Subject: Report of Debris Flying from City/County Vehicle

One of the ongoing problems associated with Waimanalo Gulch is the debris flying from trucks going to and from the dump. This morning (Sunday, April 13, 2008) serves as a good example:

At 9:55 a.m. my husband & I entered Farrington Highway at the Ko Olina onramp. City and County of Honolulu truck number C006, License Plate 316TSF was in front of us. From Ko Olina to the Kapolei exit (where we got off Farrington Hwy.) this vehicle had garbage flying out of its bed, including what appeared to be medium to large-sized broken down cardboard boxes. The highway was littered with its debris. This situation also created a safety hazard as the debris flew toward vehicles creating potential for swerving or a piece landing on a windshield and obscuring driver visibility. The driver of the vehicle was completely clueless as to the condition of his load.

When we returned to Ko Olina as we began slowing down from 55 mph to the upcoming 45 mph zone, this same truck sped past us at a high rate of speed at 10:27 a.m. The driver was clearly exceeding the speed limit at more than just a little, as we were going 55 mph and he blitzed right past us. As we crossed the Ko Olina exit bridge, we observed this truck entering Waimanalo Gulch.

Not ensuring that City and County employees drive safely and properly secure their cargo is not only unconscionable, but also inexcusable.

It is my sincere hope that the driver of this vehicle will be appropriately disciplined and that the City and County takes whatever measures are necessary to ensure that future events such as this are prevented. The City and County are responsible for cleaning up garbage, not spreading it around in an unsafe and unsightly manner.
