Temporary District Classification: AGRICULTURAL

Background

The Land Use Commission has been petitioned by Hawaiian Trust Co., Ltd., Guardian of the Estate of Mabel K. Ena to amend the temporary district boundaries so that the property identified by Oahu tax map key 2-9-54: 5 would be redistricted from conservation to urban.

The property is located in Manoa Valley on Waaloa Road. It is bordered on the one hand by Haukulu Stream and on the other by Naniuapo Stream which merge to form Manoa Stream. The parcel is approximately 122,700 square feet in size.

There is a home situated on the highest part of the property; a variety of vegetation is found on one side, bananas are located on the other.

Rainfall is approximately 150 inches a year.

Large parcels of land are located on the mauka side of the road, portions of which are farmed. An exception is a 3.44 acre parcel which together with other lands makai of the road are being developed for residential use. One particular portion of the development abuts Haukulu Stream just opposite the Mabel K. Ena property. Nearly all the land, except

virtually all the land makai of the road from the Ena property west

By letter dated December 20, 1963 the City Planning Commission advised that following consideration of a recommendation by a representative of the Board of Water Supply, the Planning Commission "voted to recommend that the Temporary District Boundary not be changed and that the subject property be retained in the Conservation district in the interest of

The staff has examined the district boundary and finds that from Puu Pia west across the valley, the boundary is nearly a straight line except in the vicinity of the Ena property where the line follows the Naniuapo Stream down and then up the Haukulu Stream before continuing across the valley.

The boundary was established by the Land Use Commission in April 1962 based on a memorandum from the Department of Land and Natural Resources that the particular alignment had been deliberated and approved by various agencies for the purpose of defining the limits to preserve the Manoa water shed.

Except that in the vicnity of the Ena property the line follows a relatively straight course, the boundary line seems reasonable. Near the Ena property, however, there is some question as to the justification for the more devious route taken to include a small parcel for water shed purposes. The staff has no knowledge of riporian rights that may be attached to the property or other reasons for including the property in the conservation district, except for water shed use. No other reason has been advanced other than that the parcel is important to the water shed, and the parcel's small size does not seem to warrant its inclusion. On the other hand there is every reason to believe that real pressures exist for urbanization in the vicinity of the Ena property.

Recommendation

Unless additional facts are known which would attach more importance to the water shed value of the Mabel K. Ena property, the staff recommends approval of the petition at hand. It appears unjustified in the instant case, for district lines to take such unusual directions without added reason.

SUBJECT: Conservation Lands in Upper Manoa Valley

Reference is made to a recent request for change in zoning from Conservation to Urban classification of certain lands in upper Manoa Valley. These are lands that have been included under water reserves classification prior to and under Conservation Classification since July 11, 1961, covered by provision of Chapter 98H Revised Laws of Hawaii 1955 (1961 supplement).

The Conservation Council for Hawaii respectfully urges that the above lands which should also include those known as the Mabel K. Ena estate TMK 2-9-54:5 remain under Conservation classification in perpetuity under the State of Hawaii for the following reasons:

- Based on data developed by the Board of Water Supply of the City and County of Honolulu, there is urgent need for all of the area in question to be retained for use as water reserve to supply the rapidly growing demands of this city for water.
- Preservation of the above area with regard to a number of endemic and exotic plants, which comprise part of the natural ground cover, is highly important. A large portion of this land is situated adjacent to the Arboretum of the University of Hawaii. Destruction of existing ground cover will lead to severe erosion, spread of introduced species of plants, as well as the encroachment of insects and, very likely, infestation by African Snails. These areas, as well as the Arboretum, are frequently used by teachers of Biology in the University of Hawaii, and by schools and outdoor-orients organizations of Honolulu for educational purposes.
- Preservation of the forest mantle as a background for the residential areas of Manoa Valley. Also for recreational use, particularly hiking trails, as may be permitted in a water-reserve area.

ATTACHMENT 3

Petitioner's Reasons for Requesting Boundary Change

This petition is filed pursuant to Section 98H-4
Revised Laws of Hawaii 1955, as amended by Act 205, Session
Laws of Hawaii 1963 and is based upon the following:

(a) The subject land is needed for a use other than that for which the district in which it is situated is classified. The subject land was included in a "conservation" district in the Temporary District Boundaries adopted by the Commission in April of 1962. The subject land is

and is adaptable to and needed for immediate urban development. Urban uses are prohibited in the district in which
the subject land is now classified.

