**Declare project Exempt from Requirements of Chapter 343, HRS, and Title 11,
Chapter 200, Hawaii Administrative Rules
Job No. D01CK62A, Camp 10 Access Road Bridges, Waimea, Kauai**

The Board of Land & Natural Resources approved the award of the construction contract for the subject project on July 10, 2015. Pursuant to Chapter 343, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), and Chapter §11-200, Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), the attached Exemption Notification labeled Exhibit A was prepared.

The project consists of the replacement of three existing bridges and related work along the Camp 10 Access Road in Waimea, Kauai. The three bridges are constructed of steel and have had significant wear and corrosion over time.


In accordance with Hawaii Administrative Rule Section §11-200-8, and the Exemption List for the Department of Land and Natural Resources, as reviewed and concurred upon by the Environmental Council on June 5, 2015, the subject project is exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment pursuant to Exemption Class 2: "Replacement or reconstruction of existing structure and facilities where the new structure will be located generally on the same site and will have substantially the same purpose, capacity, density, height, and dimensions as the structure replaced," Item No. 14 that states "Repair and maintenance of existing state owned bridges and flumes."

The Office of Conservation and Coastal Lands has reviewed the preliminary design and provided concurrence that there are no objections and a permit is not required.

RECOMMENDATION:

Declare that, after considering the potential effects of the proposed project as provided by Chapter 343 HRS, and Chapter §11-200, HAR, this project will probably have minimal or no significant effect on the environment and is therefore exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment.

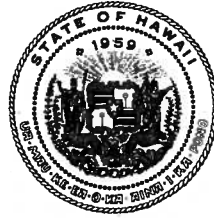
