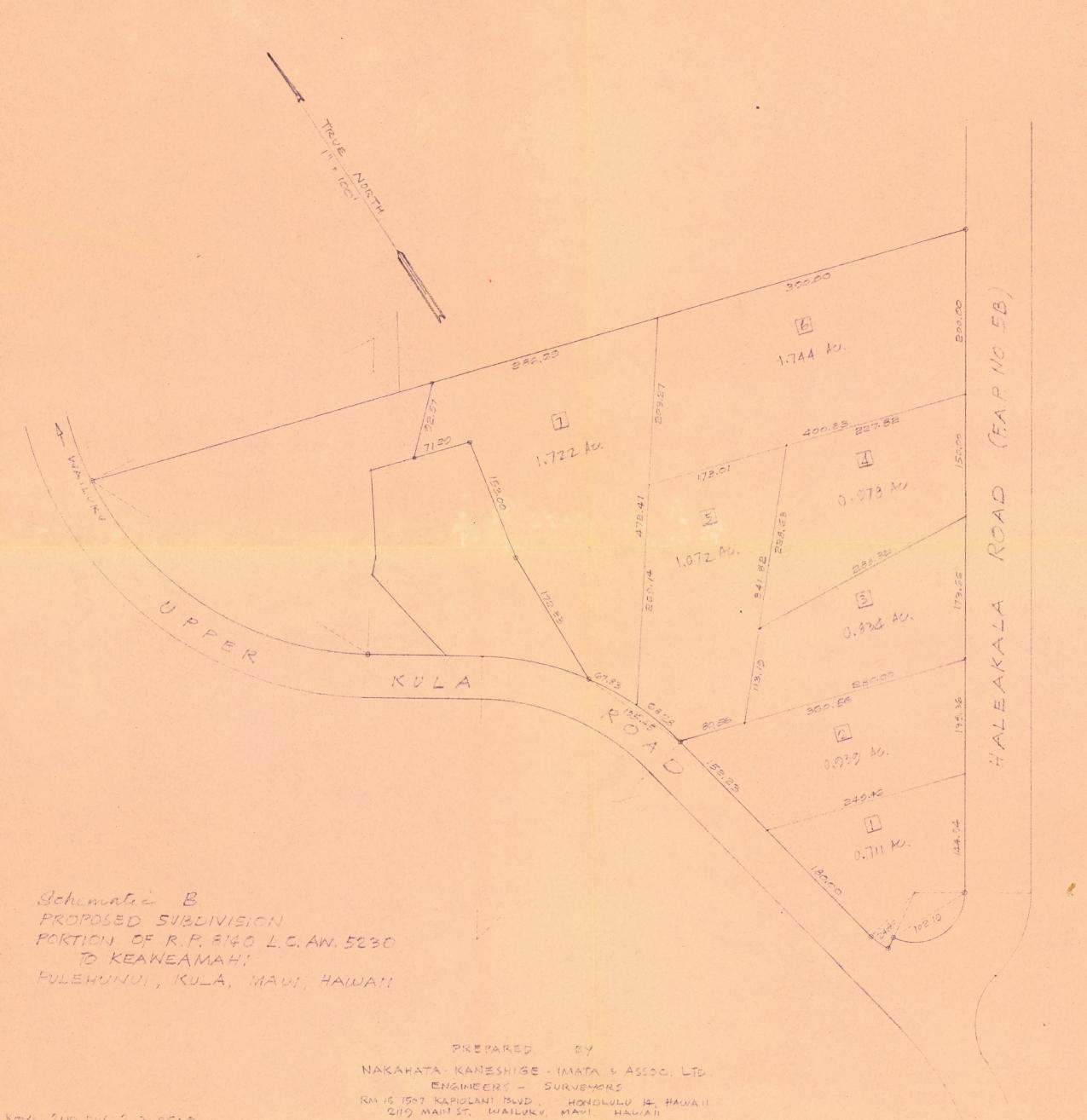

FIELD OFFICER REPORT TO THE LAND USE COMMISSION

March 5, 1963

A public hearing was held in the Courtroom of the Second Circuit Court, Wailuku, Maui, at 9:00 a.m., December 21, 1962 by William M. Mullahey, Field Officer of the Land Use Commission, authorized by the Commission to hold such a hearing in accordance with SECTION 2, Sec. 11 of Act 187, SLH 1961; in the matter of Docket No. A(T) 62-16.

