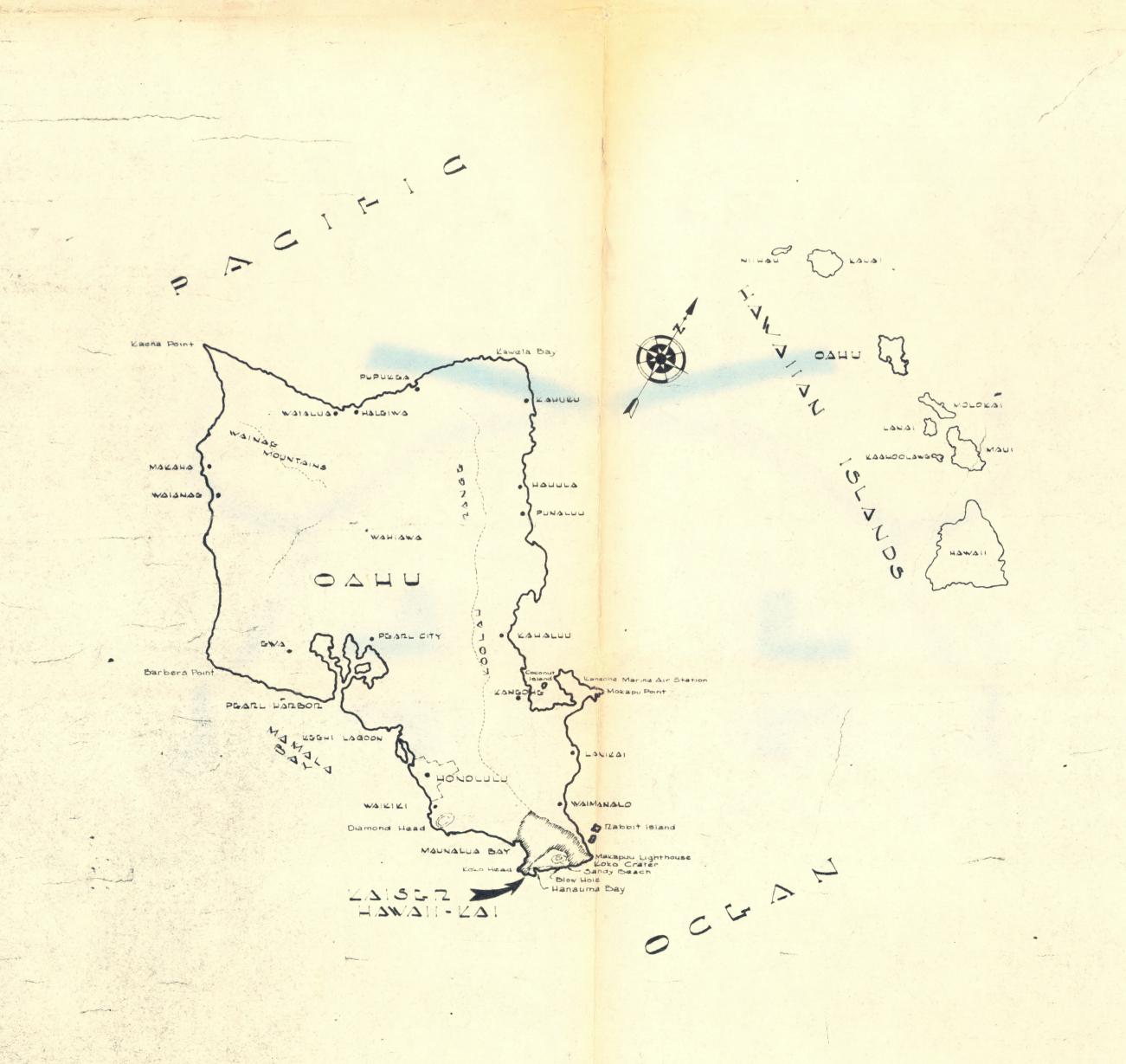

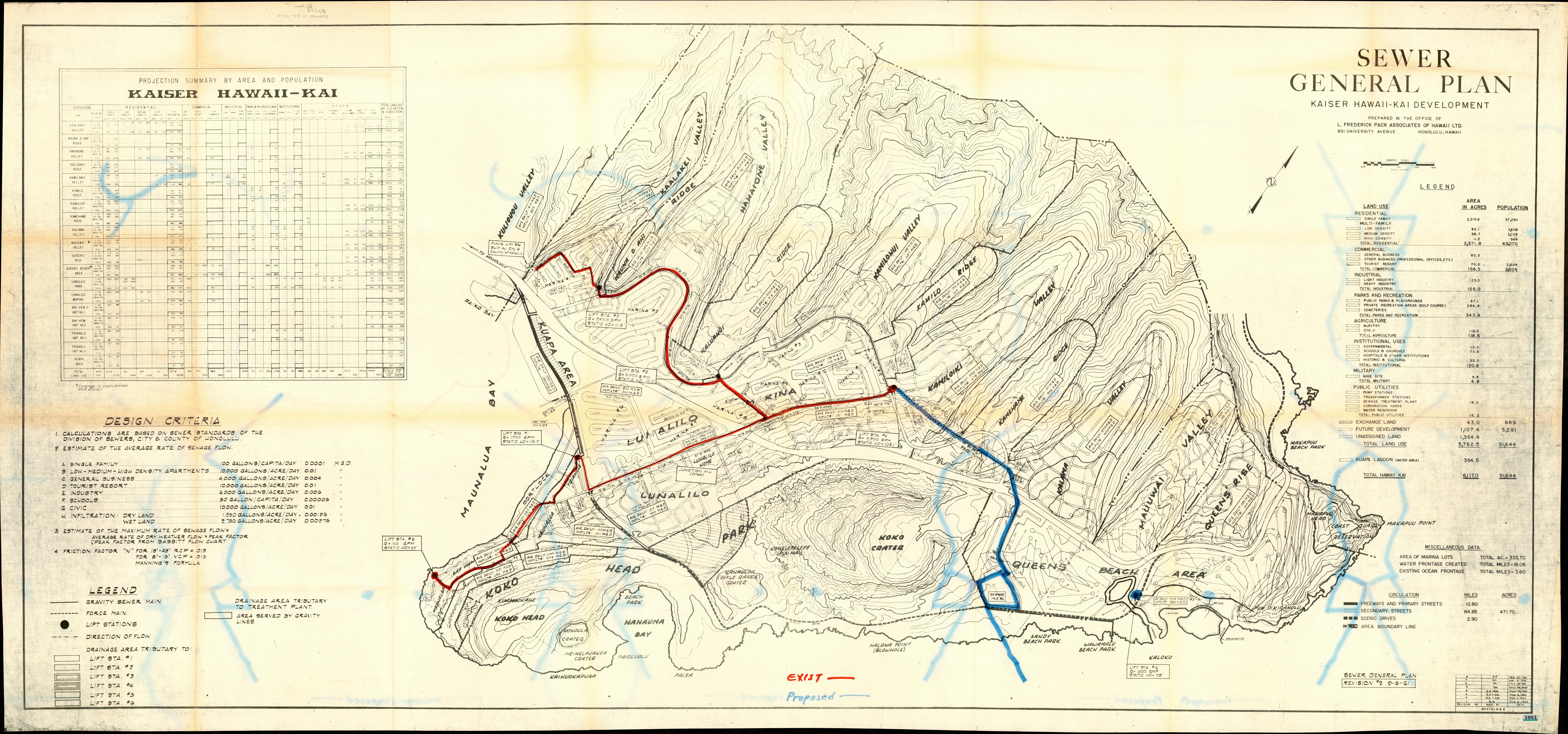

Temporary District Classification: AGRICULTURAL

PETITION OF KAISER-HAWAII KAI DEVELOPMENT CO., for change of Temporary District Boundary from an Agricultural district to an Urban district for land in Maunalua, Oahu, described as First Division, TMK 3-9, Portions of plats 05, 09, 10, 14, 18, 20, those portions amounting to a total of 2300 acres, more or less.

