Gentlemen:

We are in receipt of Staff Report A(T) 62-25 dated March 6, 1963 in which it is recommended that C-V Land Corporation's petition for change of Temporary District Boundary from an Agricultural district to an Urban district classification on the above tax parcels at Makena, Maui be denied.

Based on the following additional information not available to the Staff when its recommendation was made to the Commission, we respectfully request a review of our petition with the hope that the facts will justify favorable action by the Commission placing subject parcels in Urban instead of Conservation classification when the final District Boundaries for the Island of Maui are made.

- 1. C-V Land Corporation has entered into an option with the owners to lease for 75 years the subject tax parcels, which are contiguous and contain 9.71 acres consisting of Lots 43 through 59A.
- 2. Maui County Planning Commission has recommended to the Land Use Commission that subject tax parcels be changed from Conservation to Urban classification.
- 3. The extension of electric power from Makena Landing by Maui Electric Co. to serve subject tax parcels has been authorized in writing by C-V Land Corporation as per Maui Electric Co. letter dated February 26, 1963 and accepted February 28, 1963 by C-V Land Corporation, which is depositing \$3,419.80 for said power line extension.
- 4. On December 4, 1962 Mr. George K. Houghtailing, Community Planning, Inc., submitted a proposed development plan for subject tax parcels to C-V Land Corporation after meetings with Maui County Planning Director Ohata, County Chief Engineer Hamada and Water Board Chief Engineer Saito in which agreements were reached for improving the present 20 ft. road trail as the acess road and constructing a temprary private water main from the Kihei boundary to subject properties along the access road.

The resort development plan envisions an informal tropical environment with an exclusive beach club - apartment building having dining and cocktail facilities and small boat landing on Lots 56 through 59A (Tax Parcels 12 and 30) totalling 56 units; construction of apartment units with emphasis on individual privacy and landscaping to back up the beach area - Lots 46 through 55 (Tax Parcels 13,15,20 and 21) totalling 84 units; and an eventual luxury apartment condominium of informal Island architecture on Lots 43 through 45 (Tax Parcel 25) totalling 56 units.

Initial construction plans call for remodelling the existing beach cottages on Lots 56 and 57 as a beach club with charcoal broiler and tropical bar and construction of 42 individually designed apartment units to be built on Lots 51 through 55.

Over \$2,500.00 has been spent to date researching and developing preliminary architectural plans for the development. No delay is anticipated in proceeding with off-site and on-site improvements as soon as detailed plans are completed.

#### STAFF REPORT

A(T) 62-25

Temporary District Classification: AGRICULTURAL

PETITION OF C.V. LAND CORPORATION, for change of Temporary District Boundary from an Agricultural district to an Urban district classification on land in Makena, Maui, described as Second Division, TMK 2-1-11: Parcels 12, 13, 15, 20, 21, 25 and 30.

The C.V. Land Corporation is lessee of the subject properties, which include six non-contiguous (except for two pairs) half-acre lots with road and exceptionally-fine beach frontage, and one quarter-acre lot (lot 30), located between Wailea and Makena, beginning about a mile and a half beyond the present end of the Kihei Road pavement with Parcel 30, and ending 1/3 mile farther along at Parcel 25.

The staff is quite familiar with the area; but due to time limitations, a special inspection could not be made for this item. The Commission has seen the property on two previous trips, and is familiar with the poor condition of the road. A large area (Loyalty Enterprises) was recently rezoned to Temporary Urban, reaching to within approximately 800 feet of Parcel 30. The DeLima property, subject of a recent application (denied), lies another mile farther south than Parcel 25.

The area has been proposed by the Commission for final classification into Conservation, following the HB&A recommendation. The State General Plan considers the area suitable for resort development, which could be carried out

under Conservation districting; and the Planning Division of the Department of Land and Natural Resources could consider resort development of the area. The County of Maui has released no specific plans for the area, which is already subdivided into half-acre lots. Since water and road access to the area is awaiting improvement through the Loyalty Enterprises (Matson) area to the north, it is recommended that the petition be denied. However, in consideration of the subdivision patterns of all of TMK 2-1-11, TMK 2-1-12 and probably areas beyond to the south, resort development may be expected to occur in the not-too-distant future; and it will be advisable for zoning and subdivision controls to be prepared by the agency which will have jurisdiction over the area south of Wailea.

The Maui Planning and Traffic Commission, at its meeting of December 11, 1962, voted unanimously to recommend approval of the following two petitions for amendment of temporary district boundaries:

- 1. From Robert Tobey of Sherman Oaks, California, requesting change of agricultural district to urban district of land in Waialua, Molokai, Tax Map Key 5-7-03, parcel 23. The Maui Planning and Traffic Commission feels that the change requested would be more in the public interest for the people of Molokai. The land to be withdrawn from the agricultural zone would not minimize availability of agricultural land.