PETITION OF TED JAMES, for Temporary District Boundary Change from an Agricultural district to an Urban district for land in Upper Kula described as Second Division, TMK 2-3-05: 9. The area under petition is comprised of 8.0 acres of land, more or less, located within the "V" formed by the intersection of the Haleakala Road and the Upper Kula Road, Makawao, Maui.

With regard to conduct of the hearing and evidence presented at the hearing, it is respectfully requested that the digest of the hearing be entered into the record of the case, along with all notices, documents and letters referred to in the digest.

The following observations are offered for the Commission's consideration:

- The character of the land to the north and south of the petition along the upper Kula Road is open land grazing with pockets of areas subdivided for residential purposes.
- The area mauka of the petition along the Haleakala Road is generally truck farming mixed with residential lots.
- 3. A 4 inch water line serves the site with additional capacity lines planned for the area around the petition in the near future.
- 4. The Land Study Bureau classes the area under petition as class "B" Agricultural land.

The staff feels that the upper Kula area in the vicinity of the petition is in a state of change from large grazing areas and truck farms to tracts of residential lots. However, the staff feels that a more comprehensive treatment of the areas along the upper Kula Road should be applied, in the form of Urban districts than the isolated spotting of small areas such as would occur should this petition be granted. For this reason the staff recommends denial of this petition without prejudice.

LAND USE COMMISSION FIELD OFFICER PUBLIC HEARING Courtroom, Second Circuit Court Wailuku, Maui December 21, 1962 - 9:00 A.M. Stanley C. Friel, Commissioner Present: W. M. Mullahey, Field Officer (FO) John Canright, Legal Counsel The Field Officer declared the public hearing open in the matter of the petition of Ted James (A(T) 62-22), for change of temporary district boundary from an Agricultural district to an Urban district classification described as Second Division, Tax Map Key 2-3-05: 9. The Field Officer introduced the commissioner from the Third Senatorial District, the Deputy Attorney General and himself. The Field Officer stated that the hearing was being held before a Field Officer and not the full commission pursuant to SECTION 2, Sec. 11 of Act 187/61, which provides that, "Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 6 & 7 requiring a hearing by the full commission if any application requiring a hearing is received which the Commission in the course of its regular meetings shall not be able to hear for more than 60 days, it may authorize a Field Officer to conduct such a hearing and make a recommendation, provided all other necessary rules for hearings are adhered to. The recommendations of the Field Officer shall be submitted to the Commission at its next meeting, and any recommendation, or rulings by the Commission as a result of this recommendation, shall be subject to a review of the full commission at the next hearing date scheduled for the county in which the land concerned is located, if either the Commission or the applicant notifies the other party at least 20 days prior to this date." The Field Officer read the publication of legal notice of hearing and entered the notice into the record. The procedure of the hearing was outlined by the Field Officer as follows: 1. All persons and government agencies having an interest in the matter being heard will be given an opportunity to be heard. 2. Formal rules of evidence will not apply but all participants are urged to confine their comments to matters at issue. 3. All interested persons and agencies will be permitted to file written comments, recommendations and protests to the Commission within 15 days following the close of the hearing. 4. Additionally, the Commission is required by law to wait 45 days following the close of this hearing before a decision may be rendered.