- (b) The subject land is useable and adaptable for the use to which it is proposed to be classified. The subject land is of such nature and is so situated as to permit urban development thereof in compliance with all of the requirements of the subdivision ordinances and regulations of the City and County of Honolulu. All of the subject land is below the 600 foot contour in Manoa Valley, and according to regulations of the Board of Water Supply of the City and County of Honolulu, land so situated is eligible for water service. In addition, all of this land is below the 20% slope.
- (c) Conditions and trends of development have so changed since the adoption of the present classification that the proposed classification is reasonable. The present classification of the subject land was adopted in April of 1962. Since that time the need for additional land in Manoa Valley for urban purposes has substantially increased.
- (d) In addition, it appears from the files of the Land Use Commission that the inclusion of the subject land in a conservation district in the Temporary District Boundaries adopted by the Commission on April 11, 1962 was based upon the erroneous impression that the subject land was part of a Forest and Water Reserve Zone as established by § 19-70 of the Revised Laws of Hawaii 1955,

as amended. The subject land was never a part of the said zone.

- (e) Additional evidence in support of the foregoing will be presented at the request of the Land Use Commission and, in any event, at the public hearing to be held on this petition, which hearing is hereby requested.
- (f) Failure to grant petitioner's request will deprive petitioner of her rights under the Constitution of the United States of America and under the constitution and statutes of the State of Hawaii.

FOR DECLARATORY JUDGMENT

COUNT I

1. Plaintiff MABEL K. ENA is a resident of the City and County of Honolulu, and is an incompetent person. Hawaiian Trust Company, Limited is a Hawaii corporation, is the guardian of Plaintiff's estate pursuant to Letters of Guardianship dated October 24, 1950 and issued by this court in proceedings entitled "In the Matter of the Guardianship of MABEL K. ENA, an Incompetent Person" and bearing Probate No. 16365 in the files of this court, and brings this action on behalf of Plaintiff as such guardian. Defendant STATE LAND USE COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII is an agency of the State of Hawaii created by § 98H-1 of the Revised Laws of Hawaii, 1955, and will be referred to

hereinafter as the "Agency". Defendant SHELLEY M. MARK is the only member of the Agency. This is an action for a declaratory judgment brought pursuant to § 6C-7, R.L.H. 1955. 2. On April 4, 1962 the Agency adopted temporary district boundaries for the conservation, agriculture and urban districts for the City and County of Honolulu, as provided by § 98H-5, R.L.H. 1955, prior to the amendment of Chapter 98H, R.L.H. 1955, by Act 205 of the Second State Legislature, 1963 Regular Session. The said temporary district boundaries were filed with the Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawaii on April 11, 1962, and will be referred to hereinafter as the "boundaries". 3. The boundaries were adopted by the Agency as a rule, as defined by § 6C-1(d), R.L.H. 1955. 4. Plaintiff is the owner of certain real property located in the City and County of Honolulu and bearing Tax Map Key No. 2-9-54-05. Said real property, referred to hereinafter as the "subject land", is located within a conservation district of the boundaries. 5. The boundaries were adopted in violation of § 98H-5, R.L.H. 1955, prior to the amendment of said section by said Act 205, in that the inclusion of the subject land in a conservation district was unreasonable, impracticable and due to the mistaken belief of the Agency that the subject land was in a "forest and water reserve zone" provided in § 19-70, R.L.H. 1955, and in that a change in the use of the subject land to urban use was already in progress when the boundaries were adopted.

FAGLE-A 6. The boundaries vilate the Constitutions of Hawaii and the United States in that the inclusion of the subject land in a conservation district constitutes a taking of Plaintiff's property for a public use without just compensation and deprives Plaintiff of her property without due process of law. 7. The boundaries were adopted without compliance with the requirement of § 6C-3(a) R.L.H. 1955, for notice for a public hearing prior to the adoption of any rule. COUNT II 8. Paragraphs 1, 2, 3 and 4 are repeated. The boundaries were adopted pursuant to the rule making procedure provided by §§ 6C-3 and 6C-4, R.L.H. 1955. 10. Chapters 98H and 6C R.L.H. 1955 prohibited and prohibit the adoption of the boundaries pursuant to the aforesaid rule making procedure, and the Constitutions of the United States and Hawaii, as well as the said Chapters, required and require notice and a hearing pursuant to §§ 6C-9 through 6C-13, R.L.H. 1955, prior to the inclusion of the subject land in a conservation district boundary. 11. Plaintiff was not given notice or a hearing pursuant to said §§ 6C-9 through 6C-13 prior to the inclusion of the subject land in a conservation district boundary. WHEREFORE, Plaintiff demands that the boundaries be declared invalid.
