The introduction of the commissioners and staff members, and the procedures to be followed throughout the hearing were given by the Chairman. All persons who were entering testimonies in this hearing were sworn in. PETITION OF CENTEX TROUSDALE COMPANY BY H.W.B. WHITE (A(T)62-29) FOR CHANGE OF TEMPORARY DISTRICT BOUNDARY FROM AN AGRICULTURAL TO URBAN DISTRICT CLASSIFICATION OF ABOUT 800 ACRES OF KAWAINUI SWAMP FOR PURPOSE OF RESIDENTIAL AND PARK DEVELOPMENT: Described as TMK 4-2-16: 01 and 4-2-13: 22 Chairman Thompson informed the Commissioners that there was a request before them to defer action on the above petition. Mr. Tom Peterson, representative of Centex Trousdale, informed the Commissioners that they were asking for a deferment because the City and County of Honolulu was making an appraisal of their property, which should be completed by March 27, 1964. Mr. Peterson stated that this delay was related to apparent illnesses on the part of the City's appraisers. Mr. Frederick K. F. Lee, Planning Director of City Planning Department (who was sworn in), and Mr. Richard Au, City and County Attorney, confirmed these statements made by Mr. Peterson.

Minutes of Public Hearing and Meeting

-3-The Executive Officer proceeded with the staff's analysis and recommendation. The recommendation by the staff was for denial of the petition to place about 686 acres, which generally include the limits of the existing swamp, now in the Temporary Agricultural District into the Temporary Urban District. The following agencies presented their testimonies against the petition (written statements are on file): 1. The Outdoor Circle 2. The Garden Club of Honolulu 3. The Hawaiian Botanical Foundation 4. The Windward Oahu Community Association 5. The City Planning Commission The Windward Chamber of Commerce supported the petitioner's request for a change in classification (statement on file). Mr. Houghtailing in summarizing his presentation stated that there is need for a flood control plain and that they were not against this, but he emphasized that there was also the need for urban expansion in the area. The Chairman announced that the Commission will receive additional written comments and protests within 15 days following this hearing, and will take action 45 to 90 days from this hearing. The public hearing was closed. PETITIONS PENDING ACTION PETITION OF THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH (A(T)63-40) FOR AMENDMENT OF THE TEMPORARY DISTRICT BOUNDARY FROM A CONSERVATION DISTRICT CLASSIFICATION TO AN URBAN DISTRICT CLASSIFICATION FOR LANDS IN MANOA VALLEY: Described as TMK 2-9-54: 7, 13 & 18; and 2-9-55: 5 & 10 Mr. Christopher Cobb read into the record a letter which was transmitted to the Commission earlier. His presentation continued with a brief summary of the petitioner's request. He stated that the question concerning this petition and the reason for its denial is the need for this area as a watershed. In his opinion Mr. Cobb did not feel that the area was needed for a watershed. He felt that there were other areas available. He pointed out that the population in the area was increasing, and that an urban expansion of the area was needed to meet this demand. Mr. Mink of the Board of Water Supply explained the importance the ground water in the area to the State. He stated that if this development is permitted, there would definitely be damage to the watershed in the area and a shortage in the State's water resources. Mr. Ramon Duran of the City Planning Department stated that the petition should simply be denied. He stated that the City and County of Honolulu and the Board of

In reply to Legal Counsel's question, Mr. Watson of the Board of Water Supply stated that the Board's position is the same concerning this area. The Board wishes to include this area as a watershed.

A motion by Commissioner Burns and seconded by Commissioner Nishimura to accept the petition was not carried.

A motion to reopen the petition for discussion was made by Commissioner Wung and seconded by Commissioner Ferry, and was carried.

As a result of this discussion a motion to approve the petition was made by Commissioner Burns, and seconded by Commissioner Nish**im**ura. The Executive Officer polled the Commissioners as follows:

Approval: Commissioners Wung, Ota, Burns, Nishimura, Ferry, and Chairman Thompson.

Disapproval: Commissioner Wenkam.

The motion was carried.

PETITION OF CHARLES YANG, ET AL (A(T)63-45) FOR AMENDMENT OF THE TEMPORARY DISTRICT BOUNDARY FROM AN AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT TO AN URBAN DISTRICT CLASSIFICATION FOR LANDS IN WAIAWA, PEARL CITY: Described as TMK 9-6-02: 6, 7, 17, 18, 19, 20, 23 & 24

The Field Officer, Richard Mar, gave a background summary on the petition, and the staff's recommendation for approval on the basis that the subject parcels are within a limited area in which urban uses now exist. The Executive Officer amended the staff's recommendation from approval to denial (due to an unfortunate technicality) on the basis that if the petition were granted for only subject parcels, it would constitute spot zoning.

Mr. Yang who was sworn in stated that the City Planning Commission has designated this area on their General Plan as Urban. Mr. Duran of the City Planning Department confirmed Mr. Yang's statement.