-2-The Field Officer asked if there were anyone present to represent the petitioner. Mr. Ted James of the Bishop Trust Company was sworn in, stated that he was the petitioner and that he would represent himself. The Field Officer described the property under petition as being 9.78 acres in upper Kula lying within the "V" formed by the intersection of the upper Kula Road and the Haleakala Highway. The FO further stated that the petitioner was the agent for the owner of the property, Katherin S. Baldwin. Mr. James stated that his comments would be brief and would be an expansion of his petition as submitted. Initially, he said, in his estimation a fourth zone or district was needed under Act 187 that would encompass one-acre retirementresidential situations such as his request. Mr. James cited the existence of a large market for the "gentleman farmer" type of living which tould be carried on ideally in several locations on the outside Islands. The prime location for this type of land use was stated to be in Kula. With reference to the comments of the Maui Planning and Traffic Commission contained in a letter to the Land Use Commission, dated November 14, 1962 and signed by Robert O. Ohata, Director, Mr. James stated the following in rebuttal: NOTE: Pertinent text of the letter was: "...2. Recommend disapproval of amendment of temporary district boundary by Bishop Trust Co., to Urban of 9.78 acres in Kula, TMK 2-3-05: 9. This is good class B agriculture land. Also, there is adequate urban zoned land in Kula - 440 plus acres with only 40 homes constructed thereon." that land price of the 400 plus acres was one of the reasons for the lack of immediate improvement. He said that with an initial purchase price of 30 to 35 cents a square foot development of houses was slowed down, but that the land would be improved when the purchasers of these lots neared retirement. Accordingly, the lots already purchased were not up for resale but were being held by the purchasers for retirement. Mr. James stated that by virtue of the reasons that he had just outlined, the market in Kula for one-acre lots was limited than might be supposed at first glance. As an illustration Mr. James briefly covered on subdivision that he said that he was handling in the Kula Kai area where 10,000 sq. ft. lots, with offsite improvements in place was retailing for 40 to 50 cents a square foot. Once again, he stated, the price of combining several lots to provide for estate-type living was prohibitive. Mr. James referred to his subdivision proposal for the land under petition and said that he had estimated an offering of these lots at 22 to 25 cents a square foot. Further, the petitioner stated, farming in the Kula area was on the decline and that it was his prediction that the introduction into Hawaii of the largescale farming methods presently practiced on the mainland would accelerate this decline of farming in the Kula area. He felt that because of this it was superfluous of the Land Use Commission to retain a large Agricultural district in the Kula area.

-3-The petitioner submitted a proposed subdivision of the property surveyed by NAKAHATA, KANESHIGE, IMATA & ASSOC., LTD., and dated July 19, 1962. In answer to questions by the FO the petitioner stated that parcel 13, 0.935 acre, was deeded to Henry Baldwin several years ago and that it did not form a part of the petition. Additionally, 1.78 acres had, prior to April 21, 1962, been subdivided away from parcel 9 so that the petition should be amended to show 8.0 acres under petition instead of 9.78 acres, as originally submitted. In answer to a question regarding the availability of water the petitioner stated that water distribution had always been a problem in the Kula area, but that there now appeared to be a change in that situation. The petitioner stated that he had received a letter and a schematic map of the proposed state expansion of the water system. (The letter was dated October 18, 1962 and signed by Mr. Hota, deputy water works engineer and was not submitted in evidence;) The letter stated that a 4-inch line existed serving the site but that additional subdivision would require a larger water line, the extension of which was to be borne by the developer. Mr. James then stated that preliminary arrangements were under way with a negrby parcel owner to share the cost of the new water line. The FO noted that comments had been solicited from the following agencies: Land Study Bureau, Board of Water Supply, Board of Health and the Maui County Board of Water Supply. The FO read the following communications received: 1. Letter from the Maui County Board of Supervisors which stated that the staff's request had been referred to their Committee on Public Works for their study and recommendation. 2. Letter from the Maui County Planning and Traffic Commission recommending denial. 3. Letter from the Land Study Bureau stating that the parcel is Class A or B agricultural land, with irrigation. The FO asked if there were anyone present who wished to be heard. Mr. Frank L. James was sworn in and stated that he was the co-owner of the Kula Lodge as well as a subdivider and realtor. Mr. Frank James reiterated the prior statements that his son had made regarding the climate of Kula and their estimates of the existing market for one-acre lots. Further, he stated that the lack of water had limited the development of Kula and that this would no longer be the case upon the completion of the Kula water system. The FO thanked Mr. James for his testimony and swore in Mr. Eric C. Lindberg. Mr. Lindberg commented on the integrity and vision evidenced by the Messrs. James in the Kula area. He then said that he wanted to give witness to the fact that a fourth class of land districting is needed under Act 187. He stated that personal choice is a privilege that cannot be denied.

