**Declare Project Exempt From Requirements of Chapter 343, HRS, and Title 11,
Chapter 200, Hawaii Administrative Rules**

Fort Ruger Baseyard Energy Efficiency Improvements Honolulu, Oahu, Hawaii**

The Board of Land & Natural Resources approved the award of the construction contract for the subject project on July 12, 2013. Pursuant to Chapter 343, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), and Chapter 11-200, Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), the attached Exemption Notification labeled Exhibit A was prepared.


The project consists of a new photovoltaic (PV) system on the roof of the existing warehouse/office building; replacing the roof, roof insulation, flashing, gutters, and downspout of the warehouse/office building; and renovation of the existing office space, which includes, selective removal work, drywall, doors, floor treatment, electrical and cable outlets, light fixtures and split air conditioning and related miscellaneous work.

In accordance with Hawaii Administrative Rule Section 11-200-8(A) and the Exemption List for the Department of Land and Natural Resources, Division of State Parks, as reviewed and concurred upon by the Environmental Council on December 4, 1991, the subject project is exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment pursuant to Exemption Class No. 1, Item No. 6 that states "Offices, baseyards, and ground – within developed, maintained portions of State Parks [February 5, 1976]."

RECOMMENDATION

Declare that, after considering the potential effects of the proposed project as provided by Chapter 343, HRS, and Chapter 11-200, HAR, these projects will probably have minimal or no significant effect on the environment and is therefore exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment.