The staff's recommendation as amended (for denial) was deliberated upon by the Commission. It was the consensus of the Commission that since the area was surrounded by urban uses, and was of urban character, the best and highest use of the land would be for urbanization.

Commissioner Burns moved to approve the petition based on the highest and best use of the area which is already in urban character. Commissioner Wung seconded the motion. The Executive Officer polled the Commissioners as follows:

Approval: Commissioners Wung, Wenkam, Burns, Nishimura, Ferry and Chairman Thompson.

Disapproval: Commissioner Ota.

The motion was carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:00 p.m.

SUMMARY OF STAFF REPORT

A(T)63-45 CHARLES I. H. YANG

Temporary District Classification: AGRICULTURAL

Hearing held on January 18, 1964.

Mr. Charles I. H. Yang and other property owners have petitioned the Land
Use Commission for amendment of the temporary district boundaries so that
the properties described by TMK 9-6-02 would be changed from an agricultural
to an urban district classification.

The properties are located on the west bank of Waiawa Stream makai of Kamehameha Highway and about .7 mile west of the Pearl City Junction. Access to the area is by the Waiawa Road which branches off Kamehameha Highway.

There are approximately 60 homes and 3 small farms in the area which includes some 27 lots totaling 20 acres. In addition the area contains a cemetery, a small acreage of cane, and a quarry site.

The concentration of residences is classified as urban and the remaining area west of Waiawa Stream is classified as Class C Agricultural lands by the Land Study Bureau.

On Oct. 15, 1963, the City Planning Commission advised that the "proposed General Plan for the island of Oahu designates this area for Agricultural district"

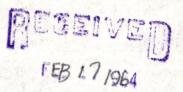

At several meetings, Mr. Joseph B. Mahi appeared before the Planning Commission requesting reconsideration of their application (LUC 652) for amendment of the Temporary District Boundary from an Agricultural to an Urban district designation for parcels of land situated off Waiawa Road in Waiawa, Ewa.

After careful restudy and re-evaluation of the case, the Planning Commission voted to recommend that the whole area be retained for agricultural designation with the exception of the applicants' area. The applicant and adjacent residential areas will be changed to Urban district on the basis that the parcels are residential in character and of such a small size that these parcels cannot economically be used for agriculture.

The Planning Director understands that this action conforms to the recommendations of the staff of the Land Use Commission.

STAFF REPORT

A(T)63-45 LEATRICE S. YANG, ET. AL. Temporary District Classification: AGRICULTURAL

Background

Leatrice S. and Charles I. H. Yang, Joseph B. Mahi, Elizabeth Crabbe, Mary and E. Hamilton, Alice C. Young, Mitsuru Sakamoto, and Antonina Amand D. P. G. Alipio have petitioned the Land Use Commission for amendment of the temporary district boundaries so that the properties described by tax map keys 9-6-02: would be changed from an agricultural to an urban district classification.

The properties are located on the west bank of Waiawa Stream and makai of Kamehameha Highway. Access to the area is provided by Waiawa Road which branches off Kamehameha Highway about 0.7 mile west of Pearl City Junction or midway between Waipahu and Pearl City Junction. Waiawa Road is privately owned, about 20 feet wide, of variable grade and paved with asphalt (but in poor condition). The road parallels Waiawa Stream for approximately a quarter of a mile before branching east and west. A relative concentration of residences mixed with several small farms occur along the roads and within a radius of about a 1,000 feet from the junction. The residences occur only on the end side of the main access and only on the makai side of the east and west branches. There are some 60 residences and about 3 small farms in the limited area described which includes some 27 lots totaling about 20 acres. Immediately beyond the residences fronting the east-west branch of the road are located small farms. The morth west quadrant from the junction are generally

vacant but containing a cemetery, a small acreage of cane, and what appears to be a quarry site. East of Waiawa Stream is the urban complex of lower Pearl City.

The subject parcels are contained within the residential area just described. While the residences are fairly continuous and compact, the area has a poor appearance.

The concentration of residences is classified as urban and the remaining area west of Waiawa Stream is classified as Class C Agricultural lands by the Land Study Bureau. Unique water resources, however, have sustained a great deal of this area in small watercress farms. The general area is predominantly agricultural where eggs, lettuce, bananas and other crops are raised.

In a letter to the Land Use Commission dated October 15, 1963, the City Planning Commission advised that the "petitioners' lands front on Waiawa Road, the lot sizes ranging from 8,761 square feet to 34.177 square feet, and the lots are used for residential purposes." Commenting on public facilities, the Commission further noted that "Waiawa Road is a private 20 foot roadway with a 12 or 16 foot pavement which does not comply with the standard residential road as specified in the subdivision rules and regulations," that only "a shoe string water line serves this area at present," that the "City has no plans to expand sewer services into this area within the foreseeable future," and that there "are no fire hydrants serving this area at present."

The City Planning Commission further advised that the "proposed General Plan for the island of Oahu designates this area for Agricultural District" and that it "recommends that the subject area be retained for agricultural use."

