(Waimea Canyon State Park mobile food vendor), O'ahu: Rick Ralston (Pu'u 'Ualaka'a State Wayside residential use), Curtis K. Chapter 343 Environmental Assessment

See Exemption Notification attached hereto as Exhibit B.

Background:

The Division of State Parks (State Parks) annually requests Board approval to continue its existing month-to-month revocable permits (RPs) in December of each year. Pursuant to §171-55, HRS, the Board may allow revocable permits to continue on a month-to-month basis for additional one-year periods.

State Parks requests the continuation of RPs originally approved by the Board at various meetings held as far back as 1988. The purpose of seeking the Board's approval of the RP's in December of each year is to synchronize the terms of all revocable permits to a calendar year period. Some of these RP's are intended to be transitional in that they will eventually be replaced by concession agreements or long-term general leases. All revocable permits under consideration by this submittal are listed in Exhibit "A".

On July 27, 2012, the Board approved the request for the sale and independent award of eight concession or mobile concession agreements by means of sealed bid auction. Due to staffing limitations, these solicitations are still in progress and of the eight concessions the Board approved, seven operate under existing RP's with one entirely new concession. If approved, the revocable permits subject to concession bid, would remain in place until such time as the contracts are awarded pursuant to the bidding process which is planned for completion in 2013.

Discussion

Kaua'i

Kaua'i RPs include inflatable boat and kayak landing permits for commercial guided tours at Nu'alolo Kai and Miloli'i in the Nāpali Coast State Wilderness Park. At the Wailua River State Park in Marina Building B, a full service restaurant serves visitors to the marina area as well as the Fern Grotto.

In Kōke'e and Waimea Canyon State Parks, there are five permits for the nonprofit use of recreation-residence and camp facilities. The Board previously approved the issuance of long term leases for five non profit organizations. One of those organizations has relinquished its tenancy and the Board authorized the issuance of a new RP to the Camp Hale Koa Association in 2010 in its place. As staff time is available, State Parks will complete the long term leases for the four remaining non profit organizations. Finally, there is one mobile food vendor at the Waimea Canyon Lookout.

O'ahu

At Pu'u 'Ualaka'a State Wayside, a revocable permit was issued to Mr. Rick Ralston in 1987 for the use of the residence known as the "Nutridge House". On December 9, 2011, the Board approved the continuation of Mr. Ralston's revocable permit with the provisions that fair market rents are paid and that a current revocable permit be used. In addition, the Board delegated to the Chairperson, the authority to negotiate 'in kind' agreements for services provided to the park. The appraisal process is pending and staff expects it to be complete in January 2013.

On the Windward side of 'Oahu, two, relatively small agricultural and pasture revocable RP's at Ahupua'a O Kahana State Park are issued to family members of those holding residential leases in the park and reflect a continuation of traditional practices. With respect to Kawainui Marsh State Park Reserve, the current use of the property under the Teves/Cash RP is not compatible with the State Park reserve and is inconsistent with requirements of the Land and Water Conservation Fund used to purchase the property.

Therefore, State Parks requests the Board approve a continuation of the existing RP issued to Permittees Teves and Cash for a period of six months to allow for the permittee to remove their property and to restore the land to its previous condition under terms acceptable to the Chairperson.

Maui

In Wai'anapanapa State Park, Maui Ice and Soda Works operates beverage vending machines. In Makena State Park, Island Inspirations, LLC operates as mobile food vendor.

Hawai'i

At Hāpuna Beach State Recreation Area, a restaurant concession serves visitors taking advantage of surfing, hiking and sunbathing along one of the few white sandy beaches along the Kohala coast.

Recommendations: That the Board:

- 1. Declare that after considering the potential effects of the proposed dispositions as provided by Chapter 343, HRS, and Chapter 11-200, HAR, the continuation of these revocable permits will have minimal or no significant effect on the environment and is therefore exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment.
- 2. Authorize the continuation of the revocable permits listed in Exhibit "A" pursuant to the terms above and as which, by this reference, are incorporated herein, on a month-to-month basis for a one-year period (except for the Teves/Cash revocable permit No. SRP6843);
- 3. Authorize the continuation of revocable permit No. SRP6843 issued to Mary Teves, Roy Teves, Joan Cash and Wesley Cash for a period of six (6) months, ending June 30, 2013 and delegate to the Chairperson, the authority to negotiate the conditions of said revocable permit; and,
- 4. Approve such other terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the Chairperson to best serve the interest of the State.