The FO thanked Mr. Lindberg for his testimony and asked if anyone else wished to be heard on the matter. There was no response.

The FO stated that all communications read or referred to, as well as all the oral testimony taken, would be made part of the record. The FO outlined the protest period and the mandatory waiting period.

There was no further discussion and the FO closed the public hearing.

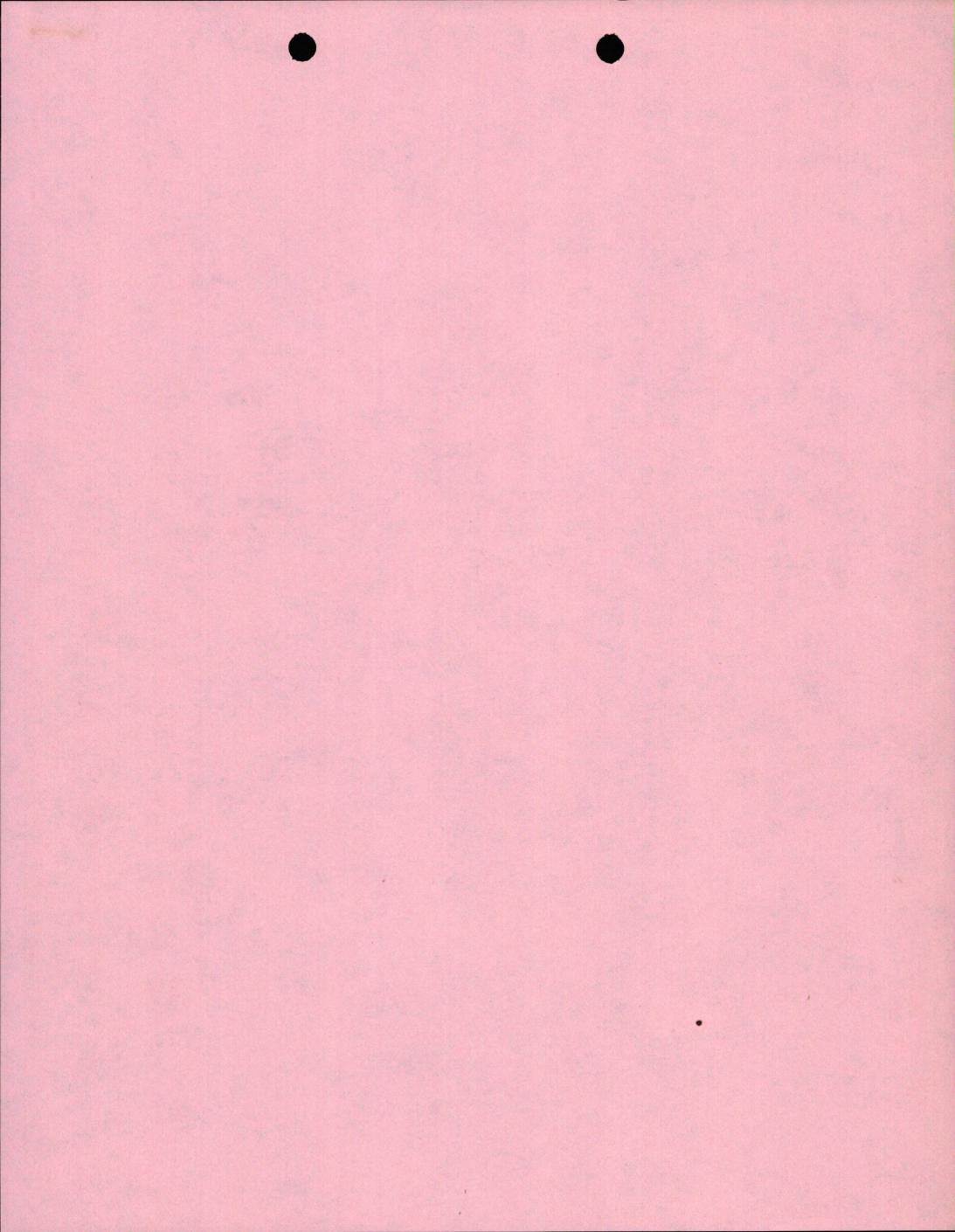

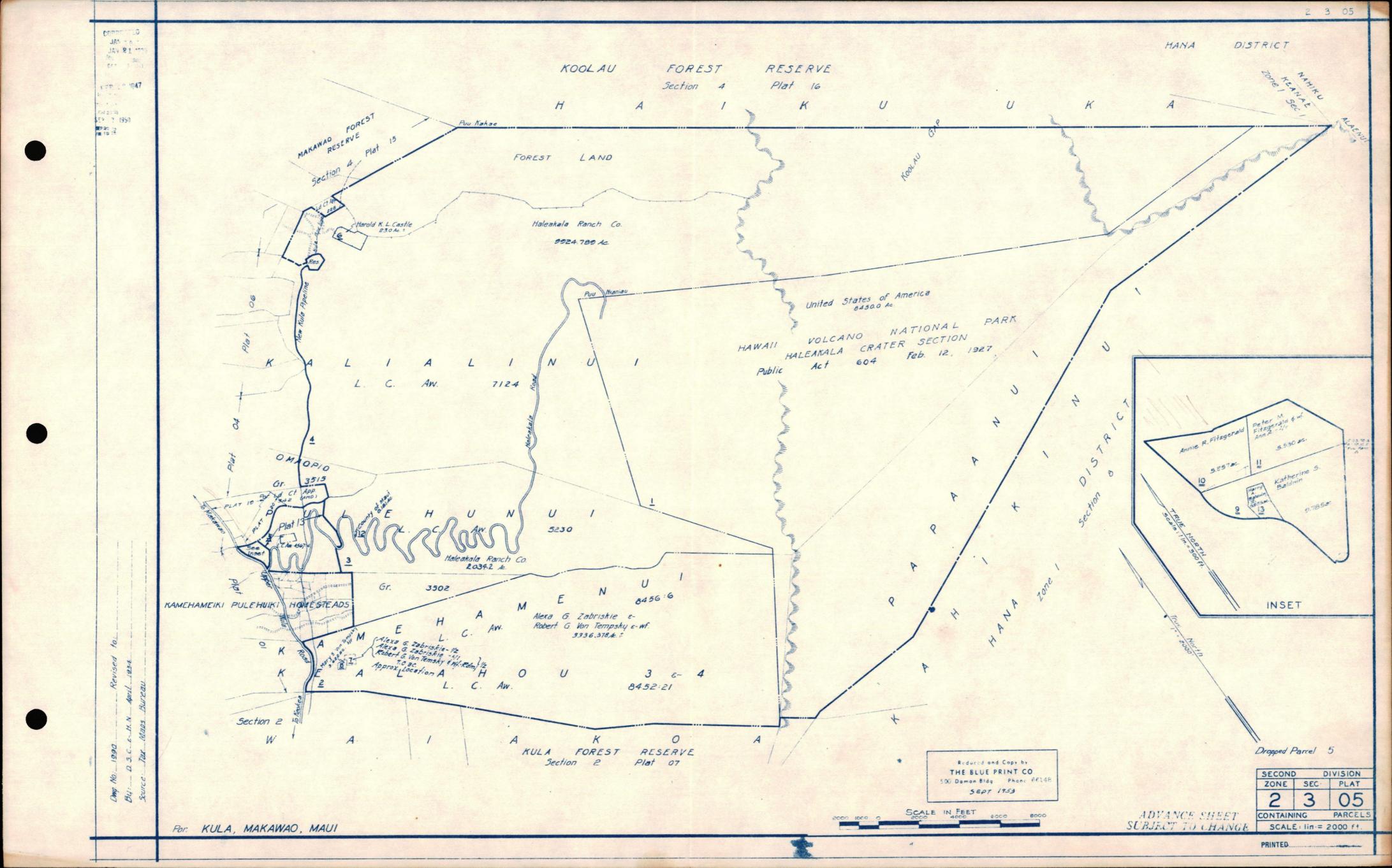