The Land Use Commission's proposed final district boundaries have incorporated

the recommendations of Harland Bartholomew and Associates which places all the properties covered by the petition in the urban district.

The City's recommendation is "Since the predominant use is agricultural and in order to preserve farm lands being encroached upon by residential use, the Planning Director recommended that the area be retained for agricultural designation in conformity with the proposed General Plan for the island of Oahu."

Analysis

While the current City and County's proposed General Plan of Oahu gives the area an agricultural designation, the General Plan for Urban and Urbanizing Areas (which preceded the City and County's proposed General Plan) and the State General Plan show an urban designation for the area. The ultimate districting of this area does not appear firm at this point. Further, it is the not the intent of/General Plan to delineate details.

The particular area under study is isolated from the Pearl City Urban areas by Waiawa Stream but would otherwise be contiguous. The commercial and community facilities and services in Pearls City are reasonably available to and enjoyed by the people in the subject area. On this basis, the subject area may be reasonably considered as a part of the Pearl City urban complex.

As indicated by the City and County Planning Director's letter, the public facilities serving the immediate area are substandard. It may be inferred that this is one of the bases of the City's recommendation. After studying the area, the staff reasons that the substandard facilities have resulted through an undesirable though currently legal procedure.

According to current ordinances, more than one residential unit can be placed upon a lot of record, without the requirement of additional public facilities improvements, if subdivision does not occur. The amount of units which may be so placed upon a lot depends only upon minimum spacing requirements. This reasoning was reached on account of the fact that there are some 60 units on about 27 lots, totaling about 20 acres and including the subject parcels, in the area being discussed. This case is not unique to Oahu. It may be noted here that the Planning Department is currently making corrective efforts through new ordinances.

As indicated by the City, the intensifying residential use is encroaching upon agricultural uses. In fact, this encroachment is almost complete in the limited area within which the subject parcels are located.

Undesirable though such developments may be, they have legally occurred and to such an extent which the staff feels must be recognized as an urban area and as part of the Pearl City Urban complex. Certainly, however, such developments should not be allowed to further expand and to encroach upon the agricultural uses in the area.

Recommendation

The staff recommends that the petition under consideration be granted on the bases that the subject parcels are within a limited area upon which urban uses now exist. Further, the staff would recommend an adjustment to the <u>proposed</u> urban boundaries, before final adoption by the Land Use Commission, which appear justifiable after the staff has made a more detailed survey occasioned by this petition. This adjustment would not affect the staff recommendation on the instant petition but would better protect the agricultural uses in the area by preventing further urbanization.

Gentlemen:

Reference is made to a petition filed by Charles Yang, et al, for amendment of the temporary district boundary respecting the County of Honolulu, Island of Oahu, to change the district designation from Agricultural to Urban district, for parcels of land situated off Waiawa Road in Waiawa, Ewa.

The Planning Commission at its meeting on Thursday, October 10, 1963, considered the Planning Director's report on the findings and recommendations of the above area as follows:

Findings

1. General Plan

The proposed General Plan for the island of Oahu designates this area for Agricultural District;

2. Zoning

The area is presently covered by Rural Protective Zone under Resolution No. 563;

Land Use

The petitioners' lands front on Waiawa Road, the lot sizes ranging from 8,761 square feet to 34,177 square

feet, and the lots are used for residential purposes. However, the major portion of the area in question located back of the roadway is used predominantly for watercress patches, truck farms and poultry farms.

4. Public Facilities

- Roadway: Waiawa Road is a private 20-foot roadway with a 12 or 16-foot pavement which does not comply with the standard residential road as specified in the subdivision rules and regulations;
- b. Water: Only a shoe string water line serves this area at present. For subdivision purposes the Board of Water Supply would require an adequate sized main from Kamehameha Highway or along Lehua Avenue from Pearl City;
- Sewer: The City has no plans to expand sewer services into this area within the foreseeable future;
- d. Fire Protection: There are no fire hydrants serving this area at present.

Recommendation

Since the predominant use is agricultural and in order to preserve farm lands being encroached upon by residential use, the Planning Director recommended that the area be retained for agricultural designation in conformity with the proposed General Plan for the island of Oahu.

The Planning Commission, after reviewing the Director's report, voted to accept and concur with the findings and recommends that the subject area be retained for agricultural use.

The general use of land in the immediate area is URBAN. Most of the lots are too small for agricultural use. Infact there is a tendency of high-density use per lot.

From Pearl City to Waipahu all indication shows a rapid growth toward UR-BANIZATION.

Harlond Bartholomew & Associates, a consulting and planning engineers made a thorough study for this island. It was recommended by this consultant that this area (0-9) be designated for urban developement. The LAND USE COMMISSION accepted this recommendation and had designated this area (0-9) as a preliminary proposed final district boundary for urban area. On March 17, and 28 1963 public hearings were held with favorable results for adoption.