The petitioner has stated that Kaiser-Hawaii Kai Development Company is the developer.

Although the figure of 2300 acres was published, according to the wording of the petition, the exhibits accompanying the petition do not seem to agree with each other. An unmarked exhibit, probably intended to be Exhibit "D", agrees with the City's approved plan (antedating the Land Use Commission's interim regulations and district maps), and shows an area of roughly one thousand acres of land proposed for urban and diversified-agricultural use in Maunalua and its tributary valleys, which area was placed in a Temporary Agricultural district when the interim district maps were adopted in April 1962.

The HB&A recommendations include all of the thousand acres, more or less, described above, in an Urban district, with the exception of certain lands at the upper fringes which the consultants considered excessively steep or difficult to provide access to.

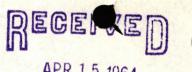
While the staff thoroughly agrees, in principle, with the consultants with

regard to advisability of development of these fringes, the fact remains that the developer did receive approval for development of the entire area prior to the effective date of the Land Use Commission's regulation, and correctly expects the continuation of his right to proceed with his development. The staff accordingly recommends approval of the reclassification, to Urban, of the areas shown in red on the third map, which should be marked Exhibit "D".

The central portion of Kamilonui Valley, now in a Temporary Urban classification, is shown on the adopted City plan in green, for agricultural use, as is a small area adjacent to Koko Head Park. It is understood that the City intends to retain their Agricultural designation of these two areas, within the final Urban district line.

Staff will additionally recommend that the areas not proposed for urban or agricultural use in the hills above Maunalua Valley be included in the Conservation district when the final district maps are adopted.

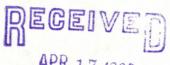

Temporary District Classification: AGRICULTURAL

PETITION OF KAISER-HAWAII KAI DEVELOPMENT CO., for change of Temporary District Boundary from an Agricultural district to an Urban district for land in Maunalua, Oahu, described as First Division, TMK 3-9, Portions of plats 05, 09, 10, 14, 18, 20, those portions amounting to a total of 2300 acres, more or less.

The petitioner has stated that Kaiser-Hawaii Kai Development Company is the developer.

Although the figure of 2300 acres was published, according to the wording of the petition, the exhibits accompanying the petition do not seem to agree with each other. An unmarked exhibit, probably intended to be Exhibit "D", agrees with the City's approved plan (antedating the Land Use Commission's interim regulations and district maps), and shows an area of roughly one thousand acres of land proposed for urban and diversified-agricultural use in Maunalua and its tributary valleys, which area was placed in a Temporary Agricultural district when the interim district maps were adopted in April 1962.

The HB&A recommendations include all of the thousand acres, more or less, described above, in an Urban district, with the exception of certain lands at the upper fringes which the consultants considered excessively steep or difficult to provide access to.

While the staff thoroughly agrees, in principle, with the consultants with

regard to advisability of development of these fringes, the fact remains that the developer did receive approval for development of the entire area prior to the effective date of the Land Use Commission's regulation, and correctly expects the continuation of his right to proceed with his development. The staff accordingly recommends approval of the reclassification, to Urban, of the areas shown in red on the third map, which should be marked Exhibit "D".

The central portion of Kamilonui Valley, now in a Temporary Urban classification, is shown on the adopted City plan in green, for agricultural use, as is a small area adjacent to Koko Head Park. It is understood that the City intends to retain their Agricultural designation of these two areas, within the final Urban district line.

Staff will additionally recommend that the areas not proposed for urban or agricultural use in the hills above Maunalua Valley be included in the Conservation district when the final district maps are adopted.
