogatory as vague and ambiguous, particularly the terms "taken" and "used," which are not defined. Defendants construe the request as seeking the Defendants' uses of water that Defendants removed from the areas encompassed by the subject RPs for each month in 2017, 2018, and 2019.

As construed above, and subject to and without waiving these limitations, objections, and general objections, Defendants state that their uses of water that Defendants removed from the areas encompassed by the subject RPs for each month in 2017, 2018, and 2019 are set forth in the table attached hereto as Exhibit "A."

Operationally, a minimum of approximately 6 mgd must be reliably conveyed to / made available to the County each and every day so that the County has flexibility regarding when to run its plan depending upon weather conditions, demand, water available from its Piholo plant, etc. Water conveyed by EMI but not used by the County is redirected by EMI to reservoirs located on the former plantation.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> The numbers in this column are based on reports received from the County and have not been independently verified by EMI. Operationally, a minimum of approximately 1.5 mgd must be reliably conveyed to / made available to the County each and every day so that the County can be flexible regarding how to meet the needs of the Ag Park. Water conveyed by EMI but not used by the County is redirected by EMI to reservoirs located on the former plantation.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> The numbers in this colum include water not separately accounted for in the columns to the left, including seepage and evaporation, which cannot be directly measured. The EMI system is operated in a manner that insures continuous water availability in the reservoirs to meet the County's needs for fire protection for brush fires, the risk of which has increased due to the reduction of the irrigated acreage following the cessation of sugar cultivation. When the EMI/HC&S system was under full sugar cultivation, seepage and evaporation (mostly from reservoirs) approximated 22% of total deliveries. Since a proportionately larger percentage of total deliveries is now used to maintain water levels in the reservoirs, seepage and evaporation will necessarily be higher until irrigation needs increase. Imported water that is used for hydroelectric power generation is also directed to the reservoirs.
